Over- 65 homeowners also may ransfer the percentage of school tax paid, based on their former home's over-65 school tax ceiling, to a new home.

Do I have to apply each year? No. If you had a homestead exemption on your home in 2002 you won't need to reapply for 2003 unless your chief appraiser requires it. However, if you haven't received an exemption on your present home-orityou've moved to a new home-you'll need to file for an exemption for 2003. II you are 65 this year, you may file for the over- 65 exemption up to one year after the date you turned 65. And for
