Take time to look at the pictures and help the baby of your choice win a savings bond by placing any amount of money in the can.



The Old Mobeetie Texas Asso- quired the old Mobeetie School building located in Old Mobeetie. It is located two blocks east of the Mobeetie Jail Museum. The building is in disrepair and was on its way to becoming beyond salvation. The OMTA believes the purchase of the facility will enable the museum to have room for future growth and additional activities day, January 26. when the building is renovated. Currently, the museum does not have room to display all of the

artifacts in its possession. The museum board is actively soliciting donations to cover the cost of purchase and repair of the roof and windows so additional deterioration to the building will not occur. Approximately \$10,000 to \$15,000 is needed to get the building in the dry. The museum, being a non-profit organization does not have the funds in their current budget to cover these expenses. All donations are eligible for tax deductions.

Many students have attended school in this building and seeing the old school deteriorate over the last several years has been sad. We solicit donations to salvage this building from ruin. This is an excellent opportunity to give something back to the place where Mobeetie students received part of their education for many years. The foundation and brick walls are in good condition to be about eighty years old. However, the middle part of the roof is flat and needs to be replaced to keep water out. We believe that the metal portion of the roof can be repaired with volunteer labor. Donated labor will be needed to remove all of the accumulated junk in the building after the roof and windows are repaired.
