


Hatnaway, a quarterback for Fort Elliott High School was named "Player of the Week" in the Amarillo Globe-News for the Cougars 44-24 win against Floyd, NM.

(Editor's Note: The following article appeared in the Tuesday edition of the Amarillo Globe News.

Performance: In a 44-24 win against Floyd, N.M., Hathaway keyed an offensive charge with his accurate arm that netted 455 ards of offense. The 5'10", 170 lb. senior was 21-of-24 for 326 yards and five touchdowns. He did not throw an interception. He completed touchdown passes to three different receivers, with three of them going to Junior Newman, from 25, 58 and 18 yards. Hathaway also completed scoring tosses of 26 yards to Junior Gonzales and 25 yards to Kade Zybach. Hathaway last year completed 73 of 130 for 1,103 yards and 21 TDs.

Comment: "He threw the ball a whole lot better than in the scrimmages," said Fort Elliott coach Curtis Smith. "He had been kind of overthrowing everyone. He had a bad habit of lobbing stuff. But it seemed like the other night everything was on the line. He threw the ball extremely well. I knew he threw the ball well, but until I looked at the stats afterward, I didn't realize how well."

HONORABLE MENTION Ft. Elliott's Kade Zybach rushed eight times for 83 yards, scored on runs of 50 and 15 yards and caught four passes for 39 yards, including a 25-yard scoring toss, in a 44-24 win against Floyd, N.M.


