## COMMISSIONER'S COURT MEETS IN REGULAR SESSION MONDAY

The Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, October 13, 2003, at 10:00 a.m. in the courthouse annex at 410 South Main Street in Wheeler.

Sixteen items were on the agenda.

Charles Kuntz met with the commissioners to offer the court an idea, which was not on the agenda. The suggestion was to make the old jail on the courthouse square a visitors center for the county. In connection with the U Drop Inn in Shamrock the visitor's center in Wheeler would have available information on tourist attractions and activities for the north end of the county. The tourist stop at the U Drop Inn in Shamrock, but need to have something to make them stay in the county longer.

The minutes for the September 22 meeting had already been approved by the court at the special meeting October 6.

The court approved the reports submitted by the J.P.'s, County Treasurer, County Tax Assessor, County Clerk and District Clerk.

The hourly payroll time sheets were approved for payment and the bills for the month were approved for payment.

There was no action on the amendment of the budget.

The courthouse restoration is on track and no action was taken.

The commissioners decided to not renew the burn ban at this time.

No action was taken on item #8, "Consideration of changing for-

mula allocation pertaining to road mileage in each precinct.

Ken Daughtry met with the court as a representative of the Wheeler Volunteer Fire Department. The local department needs two light bars and request \$900 for the purchase of one of the bars by the county. The court agreed to purchase one light bar.

Easement was granted to J & B Ranch Company along County Road 23 to County Road 5C to install a water line.

Easements were approved to allow Bravo Natural Resources, Inc., and Crawley Petroleum Corporation to cross county roads 28 and 29 to lay a pipeline.

The county approved the contract to lease the Department of Human Services office in Shamrock a building owned by the county. The contract is for one year.

The commissioners approved the salary adjustment for County Treasurer Jauna Benefield. Her salary was raised to \$27,748.56, which will bring her salary equal to that of other elected officials. Jauna is up to date with her schooling and is taking the full responsibilities of the county treasurer.

The commissioners took no action on the storage of seized vehicles in county facilities until a further investigation was made.

The last item on the agenda was approved by the court; it was to adopt a resolution for Indigent Defense Grant Program for 2004.

## Wheeler Co. Is First Deemed Storm Ready

A StormReady Accreditation Presentation Ceremony will be held Monday, October 20, 2003, in the courthouse annex at 410 S. Main Street in Wheeler at 11 A.M.

At the presentation, Wheeler County will be named by NOAA National Weather Service as the first county to earn "Storm Ready" title in the Texas panhandle.

County individuals have taken all the training and meet all the requirements needed to receive the distinction.

"StormReady" is a voluntary program, and is offered as a means of providing guidance and incentive to local and county officials interested in improving hazardous weather operations.

To receive "StormReady" recognition, communities are required to meet minimal criteria in hazardous weather preparedness, as established through a partnership of the National Weather Service and federal, state, and local emergency management professionals.

To be certified as StormReady, a community must:

- ... establish a 24-hour warning point and emergency operations center;
- ... have more than one way to receive severe weather forecasts and warnings and to alert the public;
- ... create a system that monitors local weather conditions;
- ... promote the importance of public readiness through community seminars;
- ... develop a formal hazardous weather plan, which includes training severe weather spotters and holding emergency exercises.

Wheeler County of the Texas Panhandle has worked to meet and exceed these criteria through their dedication to public education, training, weather monitoring, warning reception and dissemination. Wheeler County's StormReady status is valid for three years from the ceremony date.

