Proceeds and donations from the tournament went toward the Wheeler Ex-Students Scholarship Fund.



Whitescarver went over the plans and explained different features to be considered in the restoration.


The "handicapped" entry for the courthouse has been a problem since the project began. First considered was a ramp on the east side, which was a major distraction. Presented Thursday is the present proposal which calls for a ramp from street level on the north side with the ramp running to the basement level of the courthouse. The new entry will be to the east of the present north door and will be next to the relocated elevator.



The Minor Prophets of the Old Testament occupy a part of the Bible that often times goes unexplored. Some of the titles are hard to pronounce. They are difficult to find because they are small books. And outside of maybe the story of Jonah, we just don't spend much time there. But if we are willing to dig a little deeper, we might find some interesting and valuable lessons from these twelve fascinating books. Hosea lives out a metaphor of how God has stayed with people who lack faith and sin greatly against him. Joel contains a prophesy of the events of Pentecost in Acts 2. Amos is a very harsh book, criticizing those who live hypocritical lives, letting them know that outward acts of worship are not as important as the inside intentions. Obadiah is the only one-chapter book in the Old Testament and it concerns the destruction of another nation that is living godlessly. Jonah has the big fish story you probably already know about. Micah is the book that prophesies that Jesus will be born in Bethlehem. Nahum

has a lot of similarities with the other messages that can be seen in the book of Jonah, especially concerning the city of Ninevah who had previously been shown forgiveness by God. Habakkuk is a beautiful book that shows that God is in control, even when we don't understand what is going on around us, and that we should be silent because the Lord is in his holy temple. Zephaniah offers an interesting comment that shows that one day it won't be us singing to God, but God singing to us. Haggai gives some historical information about the rebuilding of the temple. Zechariah is the Minor Prophet that has more prophesies about Jesus than any other Old Testament book except for Isaiah. And finally Malachi, a book that asks us to trust the Lord and then watch how he blesses his people.
