Degrees Awarded M. Long & T. Hart

Degrees were officially conferred on 261 West Texas A&M University students during summer commencement exercises Aug. 16 at the WTAMU Event Center. The University awarded 175 baccalaureate and 86 master's degrees.
Graduates with an overall grade point average of 3.50 or higher were recognized as honor graduates and wore gold honor cords. The three levels of honor recognition are Summa Cum Laude (3.90-4.00), Magna Cum Laude (3.75-3.89) and Cum Laude (3.50-3.74). The class included two graduates with Summa Cum Laude honors, 12 students graduated with Magna Cum Laude honors and 19 earned Cum Laude honors.
The graduating class represented seven states and 50 Texas cities and towns.
Area graduates are: Wheeler, TX, Monty R. Long, Master of Business Administration, Business. Monty is the son of Mike and Ann Long of Wheeler, Texas; Shamrock, TX, Trey D. Hart, Bachelor of Arts, Criminal Justice. Trey is the son of Jim and Landi Hart and the grandson of Doug and Mia Robertson, all of Shamrock, Texas.
Attending the ceremonies in Trey's honor were his parents and grandparents, Lee Hart of San Angelo, Ed Hart of Decatur, and Joe Ed and Guin White of Amarillo.

Water District Sets Tax Rate For Area

At their meeting on September 3, Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District's Board of Directors set the 2003 tax rate at .0154/\$100 evaluation. This the same rate the District adopted last year, and will decrease revenues approximately \$30,000.
The District's general manager, C. E. Williams, said the final bill to property owners may vary from county to county because of differences in valuations. Property appraisals are made by the individual counties. The District includes all or parts of Armstrong, Carson, Donley, Gray, Hutchinson, Hemphill, Potter, Roberts, and Wheeler counties.
The Board also lowered the 2003-2004 budget by more than \$41,000.

Commissioner's Court Meeting Held; Contract With City of Shamrock Renewed

The Wheeler County Commissioners' Court met in regular session on Monday, September 22, 2003, at 10 a.m. in the courthouse annex at 410 S. Main St. in Wheeler.
Fifteen items were on the agenda.
The payment was approved for the hourly payroll and the county's bills; items number 1 and 2.
There was no action taken on the budget.
The commissioners were asked to consider changes in the orders on the courthouse restoration. No action was taken.
No action was taken on the burn ban, as there are areas in Wheeler County still considered to be dry.
A list of the fees of service by the Wheeler County Sheriff's Department was submitted with no changes requested. The fees and amounts were approved as submitted.
Johnny Rhodes, Shamrock City Manager, met with the commissioners to ask for the renewal of the contract with the City of Shamrock for dispatch services for police department and sheriff's office for 2003-2004. The contract was accepted and appears at the bottom of this story.
No action was taken by the commissioners on a policy for burial in the Lela Cemetery, a county cemetery. This is in precinct 3.
Item number nine ask the commissioners to consider determining which roads in Wheeler County are county roads according to HB1117. The court decided to publish a map showing county roads. By advertising and hearing objections, they can obtain a title to all county roads. This action is covered by HB258.
The commissioners voted to join the Panhandle Transit Authority. PTA furnished transportation to individuals unable to obtain other transportation.
County Treasurer Juana Benefield had four items on the agenda. She was given permission to open a checking account for retaining fees pertaining to courthouse restoration. It was also approved for her to open a checking account for Road and Bridge funds and transfer existing funds from General Fund. The third item was to request the commissioners to determine the miles of road in each precinct. The state maintains the county has 570 miles of county roads and the commissioners show 603 miles. The commission-

ers will look into straightening out the discrepancy; the miles of county roads determines the amount of money the county receives from the state.
The treasurer informed the commissioners of the \$52.93 increase in the cost per employee for insurance. The court voted to maintain the current insurance coverage and rate policies.
Robbie Robinson, Commissioner Pct. 4, informed the court of a request for the laying of a water line on County Road 23 and County Road W, east of Shamrock. The court requested the line be laid in the middle of the road and ask for a contract with Westfall Constructors, LTD to be approved by the court.

