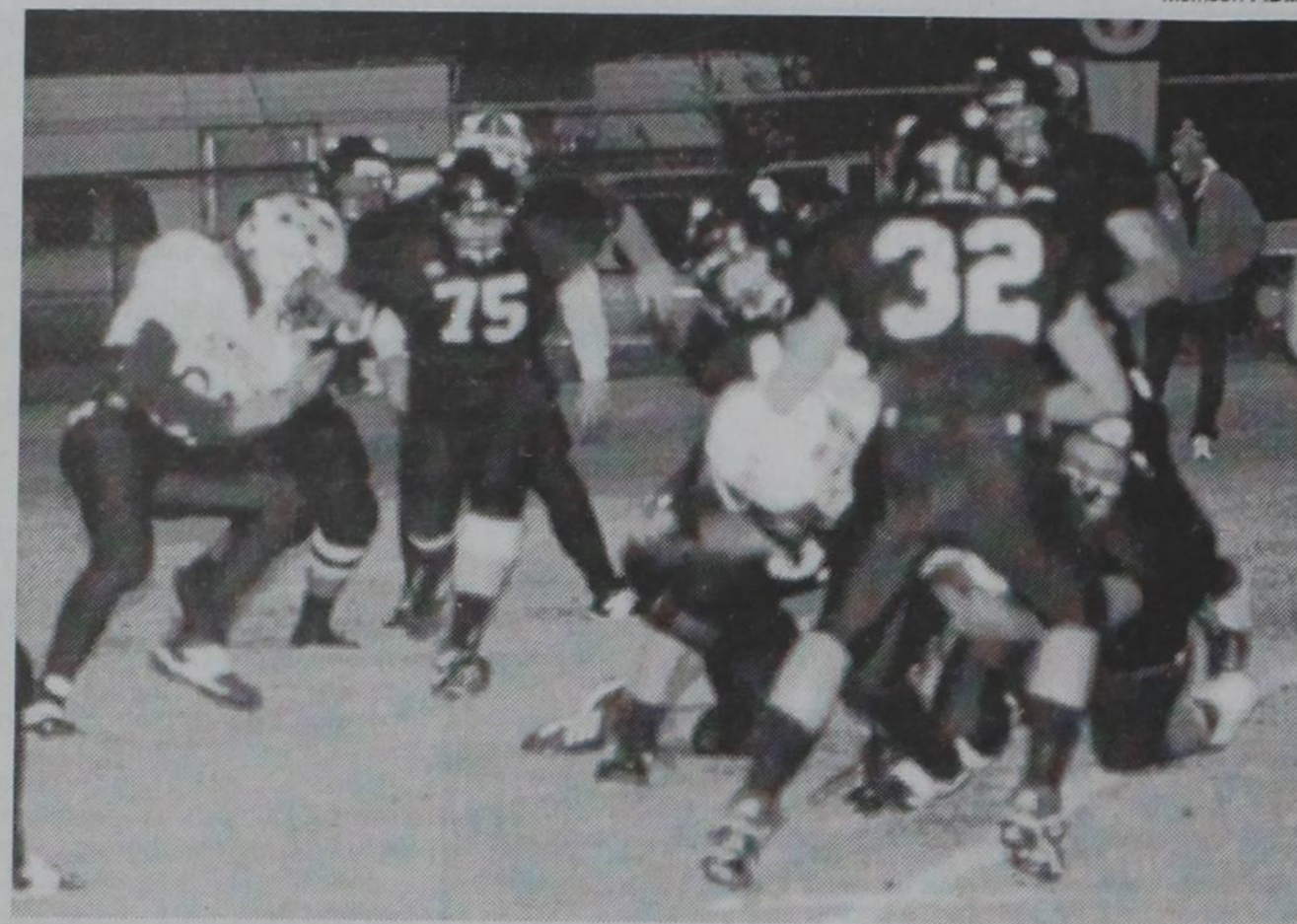

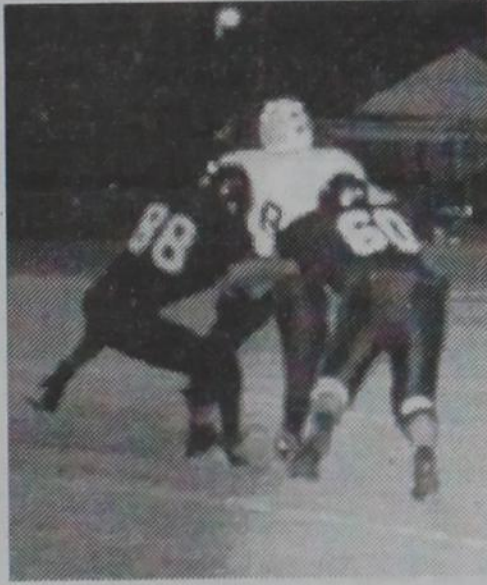

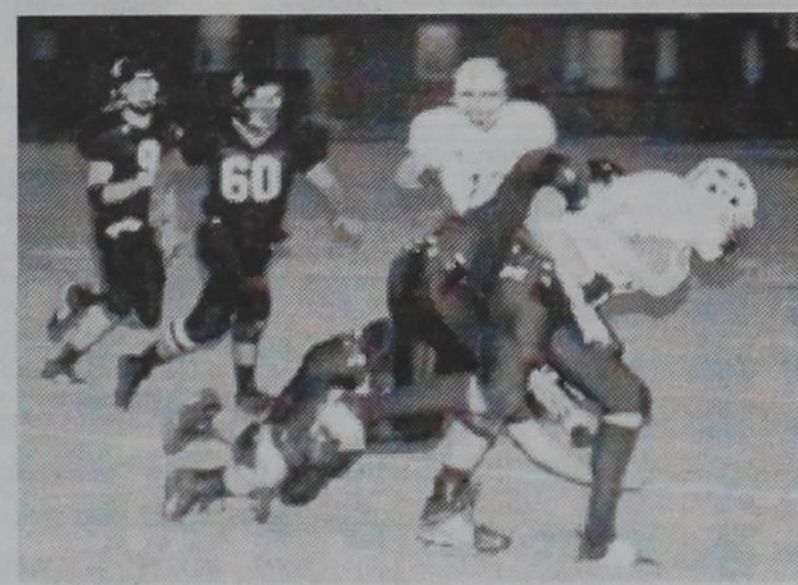
SACK: Memphis loses 10 yards on this sack by Brad Masters, #88, and James Chapman, #9. —Photo by Rob Schaffer