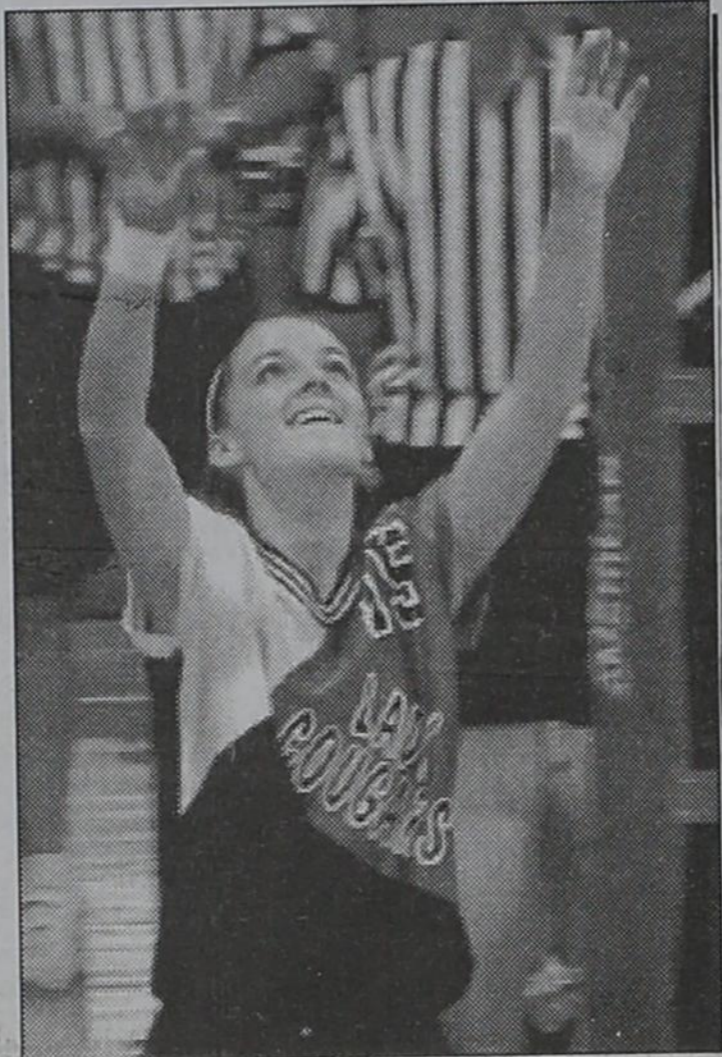

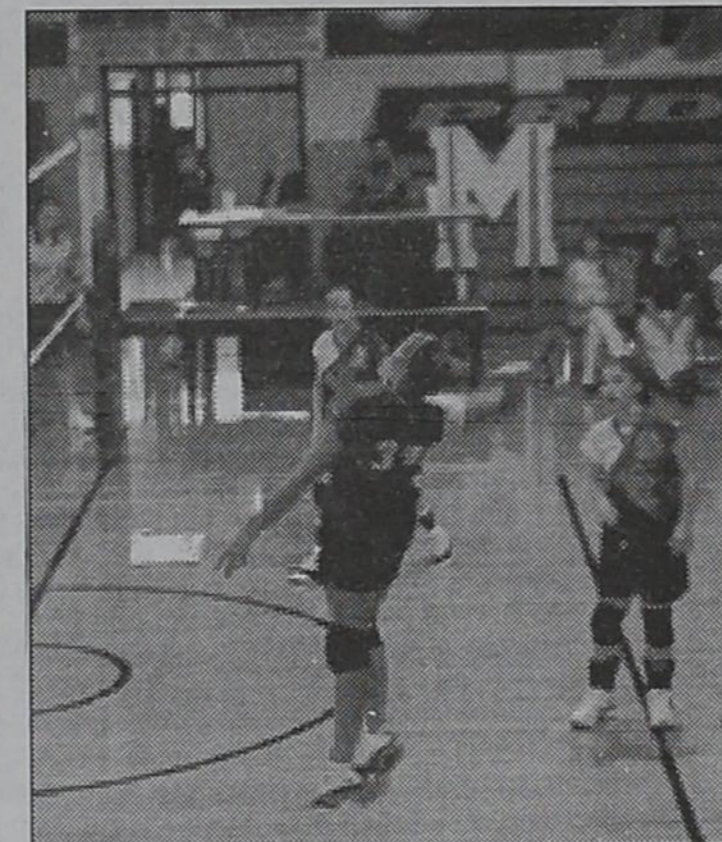

