

In the Panhandle alone, adult volunteers are working closely with county agents and specialists to deliver quality educational programs and skills development training to some 25,000 4-H mem-



At their meeting on September 3, Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District's Board of Directors set the 2003 tax rate at .0154/ \$100 evaluation. This the same rate the District adopted last year, and will decrease revenues approximately \$30,000.

The District's general manager, C. E. Williams, said the final bill to property owners may vary from county to county because of differences in valuations. Property appraisals are made by the individual counties. The District includes all or parts of Armstrong, Carson, Donley, Gray, Hutchinson, Hemphill, Potter, Roberts, and Wheeler counties.

The Board also lowered the 2003-2004 budget by more than \$41,000.



















Many residents have been noticing and complaining to the City of Wheeler elected officials of the junked vehicles sitting around town, the grass and weeds grown up around vacant houses, and houses that are unsafe and provide areas for illegal activities, therefore, we feel action must be taken to correct these matters.

We also have residents not abiding with Ordinance No. 92, which regulates the size of pens for keeping livestock in the City.

If any of the things mentioned above pertain to you or your property, we request that you please take care of the matter in a timely manner. Enclosed are copies of Ordinances concerning these problems, and the actions that will be taken if not corrected.

Things gradually build up without us even noticing, but let's restore the pride that has long been synonymous with Wheeler.

The City of Wheeler Elected Officials and Employees City Code

Art. 2. Junked Vehicle Ordinance

Note: For state law relating to junked vehicles, see VACS art. 670ld-11.

Sec. 10-21. Brief title.

This article shall be known and cited as the "Junked Vehicle Ordinance".

Sec. 10-22. Definitions. As used herein:

The term "junked vehicle" means any motor vehicle as defined in Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, art. 670ld-11, § 1, as amended, which is inoperative and which does not have lawfully affixed thereto both an unexpired license plate or plates and a valid motor vehicle safety inspection certificate and which is either wrecked, dismantled, partially dismantled or discarded.

(2) The word "demolisher" means any person whose business is to convert a motor vehicle into processed scrap or scrap metal, or otherwise to wreck or dismantle motor vehicles.

(3) The term "motor vehicle" means any motor vehicle subject to registration pursuant to the Texas Certificate of Title Act.

(4) The term "antique auto" means passenger cars or trucks that were manufactured in 1925 or before, or which become 35 or more years old.

The term "specialinterest vehicle" means a motor vehicle of any age which has not been altered or modified from original manufacturer's specifications and, because of its historic interest, is being preserved by hobby-

The term "collector" means the owner of one or more antique or special-intérest vehicles who collects, purchases, acquires, trades, or disposes of special-interest or antique vehicles or parts of them for his own use in order to restore, preserve, and maintain an antique or special-interest vehicle for historic interest.

Sec. 10-23. Declared public nuisances.

The City Council hereby finds that "junked vehicles", as defined above, which are located in any place where they are visible from a public place or public right-of-way are detrimental to the safety and welfare of the general public, tending to reduce the value of private property, to invite vandalism, to create fire hazards, to constitute an attractive nuisance creating a hazard to the health and safety of minors, and are detrimental to the economic welfare of the City of Wheeler, Texas, by producing urban blight which is adverse to the maintenance and continuing de-

velopment of the City; and any such vehicle is, therefore, declared to be a public nuisance.

Sec. 10-24. Chief of Police to give notice.

(a) The Chief of Police of the City of Wheeler, Texas, upon noticing or having brought to his attention that a nuisance exists, as defined above, within the City, either upon private property or public property or on a public right-ofway, shall give or cause to be given to the owner or occupant of such private or public property, or to the owner or occupant of the premises adjacent to the public right-of-way whereupon such public nuisance exists, a written notice stating the nature of the public







This agreement this date made and entered into by and between the CITY OF SHAMROCK, TEXAS, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL, hereinafter referred to as City, and the COUNTY OF WHEELER, TEXAS, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS COUNTY

JUDGE AND COMMISSIONERS'

COURT, hereinafter referred to as

County, WITNESSETH: SECTION I

That for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises herein contained, City will operate and furnish a 24 hour dispatch service system for the County as outlined in Section V.