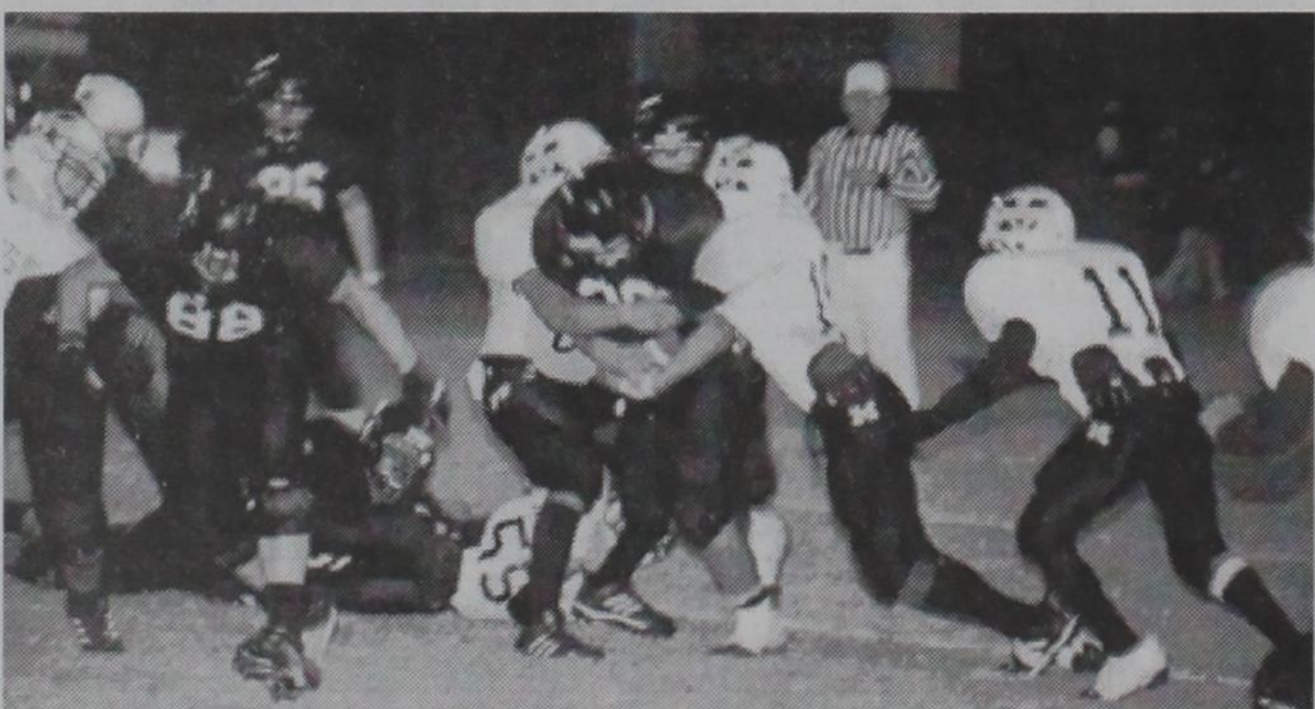

MOBEETIE NEWS

Since I am gone I thought I would print some items from the Wheeler Times, August 11, 1955, 50th Anniversary of Wheeler.

The front page was about the 50th Anniversary Celebration Saturday August 20, 1955. It had cowboy riding a buffalo. That stated Wheel into Wheeler and help celebrate! Fun and Frolic for everyone. The hat of the cowboy had Mister Wheeler on it. The buffalo had Wheeler County Seat since 1906.

Formerly Buffalo Range and Indian Hunting Ground the Early Settlers were discharged soldiers, cowboys and ranchers. Wheeler was the First County Organized in the Panhandle - Wheeler County created August 21, 1876 and organized in 1879. Old Mobeetie established in 1875 was First County seat. The election in 1906 moved Wheeler County Seat to the City of Wheeler. The area was the site of many Indian battles. The program was 9:30 A. M. registration of Pioneers and Ex-students at Pennington Building.

10:30 A. M. Address by Congressman Walter Rogers at North West Corner of Square. 12:00 noon free barbecue. Served at the Northeast corner of Square. Eating utensils furnished.

2:30 P.M. Old Fiddler's Contest American Legion Hut. Send entries to E. D. Guynes's Chairman.

Rhodes Carnival Rides will operate here all week starting August 15.

Concessions of all kinds operated by local clubs.

9:00 P.M. Street Dance in 500 block or North Main Street. Music will be by Hurshul Clothier and His Oklahoma Travelers.

Friday evening there will be a mass meeting of all Ex-Students of Wheeler in the Gymnasium Harris Hall, Chairman.

A day of visiting and entertainment for young and old is assured if you come to Wheeler and help celebrate our 50th birthday on August 20th.

John N. Merrian wrote an article As I Remember Wheeler.

He spent all his school days at Wheeler. He went to school in every building that was used for a school until the new high school was completed. He recalled going to school in the Methodist, Christian and Baptist churches while a new building was being constructed. He told about R. H. Forrester's admonition "you have one coming". It made an impression on him. He knew it would be more than a whipping. This was in the spring and he wore two pair of pants for six weeks during the warm weather because of the expected punishment and then the first day he left off the extra pair of pants the Prof. gave it him.

Some of the sports he remembers was spinning tops and plugging tobacco tags. Professor Forrester was one of the teachers that would spend the recess periods with the students and let them know that the fun was over when they returned to class.

He thought that graduations were the highlight of his school career. He had the distinction of being the handsomest, the smartest, the most popular boy in the graduation class. He was the only male in the class.

He recalls the three big fires in Wheeler. The first was when the Knight Theatre just off the northeast corner of the square burned. He was young and his mother would not let him go up town to see the fire but he remembers the reflections of the flames and billows of smoke that he could see through the east window of their house.

He would never forget the second big fire, when the south side of the square burned. Raymond Holt and he had stayed up late getting the pre-Christmas edition of the Wheeler Sun ready to be mailed. He had planned to come down early the next morning and take the papers to the post office. The fire came in the early hours of the morning and completely destroying the printing office along with the adjoining buildings. That was one edition of the paper, which was printed and never read by anyone. He hadn't even taken a copy home with him.

