Louise Young, 85 Services Are Tues.

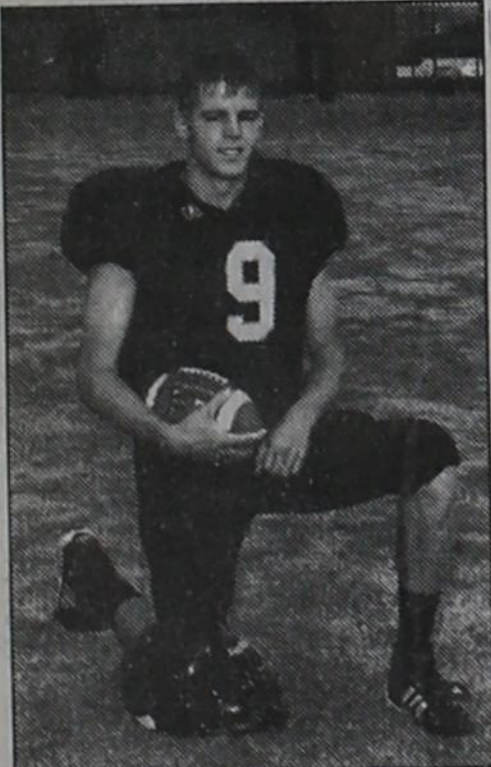
Louise Davis Young, 85, died December 28, 2003 at Llano Memorial Hospital in Llano, Texas.

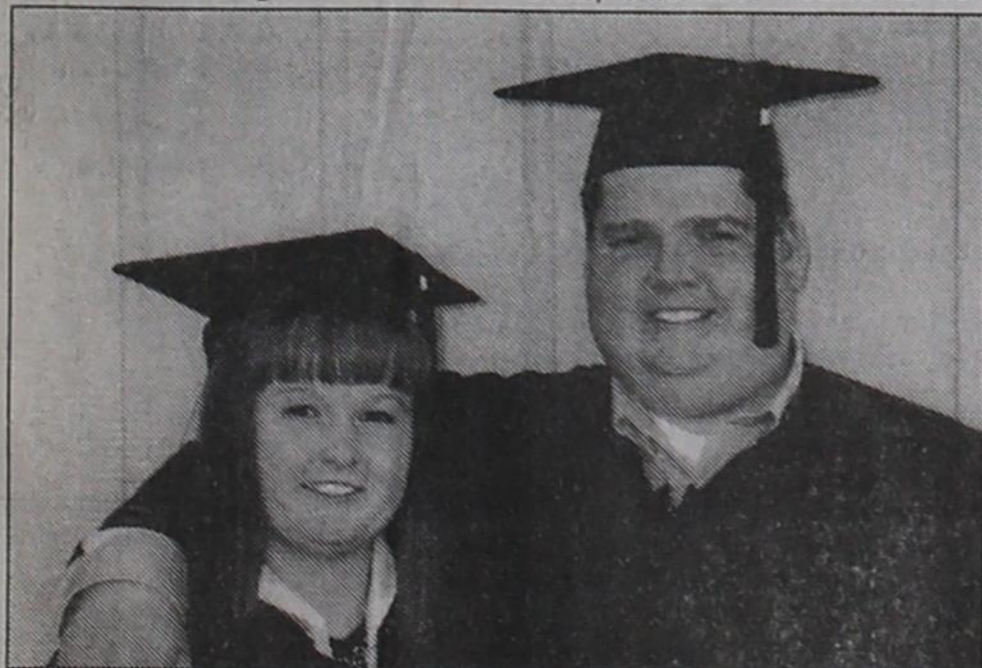

Mrs. Gardner moved to Wheeler in 1986 from San Bernardino. She was a member of Wheeler Christian Center Church.

