Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, October 22, at 10:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse, 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas.

Eleven items were on the agenda.

The court approved the hourly payroll time sheets for payment as presented.

The bills were approved for payment as presented.

No action was taken on the budget.

The court does not feel a need for a burn ban at the present time.

The monthly report of the Tax Assessor/Collector was accepted by the court.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as presented.

Larry Settle, TES Energy Services, L.P., was on the agenda, but was not able to attend.

The County Tax Assessor/Collector received two bids for new computers for the office. Southwest Data submitted a bid for \$33,850 with \$1,000 each month thereafter. The bid from -- was in the amount of \$24,750 plus \$1,900 per month thereafter. The court accepted the bid from Southwest Data.

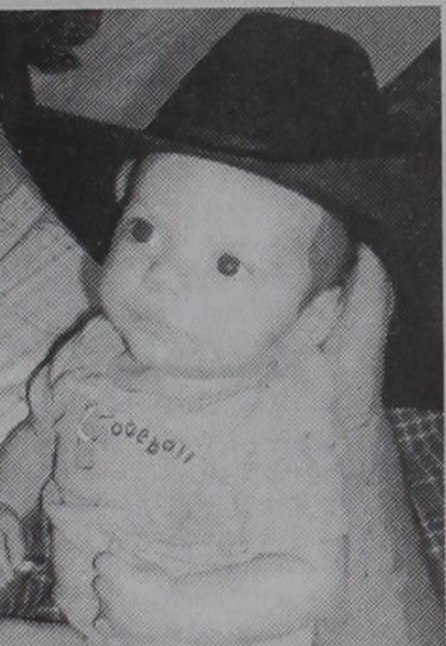
### Annual Wheeler Fire Dept. Breakfast Sat.

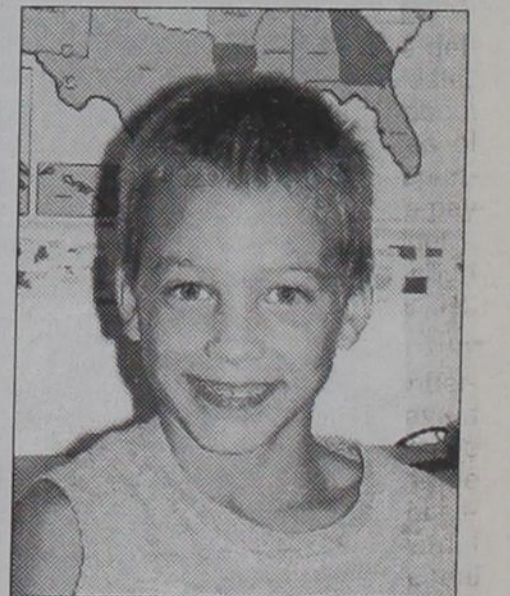

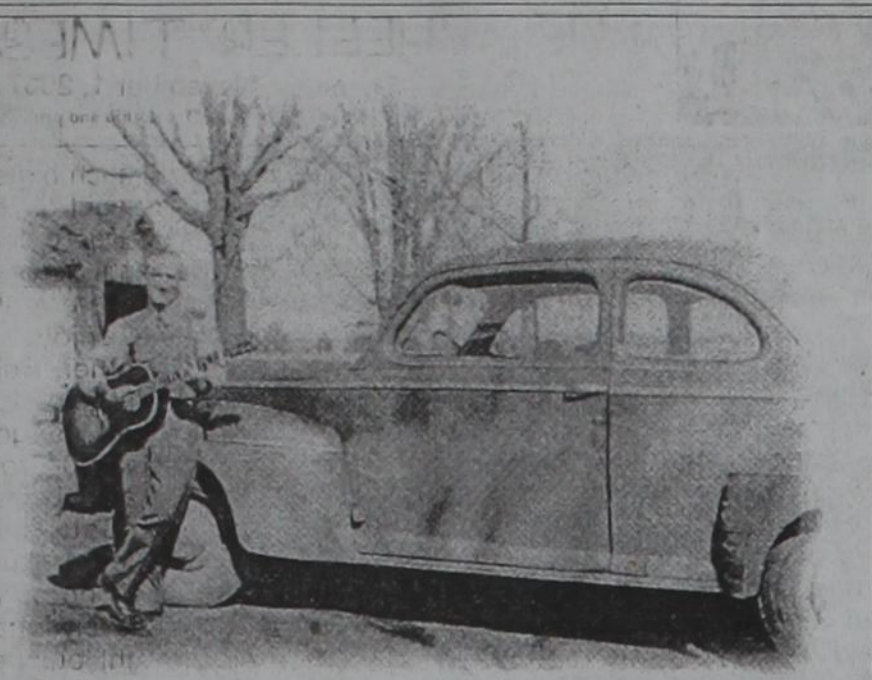
