
'Walk Across Texas' Program Underway


After the first week of walking the thirteen teams participating in Walk Across Texas have walked a total of 839.98 miles. Keep up the good work!







TxDOT Reports Of Vandalism Increase

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) has noted an increase in traffic sign theft and vandalism in Childress District's 13 counties. Although the signs are quickly replaced when stolen or vandalized, it becomes a safety concern. "Missing signs can endanger travelers and the vandalizing of certain signs can risk a persons safety", says Craig Clark,

District Engineer.

The costs associated with this crime are high. Damaged signs pose a danger to the traveling public, and the funds spent to replace them could be spent elsewhere. Taxpayers in the Childress District TxDOT spent more than \$27,000 last year to replace stolen and vandalized signs along state roadways. Statewide, taxpayers spent more than \$8 million replacing signs damaged by natural disasters, accidents, and vandals. Wood and metal signs cost approximately \$10 per squre foot to produce. The costs to install replacement signs vary depending on the amount of time and equipment needed.

However, the cost can get much higher. In Texas, it is against the law to possess a sign without a permit, and the state does not sell signs or issue permits to possess them. And, it is also against the law to intentionally or knowingly damage or destroy property. According to Texas Department of Public Safety Sergeant, Alan Troup, it is a Class B misdemeanor if a person intentionally steals or knowingly damages or destroys property and if the stolen or damaged property loss is \$50 or more but less than \$500. In addition, if the loss to TxDOT is more than \$1,500 the person or persons responsible can be charged with a felony offense.


"These volunteers who turn out for the event shows that citizens are genuinely concerned with beautifying the state and your corner of West Texas," said Seal. "Since we started counting in






