Mr. Burton was born July 24, Mrs. Burton.

Growing up during the Great Corn Valley School which had out- across the Lone Star state. But, graduated from the seventh grade at Corn Valley, he was valedictorian of his class (although he's quick to point out that his graduating class consisted of him and one other student). He went on to play football and basketball at nearby Mobeetie and Wheeler.

But, Pete missed graduating from Wheeler by 6 months. On December 7, 1942, the first anniversary of the bombing of Pearl Harbor, he joined the U.S. Navy. His tour of duty included stops in San Diego, California; Norman, Oklahoma; Jacksonville, Florida; Rhode Island; and Norfolk, Virginia as he rose to the rank of Aviation Machinist Mate 2nd Class before he was discharged in December, 1945.

He began civilian life at Lambert Air Field in St. Louis, where he married Gay McCulley. They moved to Pampa, Texas, in August, 1947, where he worked for the J.C. Daniels Lincoln-Mercury dealership. He was quickly promoted through the ranks from managing the parts department to sales manager. By April, 1954, however, he was granted the first new Ford dealership awarded through the Oklahoma City district office following World War II. At age 29, Pete had apparently come full circle by returning to Wheeler as the owner of an automobile dealership, which would bear the Burton family name for 47 years from 1954 through 2001

Pete Burton served for a period of time on the Wheeler City Council and as mayor, 1967-1973, and 1976-1982, a total of 12 years During this period, 135 blocks of city streets were paved. Also, during his period as mayor, he invited Alan L. Bean, the fourth man to walk on the moon, to Wheeler, Texas, his birthplace, and at that time, the name of the street where he was born was changed to Alan L. Bean Boulevard.

Pete Burton was voted the Chamber of Commerce's Man of the Year in 1976, and received the Pioneer Spirit Award in 2007.

In 1982, he bought the Ford-Lincoln-Mercury dealership in Pampa, Texas, which he sold in 1988. With a group of investors, he purchased the First National Bank Wheeler in 1970, a financial establishment which had been in the Holt family since 1909. Pete was involved in the bank until its sale in 1994. He also served on

#### Parkview Artery Thanksgiving Food Safety Tips

Thanksgiving is upon us and with it comes the traditional turkey dinner. However, the improper storing, cooking, and serving of roast turkey can lead to the growth of harmful bacteria like salmonella, which can cause foodborne illness.

Here are some tips to share with your family for preparing a Thanksgiving bird safely.

Thaw the frozen turkey in the refrigerator. Allow one day for each five pounds of turkey. A twenty-pound turkey will take about four days to thaw. Hint: Remove neck & giblets from inside the bird as soon as possible to hasten thawing.

Do not thaw on the kitchen counter. If you do not have time to thaw in the refrigerator, you may thaw it in cold water, provided that the turkey is in a leakproof packaging, it is submerged, and the water is changed every half-hour. Allow 30 minutes per pound of turkey to thaw in cold water.

Cook fresh turkeys within two days, thawed ones within four days.

Wash your hands with hot soapy water before and after handling raw poultry. Wash all knives, cutting boards and utensils also after using for raw poul-

Read and follow the cooking directions on the label. Cook turkey until it is done (165°F). Do not slow cook overnight at low temperatures or partially cook. Some turkeys come with pop-up thermometers. They are to be used only as a guide to doneness. Take the temperature with a meat thermometer to be sure the temperature is over 165°F. (Reheat all leftovers to 165°F. (Use your meat thermometer.) Gravy should be brought to a rolling boil.



#### T.T.C. Report Says **Use Existing Hwgs.**

using existing highways Existing highways will be considered first as state transportation officials continue work to identify an alignment for I-69/TTC, an effort that will include unprecedented public involvement opportunities during the next several months, according to the Texas

Department of Transportation. TxDOT, in coordination with the Federal Highway Administration, today released the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for the proposed Trans-Texas Corridor project, saying it will make transportation safer, faster, more reliable and provide for faster hur-

ricane evacuation. The 1,072 page report is the result of nearly three years of work with local officials and input from transportation demand will greatly citizens through hundreds of public meetings. It looked at a wide, 650-mile long study area stretching from far south Texas to extreme northeast Texas.

\*Governor Rick Perry\*s commitment to improve mobility across off what TxDOT officials call an the state and his long-term vision to prepare for tomorrow's transportation challenges have brought us to this point,\* said Ted Houghton, member of the Texas Transportation Commission.

The report recommends additional detailed examination and public comment on a narrower study area to see where I-69/TTC can be located while minimizing environmental impacts. The recommended study area is approximately one-half to four-miles wide.

As a result of public comment to date, the report recommends continued environmental studies on I-69/TTC focused on using existing highways first with new corridors as a secondary option.

\*We are doing what the public asked us to do and that is look at existing highways first, said Amadeo Saenz, TxDOT executive director.

\*If improvements to existing highways and infrastructure cannot be made to handle long range transportation needs - or if citizens and local officials tell us they prefer a new corridor - other options will be considered. Decisions will be made based on public input and detailed studies of environmental and social impacts."

As an example, Saenz pointed to public comments urging a better, more direct connection between the Port of Corpus Christi and the inlandport of Laredo.

fined study area,\* Saenz said. \*The Trans-Texas Corridor will connect the state's metro and urban areas without cutting through the hearts of our cities,\* said Saenz. \*We will work with local officials to consider how existing highways will be used to connect

urban areas to the corridor. \* The report also looked at future transportation needs along the corridor where 12.1 million people are expected to live by 2040. Activity at Texas ports is growing rapidly which will mean more trucks along the corridor, ac-

cording to the report. \*Failure to prepare for future increase the cost and difficulty of meeting these needs in the future,\* said Saenz. \*We must plan now to solve today's problems and meet tomorrow's challenges.

In January 2008, TxDOT will hold 10 Town Hall Meetings along the corridor. The scheduling of town hall meetings is a direct result of public comment that citizens want more opportunity to ask questions and get answers about the Trans-Texas Corridor.

In February, TxDOT will begin the formal public hearings on the environmental study.
