Some of the library staff attended a workshop in Amarillo last Wednesday. This was sponsored by TPLS and as conducted by Mary Kay Wells. This was a very informative workshop. It was about Readers' Advisory. We learned how to increase our skills for better public service. Also how to use our resource tools which are, print sources, non-print sources and awards. All readers have a right to: smiles, a look in the eye, staff who listen as well as talk, full attention, plain language, clear speech, basic courtesy, sincerity, professional appearances, nonjudgmental staff attitudes, no assumptions, privacy, confidentiality and an informed, well read staff. Our other objectives are to better understand what reading means to the reader and to begin to begin development of individual reader's advisory resources.  
In 1890 the New York Times reported that novels were as addictive as opium. At the New York City Public Library in the same time frame, one had to check out a nonfiction book before being allowed to check out a fiction book. Haven't we come a long way! Now we have the right to read what we want to read. We read to control circumstances of our lives, for comfort, fun, escapes, familiarity, to challenge ourselves, therapy and to suspend reality. Some of us are called compulsive, heavy readers, "in one eye and out the other". Also some of us choose thick books, "that last for ever", and we actually read the last one hundred pages slowly to prolong the book. Reading is to live and to live is to read.  
Speaking of reading, we have new books. They are: "Deep End Of The Ocean" by Jacquelyn Mitchard this book was featured on Oprah's show and is a best seller. It is a suspense story dealing with a child's kidnapping.
