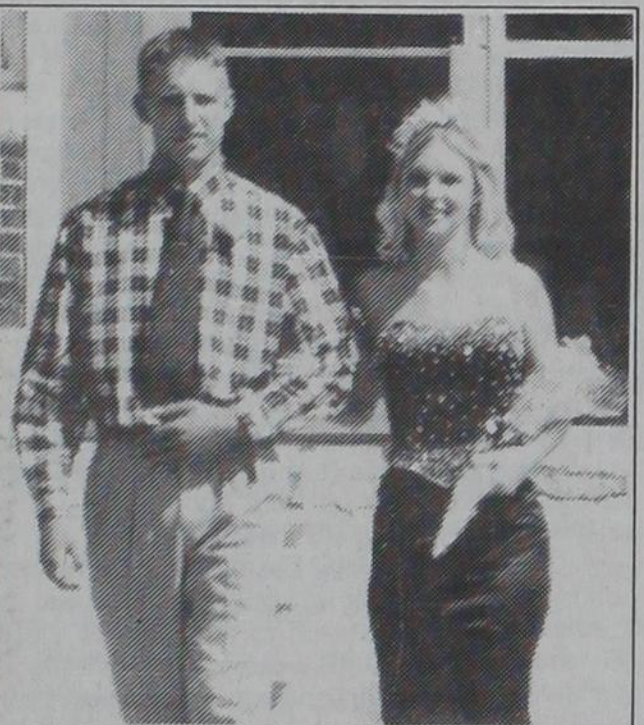

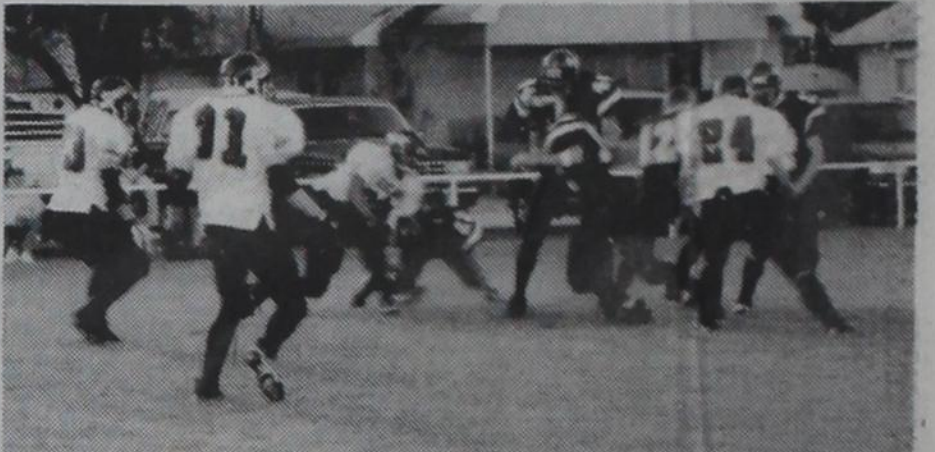

2. **Approval of Minutes:**
The minutes of the August 2002 board meeting were approved as presented. Dave Britt made motion to approve the minutes. Jim Batton seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.
3. **Payment of Bills:**
Jim Batton made motion to pay the bills, Dave Britt seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.
4. **Financial Statement and Statistics:**
Financial statements and statistics were reported by Billy Robertson. Dave Britt made motion to accept the report as presented. Jim Batton seconded the motion. Motion carried unanimously.
5. **Quality Improvement Minutes:**

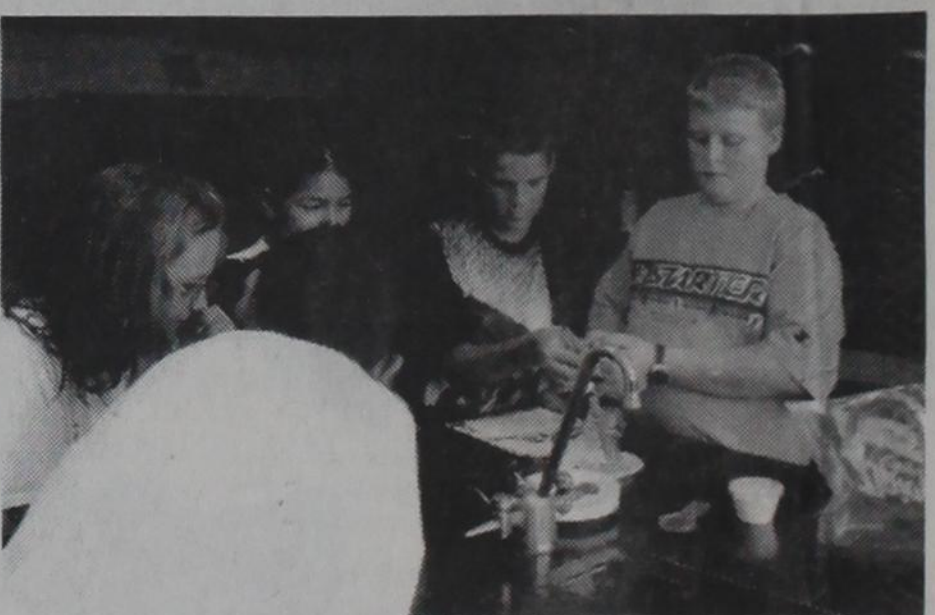