4-H Adult Leaders Honored At Meeting

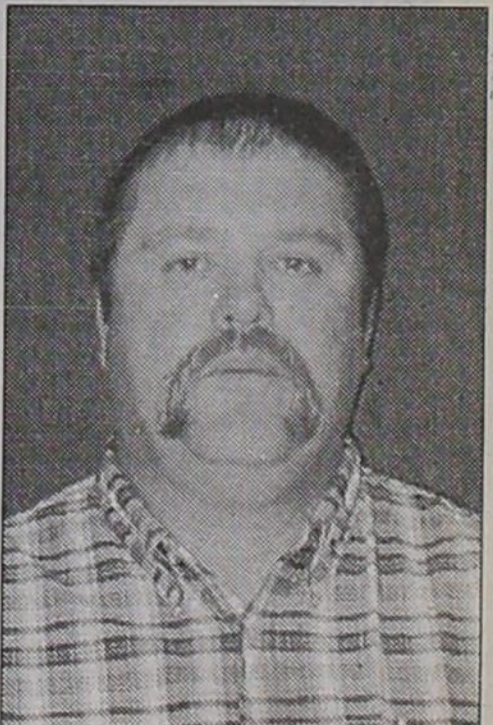
On Saturday, September 6, 2003, Julie Boydston and Kevin Meek of Wheeler County were among 40 adult volunteer leaders from 21 Texas Panhandle counties honored for their commitment and service by Texas Cooperative Extension's 4-H and Youth Development Program. Recognition ceremonies were held in conjunction with the group's annual Fall Leadership Forum at Bairfield Activity Center on the campus of Clarendon Junior College.
Julie has been instrumental in the growth of the Wheeler County Clothing Project. She found tables, small chairs and sewing machines for the youth to use. Julie instructed the youth how to stencil pillows, to make tea towels, and how to make a skirt with beaded fringe. She guided youth as young as 4 years of age to make a garment. The youth were thrilled to show off their work at a Model the Cure Fashion Show. Her dedication and enthusiasm to the growth of Wheeler County 4-H programs has increased youth participation by leaps and bounds.
Kevin and his family have been instrumental in the Wheeler County 4-H Program since Kevin joined Wheeler County 4-H as a youth. As a teen leader he helped organize trail rides and assisted with all of the livestock projects. More recently, Kevin has been the key to the swine program in Wheeler County 4-H. He is called upon regularly to assist with swine projects and supervises the Wheeler County 4-H Swine Projects at the major Livestock Shows. Without Kevin's Leadership, Wheeler County 4-H would not have a swine project.
"In this area, more than 5,300 volunteers are working with local Extension agents and specialists to serve Panhandle youth," said Pam Foster, who assumed the regional management of 4-H and youth education programs, effective Sept. 1.
In the Panhandle alone, adult volunteers are working closely with county agents and specialists to deliver quality educational pro-

grams and skills development training to some 25,000 4-H members.