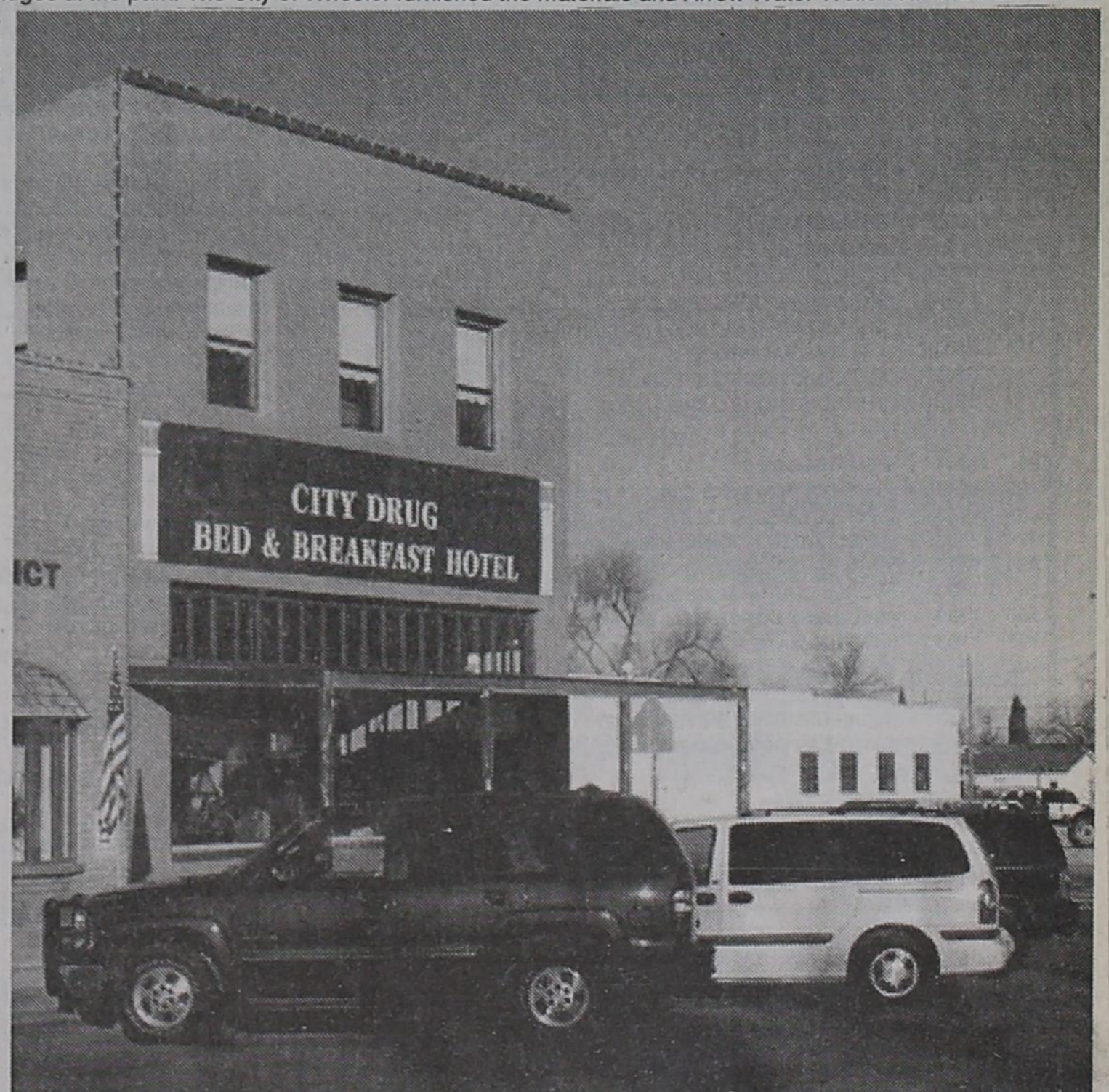
Survivors include a sister, Ruby Brown of Wheeler; and several nieces and nephews.

