In Wheeler's first win of the season 44-18 against Boys Ranch


Terry Menefield carried 16 times for 71 yards and two touchdowns, returned an interception 53 yards for a TD and threw a 25-yard touchdown pass.

Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Tuesday, October 9, 2007, in the commissioners' courtroom of the Wheeler county courthouse. The meeting opened at 10 a.m. Seven items were on the

agenda. Before the items on the agenda were discussed, Larry Settle, a consultant with TES Energy Services, LP was introduced to the court. Settle informed the commissioners how deregulation of electricity in Texas could be of benefit. The only deregulated energy provider serving Wheeler County is Texas Utilities. The county presently pays the electricity at four