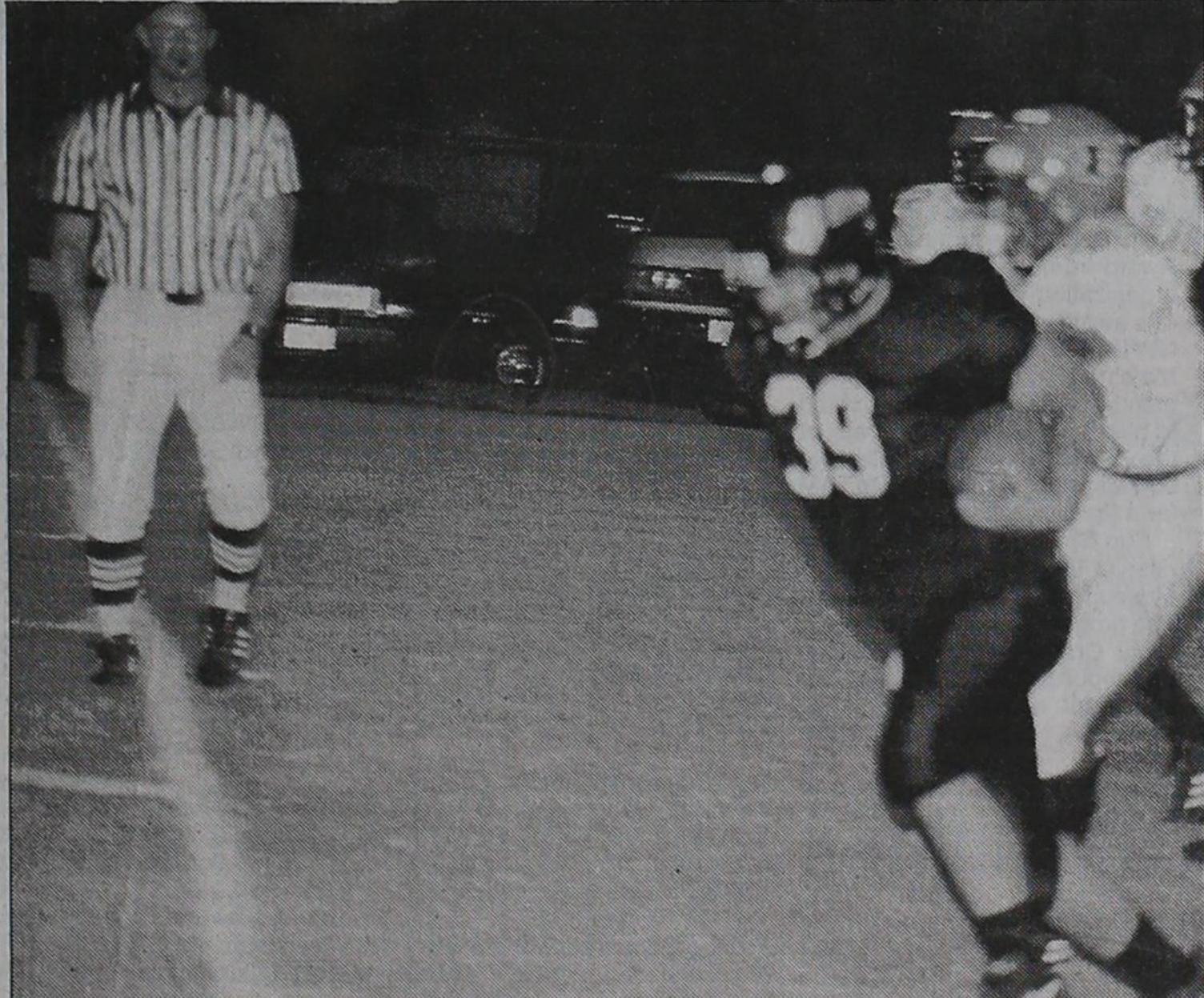

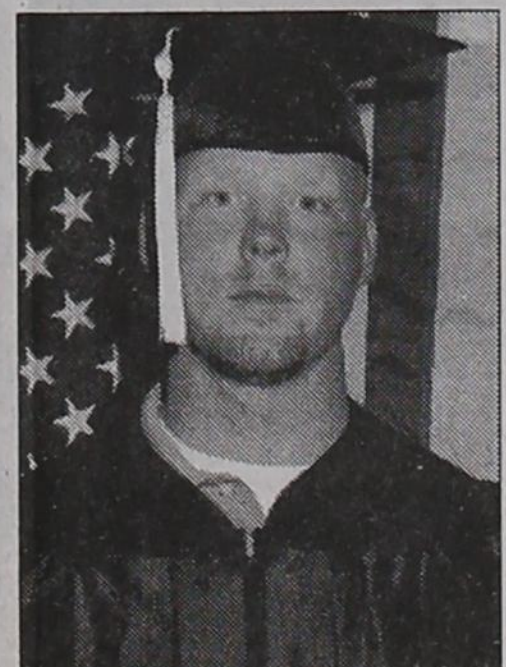

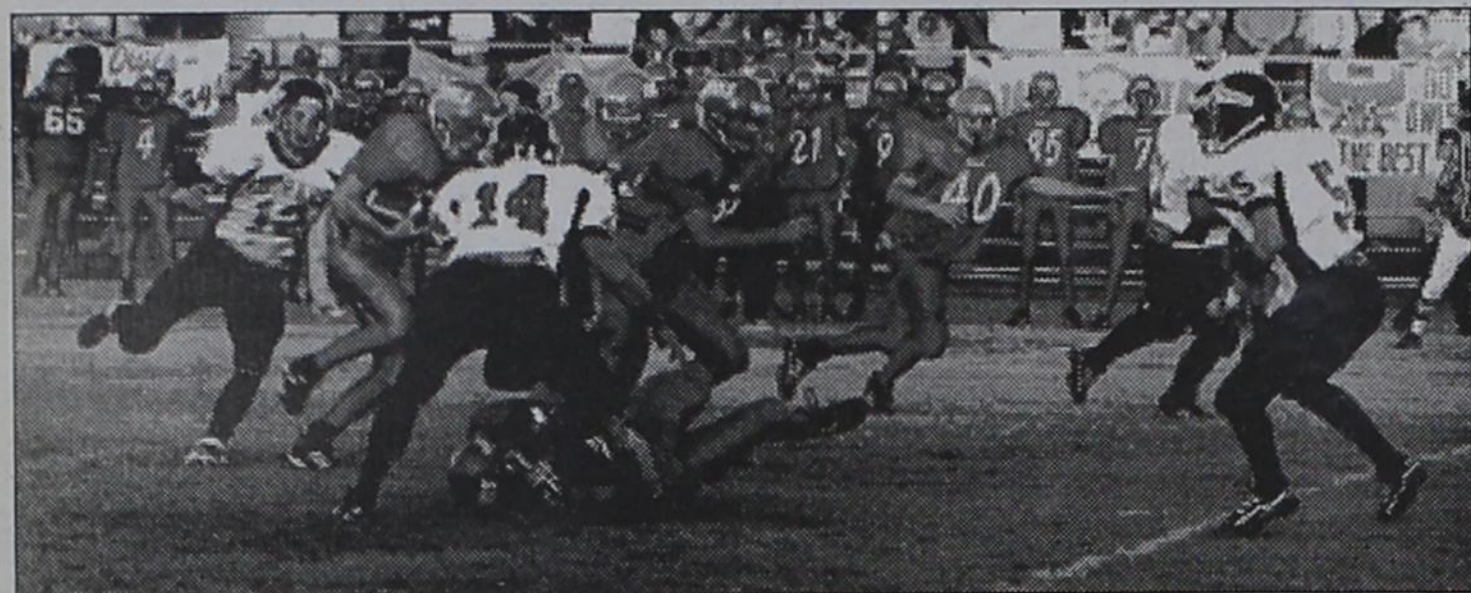

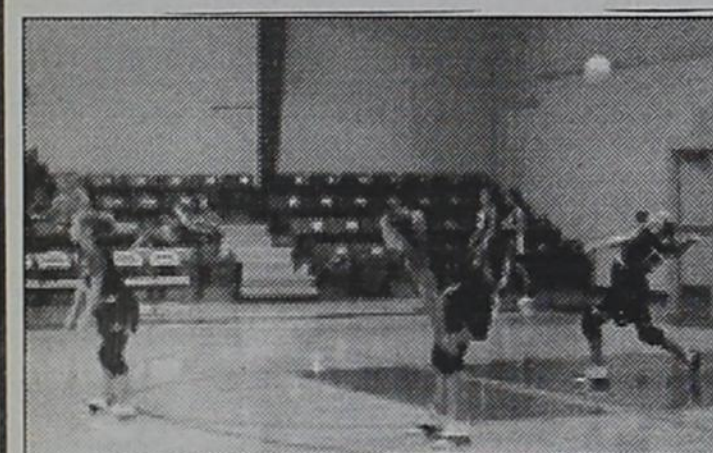
George Helton, Ft. Elliott's #21, brings down a Silverton Owl.