It was a different situation when the west side of the square burned. Uncle John (Dunkle), my brother Douglas and I were working late to get out an issue of the then Wheeler News-Review. They were about ready to go to press when the fire alarm sounded. They went out with almost everyone else in town to fight the fire. When the fire was well under control they went back to the printing office and wrote the story and set it up in type and

made over the front page in order to get this latest new to the readers.

He remembered playing baseball. He knew the rulebook cover to cover. He remembers the wonderful times they had crowded into his dad's old Model T jalopy and drive to Locust Grove, Mobeetie or maybe Corn Valley for a game on Friday afternoon. Some of the other players were Amasa Flynt, Robert Hunt, Roe Green, Dud McMillin, Marshall Adams, Clint Wofford, Lloyd Lee, Glen Porter, Wayne Roper, Dennis Greer, one or two of the Tillman boys and some others if they could crowd in. He remembers one game at Locust Grove where he struck out 17 batters.

Some other players he remembers were Les Womack, Sam Hale, Brigham Young, Tom Young, "Fuzz" Young, Joe Page, Perry Morris and Earl Wofford.

Under football he remembers the rivalry between Wheeler and Shamrock. He remembers one game with Shamrock when Perry Morris was clipped and had his leg broken and a near gang fight followed on the streets. Dennis Greer and he climbed up on a store building in order to have a better vantagepoint of viewing the fisticuffs and no doubt to be sure that they avoided any contract with the Shamrock boys who were ready for a fight.

Under heartaches as a boy he had his shares of disappointments. One was the year his father took a group of boys in an old hack, to which was hitched a team of old gray horses and spent the entire summer on a trip to Colorado he couldn't go as he was too young. He remembers his brother Douglas, the Sanders and Green boys told many thrilling stories about the trip.

Under visiting he recalled the many fishing, swimming parties and outings on the Sweetwater Creek. He remembers the visits with the Sorensons, Finsterwalds and others.

Under Gobblers who can forget the days when Fred Farmer called together "The Order of the Gobblers" on Saturday night after the barber shop closed? If you can recall this he is sure that you will be welcomed to Wheeler as an old-timer.

Some of the congratulation ads in the paper were Doris Forrester Agency all of the ads had a drawing of the people connected with firms with some of their history. Doris Forrester came to Wheeler in 1919. She was born in Davis OK. Grayce K. Davidson worked in the office. She came to Wheeler in 1932.

Percy's Garage was started in January 1933. He came to Wheeler in 1920. The article stated he owned the Garage since 1944. His wife's name was Bernice and at one time they had three little "Farmers" all grown now and in homes of their own. They were Lowell, Don, and Edna Helton.

Mayor of Wheeler was R. H. Forrester. He came to Wheeler in 1916.

F. & M. Butane of Shamrock was started in 1954. Those in the ads were I. C. Johnny Mundy, and Wallace Fields

Natural Gas Pipeline Co. of America was ran by R. W. Bob Rial. He came to Wheeler in 1954.

Otis Reid owned Otis Reid's Garage. He came to Wheeler in 1929.

Ware Chevrolet Company owner N. D. Ware Sr., Salesman was N. D. Ware Jr. Parts Department was A. O. (Bud) Vanpool; Bob McNeil was with the service department.

Wheeler Gas Co. lists H. M. Wiley and Max Wiley. The company was organized in 1926.

Risner's Market was on West Highway 152 and was managed by Henry Risner. J. E. (Jim) Risner was the Water Superintendent of Wheeler.

City Drug Store manager was Everett Cole who came to Wheeler in 1924. Lillian Lee was co-owner and had come to Wheeler in 1931. Elsie Grimes worked in the store. She had come to Wheeler in 1927.

Nunn's Cafe of Shamrock was run by John L. Nunn. He came to Shamrock October 3, 1927.

Chapman Service Station was owned and operated by James Wylie (Bill) Chapman. It was located on the west highway 152. He came to Wheeler May 18, 1948.

Jim Magruder ran Jim's Drive Inn.

Albert Chapman ran Chapman Dairy. He came to Wheeler in 1937.