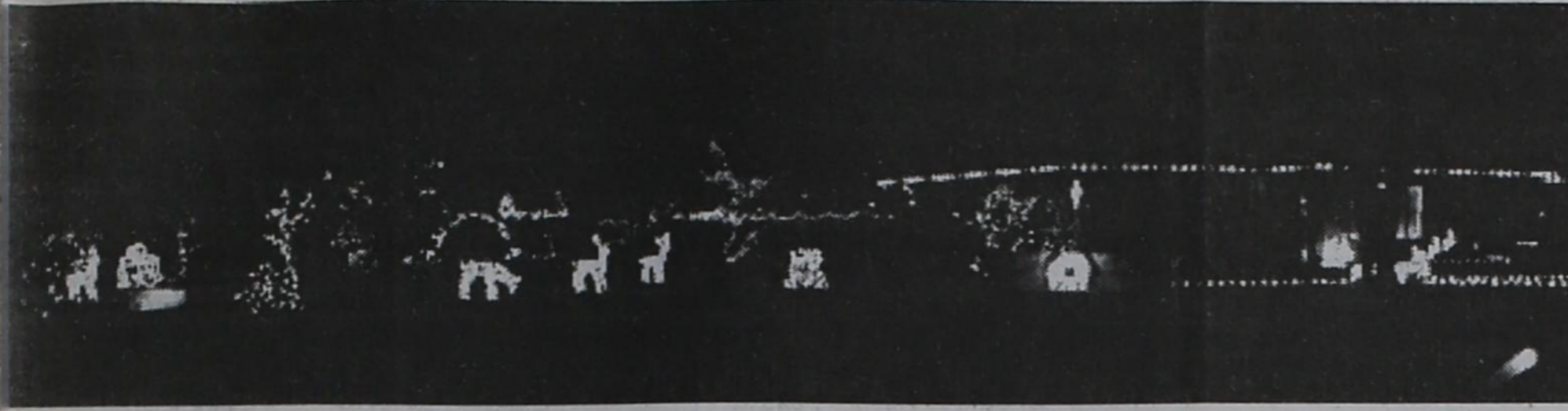