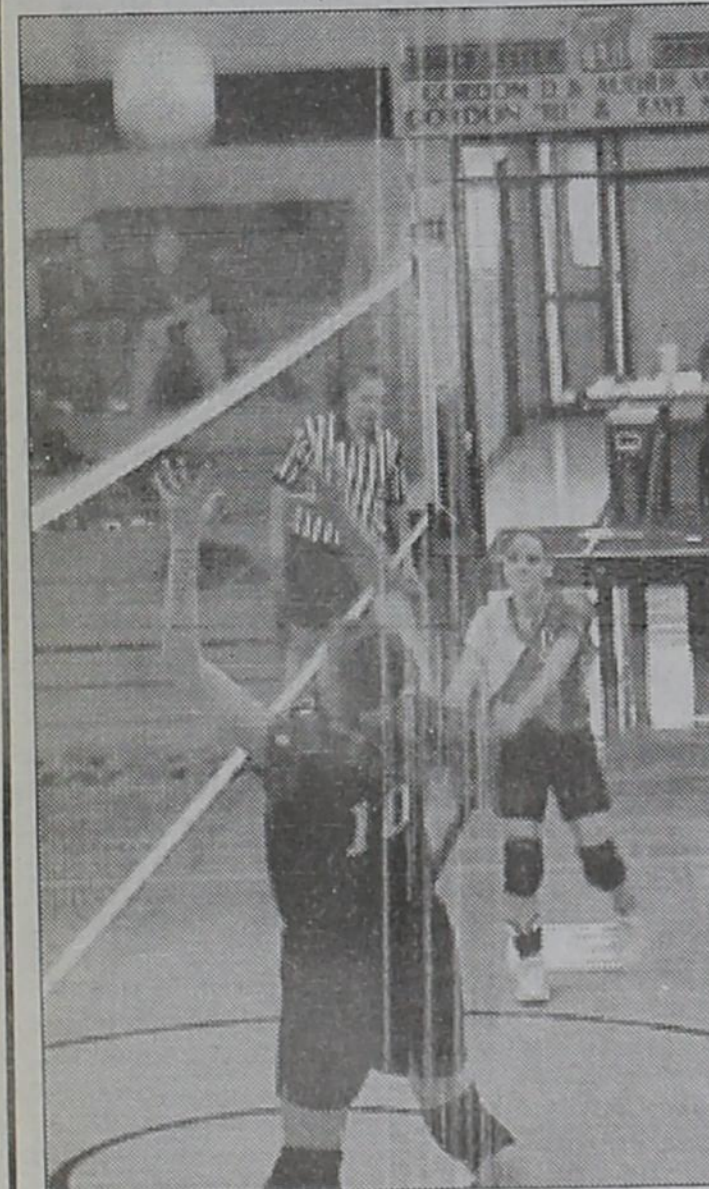

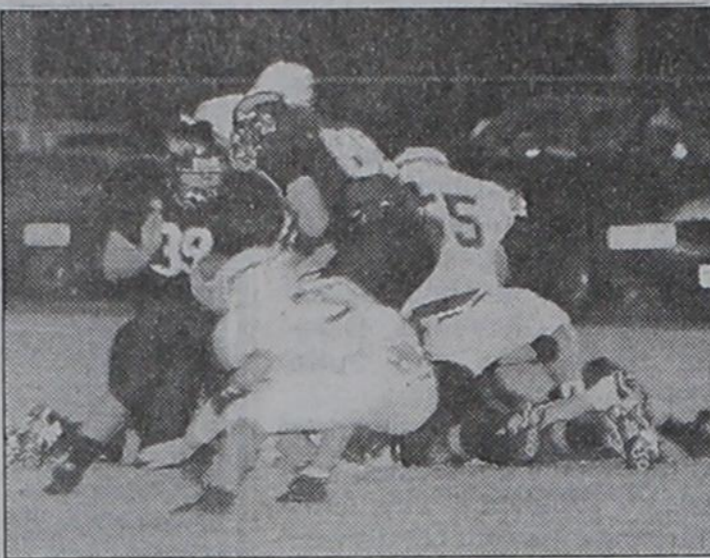

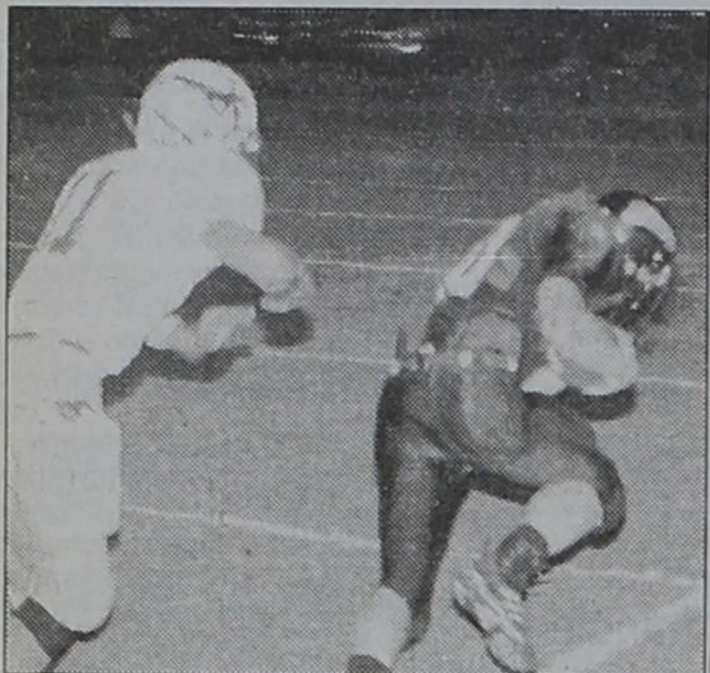