SECTION II In compliance with State laws and the regulations of the Department of Public Safety of the State of Texas, the management control of the teletype system shall be vested in the Chief of Police of the City of Shamrock. Operation and supervision of the dispatch system, including the employment of personnel shall be done by a Chief Dispatcher according to policies set out by the City of Shamrock. SECTION III

The dispatch system shall he separated on the accounting records of the City as an individual department of the City, and personnel of the Dispatch System shall be employees of the City. SECTION IV

The City shall be responsible for providing all radio equipment, the maintenance and upkeep of such equipment, suitable for the operation of the dispatch system as such system is presently operating. SECTION V

It is further understood that the County shall receive dispatch service for all County Officers, Department of Public Safety Officers, Texas Parks and Wildlife Officers, Wheeler County Ambulance Service, Shamrock Fire Department and all other County and State Officers operating within

Wheeler County, Texas. SECTION VI

The County shall pay unto the City, fifty percent (50%) of all personnel services along with fifty percent (50%) of telephone and teletype expenses, such combined expense not to exceed \$49,760.00 (personnel - \$43,760.00; communications - \$6,000.00), without prior approval of the County, as billed by the City on a monthly basis.

SECTION VII The County shall provide housing for the dispatch system and shall be responsible for all utilities with the exception of telephone service. All long distance calls shall be paid for by the department responsible for making the calls. Each party hereto shall be responsible for fifty percent (50%) of the base telephone and teletype charges. The City shall be responsible for insuring the communications equipment of the dispatch system.

SECTION VIII This contractual agreement shall be for a period of one year beginning October 1, 2003 and ending September 30, 2004. At or before the end of such period, the Parties hereto shall meet together for the purpose of renegotiating a similar contract for the ensuing year. This contract may be terminated by either of the parties with such termination to be effective not less than thirty (30) days from date of such written notice.

munity Services, a community based non-profit organization has served as a rural public transportation provider and provided coordinated rural public transportation services in the counties of Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collingsworth, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Donley, Gray, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, rural Potter, rural Randall, Roberts, Sherman, Swisher, and Wheeler,

WHEREAS, Panhandle Community Services has been providing public transportation services for these counties since before September 1, 1995, and in so doing, received public transportation funds from the Texas Department of Transportation and the Federal Transportation Administration, or the administrations' successor;

WHEREAS, by virtue of Chapter 458 of the Transportation Code of the State of Texas, PCS is a 'Rural Public Transportation Pro-

vider" and WHEREAS, the 26 counties of the Panhandle is a Rural Transit District as defined in said Chapter

458; and

WHEREAS, the Panhandle Community Services Board of Directors recognize the need to establish a governing body for the public transportation district in accordance with the applicable laws in order that the rural transportation district may conduct business as a Rural Transit Provider; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the residents of Wheeler County to formally unite with residents of neighboring counties and establish a service area within the Panhandle Transit District, hereinafter referred to as the "District" in order that the District may continue to provide transportation services in accordance with the guidance of TXDOT for implementation of Chapter 458 of the Transportation Code of the State of Texas.

THEREFORE, BE IT RE-SOLVED that Wheeler County wishes to join and be recognized as a member of the Panhandle Transit District.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in joining the Panhandle Transit District, the Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County is in agreement with the following aspects of the Panhandle Transit District:

 Service areas will be maintained to assure each county receives adequate transportation services. Counties within a local service area shall establish inter-local agreement and provide at least one elected representative to serve on

District Board of Directors. 2. The Board of the Panhandle Transportation District shall select a Chairperson. The transit district Chairperson shall serve as the liaison between the District and the Panhandle Community Services Board of Directors.

3. Panhandle Community Services will serve as the administrative structure to engage in contracts or agreements on behalf of the Panhandle Transit District. As the administrative structure, Panhandle Community Services will serve as the responsible grantee/contractor for all funds from the Texas Department of Transportation or the Federal Transit Administration for public transdistrict activities.

4. The Executive Director of Panhandle Community Services will have signatory authority for any and all agreements involving the Panhandle Transit District.
