


### Memorial Services For James Wilson



## 2003 Property Tax Rates in WHEELER COUNTY

This notice concerns 2003 property tax rates for WHEELER COUNTY. It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.

I enjoy the compilation of Psalms in the Old Testament. There are a number of beautiful, inspiring words scattered throughout the Psalms. It is true that not all of the Psalms are intended to be "happy" ones. Psalm 88 for instance will leave you depressed, and there are many Psalms that are intended to be Psalms of lament. However, most of these types of Psalms still end in a word of hope. One of these Psalms of lament is Psalm 51, written by David, specifically addressing his guilt and shame after he comes to his senses after having sinned with Bathsheba. David's words show that he is concerned and afraid that God will never forgive him. He begs God for redemption. Based on David's life we see that he was indeed redeemed by God.

As I was re-reading the Psalms I came across Psalm 32 a Psalm that I am now convinced might be a response to Psalm 51 (remember that the numbers on these Psalms were added later and they are not necessarily in a chronological

order). This Psalm is the response of a person who realizes that they have been forgiven. In it David talks about while he was still living in his sins his life was horrible, his "bones wasted away through ... groaning all day long" (v. 3). He felt as though his "strength was sapped as in the heat of summer" (v. 4). But once he confesses to the Lord his sins he begins to realize that he is forgiven. What a wonderful feeling, to know that sins have been forgiven. David is so thrilled by this burden lifted that he wishes others to experience it as well, so he exclaims to everyone to follow God, to trust God, to go to God at all times - even when sin. has put some distance between the person and God. We should not try to sin, but at

the same time we are all sinners (Romans 3:23). Isn't it great to realize that God forgives sinners? David finishes Psalm 32 with these words: "Rejoice In the Lord and be glad, you righteous; sing, all you who are upright in heart!"