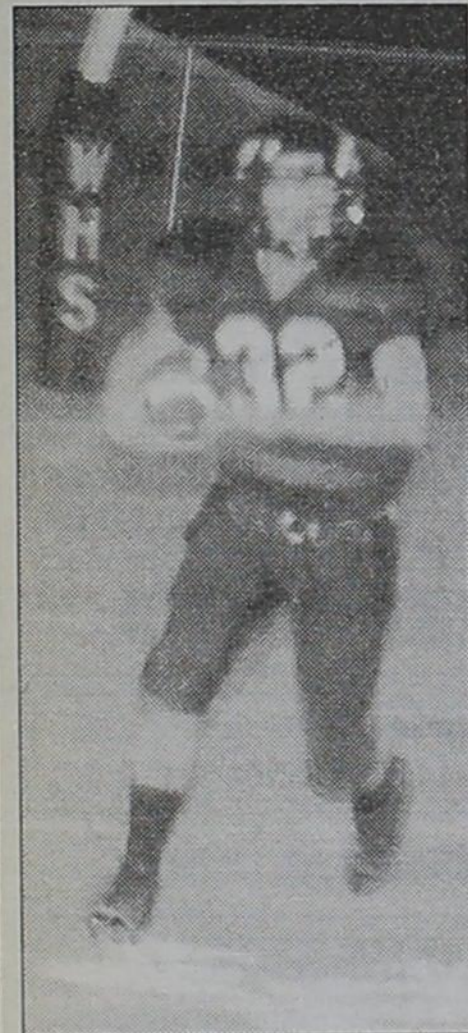

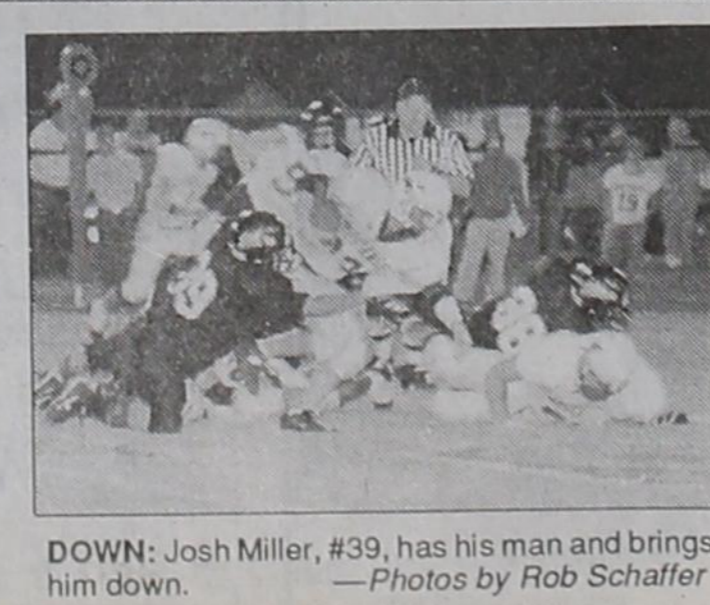
