
# Wheeler Chamber of Commerce Christmas Open House Mon. Dec. 2




# Ravonda Hardcastle Santa Letters To Be Published In Times

Teachers, if you would like to help the children with their letters as a class project, please see that the letters are clearly printed and that they reach the "Times" office on time.






Wheeler Mustang Landon Sams, #35, shoots in the Wheeler Miami game. Wheeler won 56-43.