R. D. and Clarence A. Holdeman ran Holdeman Implement Co. They came to Wheeler in December 1947.

Lee Guthrie owned Rouge & Mustang Theatres. He came to Wheeler in 1930.

Lottie Eva Denson and Cecil Denson owned Clay Food Store. Lottie Eva was born in Wheeler and Cecil came in June 1939. Other members of the firm were Irene Dyer who came to Wheeler in 1921, Robert Denson, Harold D. Callan, Dayton Kirkendall, Betty Lou Johnson, Cecil Douglas Blevins, Odell Harris and Erma Riley.

R. C. Lewis Oil Co. was the Conoco Distributor of Shamrock.

Public Service also had an ad. Lawrence Feed Co. was owned by J. M. Lawrence.

E. R. (Hoot) Howe owned Hoot's Cafe. He came to Wheeler in January 1947. The cafe was located on highway 152.

Wheeler Radio & Lewis Carl and Opal (Hansard) Laffin owned Refrigerator Service. They came to Wheeler May 4, 1935. Earl Francis Barnes came to Wheeler 1924 and started working for them on January 1, 1946.

C. B. and Irma Kirk owned Kirk Funeral Home. They came to Wheeler in 1947.

Steve Burl (Buster) Black managed Wheeler Locker & Grocery. He came to Wheeler in November 1946. Eula Pearl Jones came to Wheeler in 1916 and was cashier and bookkeeper for the company. The business was located on East Highway 152.

Nora's Cafe was located on West Highway 152 and was owned by Sam and Nora Watson. They came to Wheeler September 21, 1921.

The Wheeler Times ad had a map of the location of the business. The publisher was Chas. Slemmer, Mildred Slemmer was the bookkeeper. Mildred Ann Slemmer was also associated with the Times since August 1, 1954. Jimmy Zack Goad was the printer of the Times. Kearby Weatherly was also an employee. "Hut" Hutson of Amarillo had made the drawings for the paper. E. D. Guynes did the history work on the business. He was Secretary Manager of the Chamber of Commerce.

Other ads with our names of employers were Nash Appliance & Supply Co., General Telephone Company of the Southwest, Wheeler Hospital, and United Carbon Company, Inc.

6 slices bacon, fried crisp, break into pieces
 1 lb. ground beef
 1 cup whole kernel corn, drained
 1/4 cup green pepper, finely chopped
 1/4 cup chopped onions
 1/4 cup corn meal
 1/2 tsp oregano, 1/2 tsp chili powder
 1 1/2 cups shredded cheddar cheese
 1 8 oz. can tomato sauce
 1 tsp salt, 1/8 tsp pepper
 1/2 tsp worchester sauce, 1/2 tsp dry mustard
 4 stuffed olives (optional)
 1 egg
 1/4 cup milk

Pie crust: 1 cup flour, 1/3 cup shortening, 2 tbs corn meal, 3 to 4 tbs. water. Combine flour and cornmeal. Blend in shortening. Sprinkle water over mixture. Stir with fork until dough holds together. Form into ball and roll out until 1 1/2 larger than inverted 9 inch pie pan. Put in pie pan.
 Brown beef in large skillet. Drain grease. Stir in corn, green pepper,

onion, cornmeal, oregano, chili powder, 1/2 salt, pepper and tomato sauce. Put in prepared crust. Bake 425 degrees for 25 minutes. Combine egg, milk, 1/2 salt, mustard, cheese and worcheshire sauce. Spread on baked pie. Top with bacon and chopped olives. Bake 5 minutes or until cheese melts.

Let stand 10 minutes before serving. Thank, Martha Meek, for sharing the delicious pie and recipe.

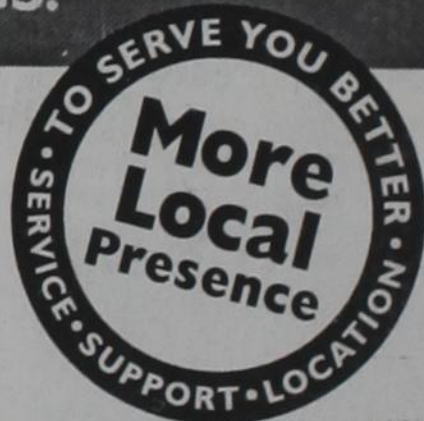