Blaine Baker, #34, listens to instruction from Coach Curtis Smith.



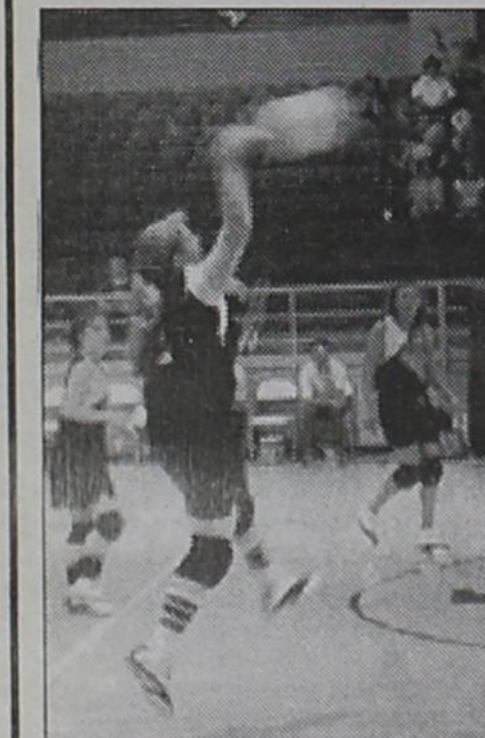

Mayci Meadows serves the ball in the Junior High game against Childress. Also shown are Lauren Baird and Megan Horn.



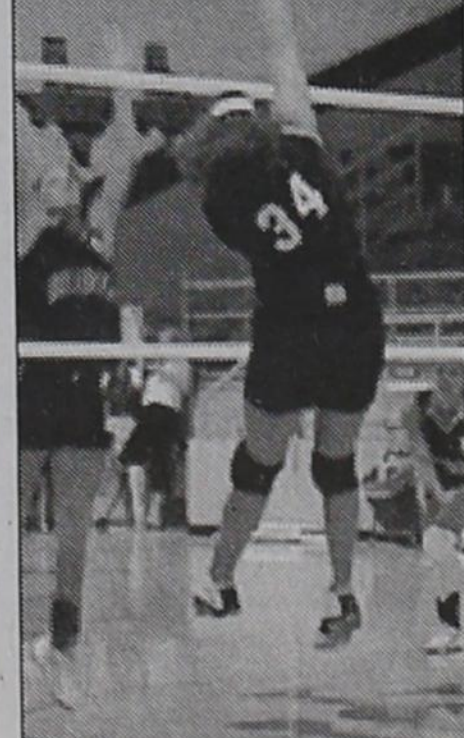
Megan Horn returns the ball in the Junior High game against Childress Sept. 15. Also shown are Megan Keelin and Jordan Alls.

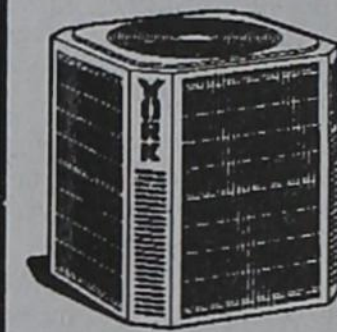

The fellowship hall (behind the church building) will by no means resemble or operate like the Dillard's at the mall or even a Wal-Mart. But if you have a need, we can help.

