
Armando Velasquez Rites Read Sept. 5 Armando Velasquez, 63, died

Tuesday, September 2, 2003, at Amarillo, Texas.



1. Chairman Tipps called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.


2. Approval of Minutes of August 11, 2003 Meeting.






"My Jesus, I love Thee, I know Thou Art Mine'


