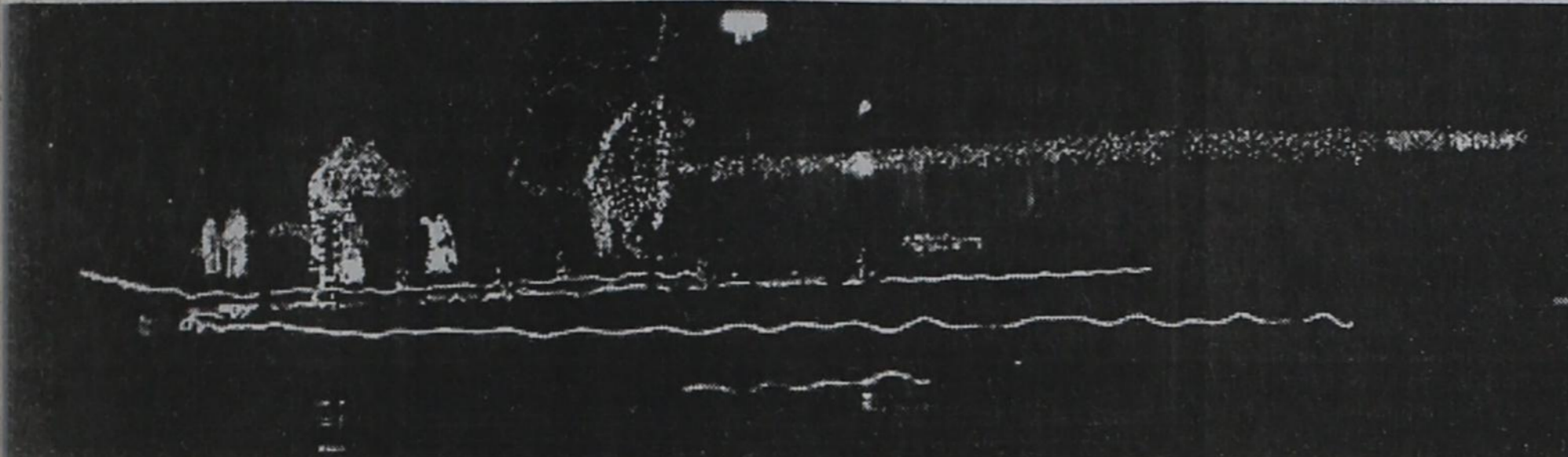

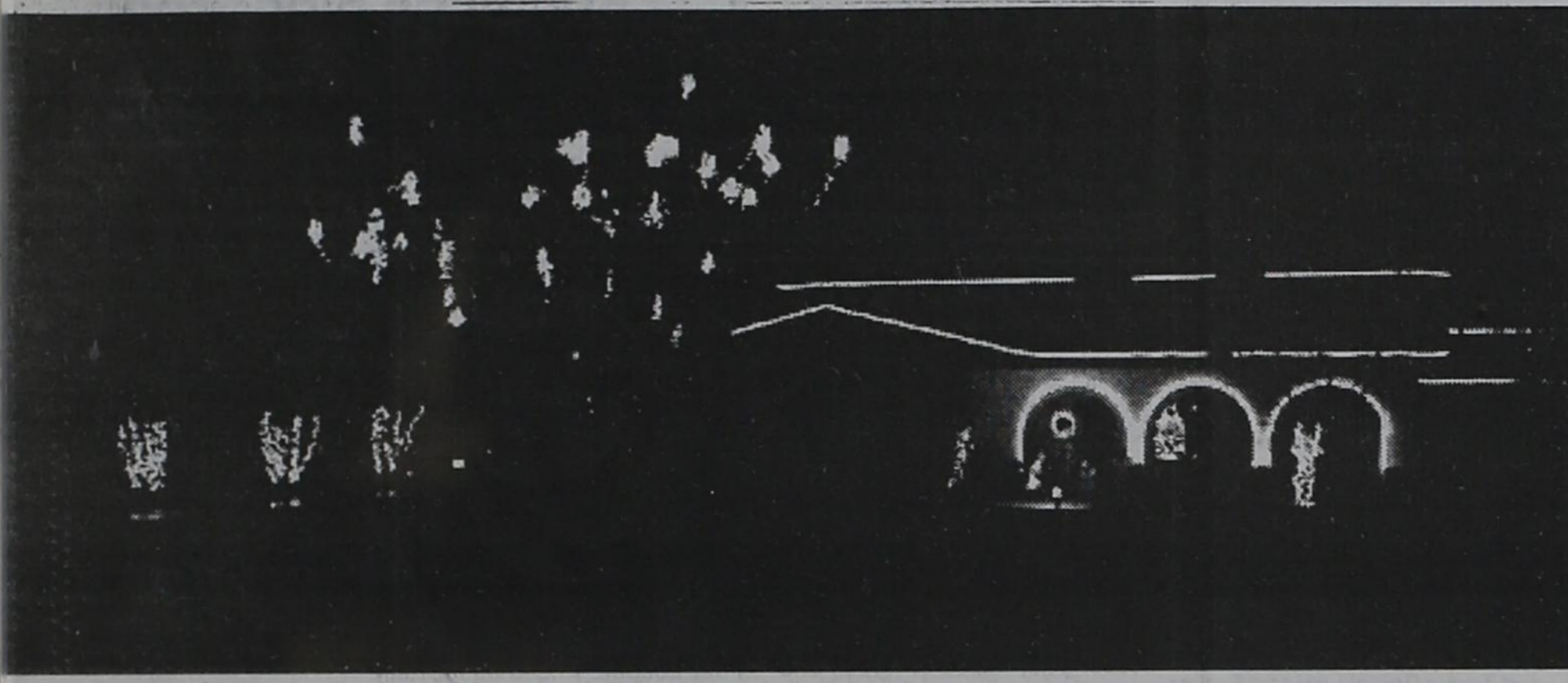