Last week I printed part of a passage from Matthew 25 in which Jesus tells a parable, separating the "sheep" from the "goats." It is the king speaking and congratulating those who did such kind things for him, such as feeding him when he was hungry, giving him a drink when he was thirsty, out in the

cold and given a place to stay, he was sick or in prison and you payed him a visit. Plus one more thing "I needed clothes and you clothed me" (v. 26). The startled person who is being honored by the king does not ever remember having done those things for the great and powerful king, but that is when the king offers the kicker to this story in verse 40: "I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me." Jesus tells us that when we help others, we are helping the Lord. Another passage we should consider is Hebrews 13:1-2: "Keep on loving each other as brothers. Do not forget to entertain strangers, for by so doing some people have entertained angels without knowing it." When we do good things for other people, we are exhibiting the same behaviors that we would for our Lord.

So the question for us now is, what will we do for each other? What will we do for the Lord? The answer is the same for both.

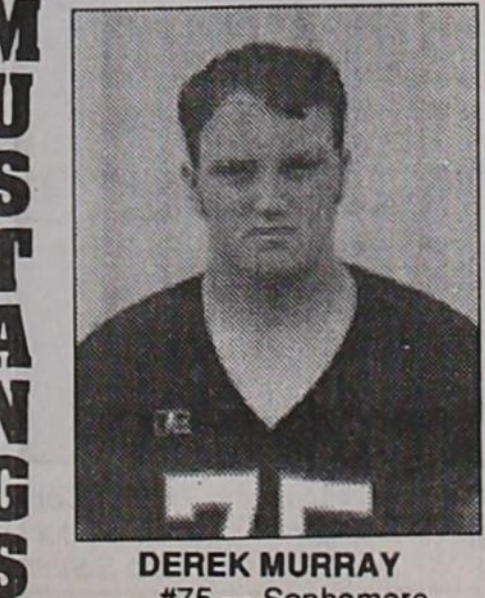

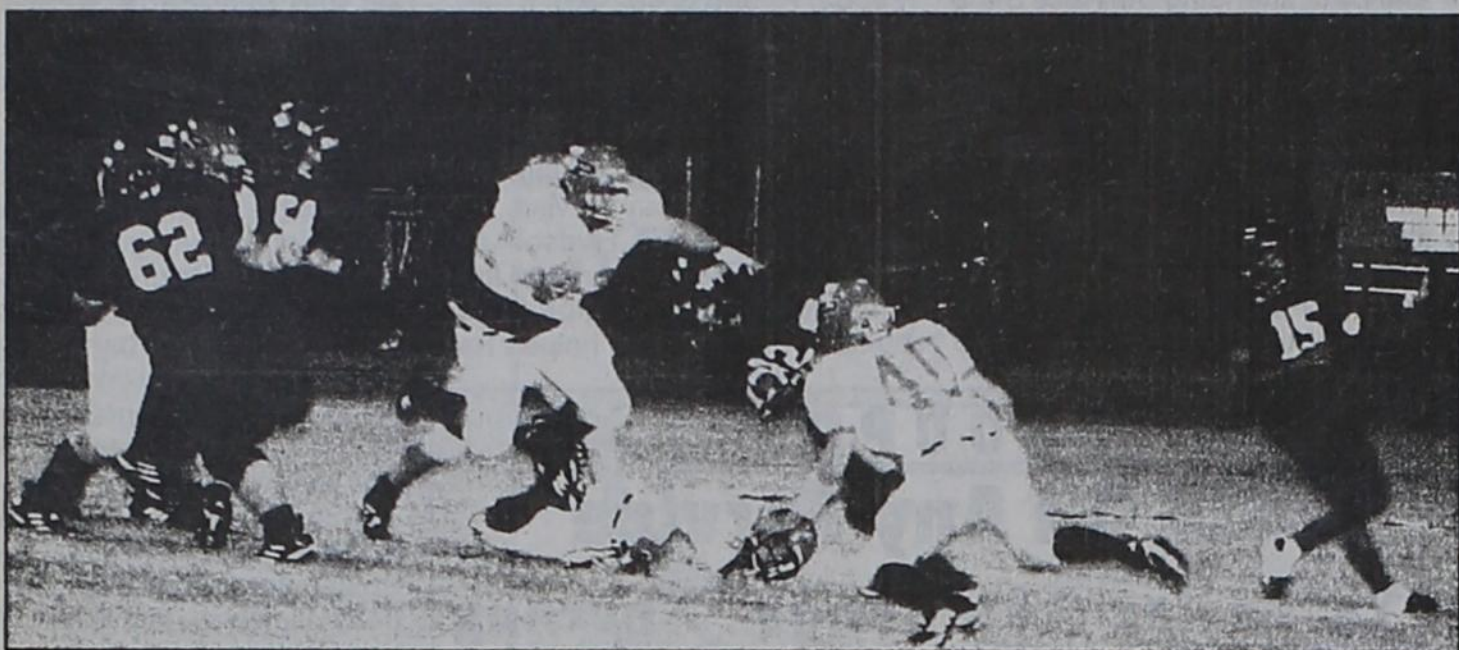

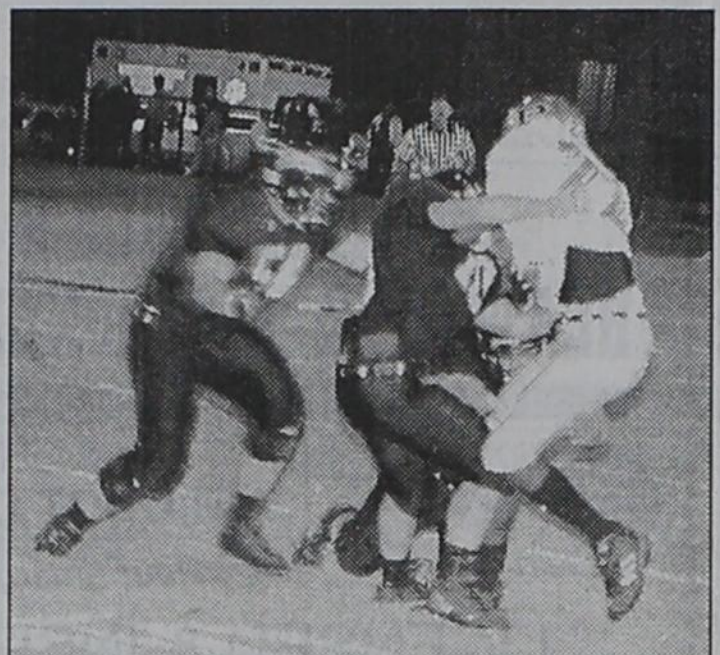

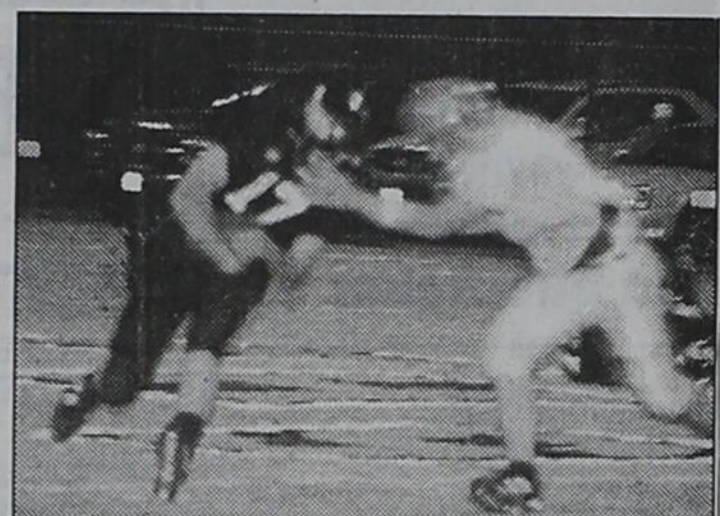

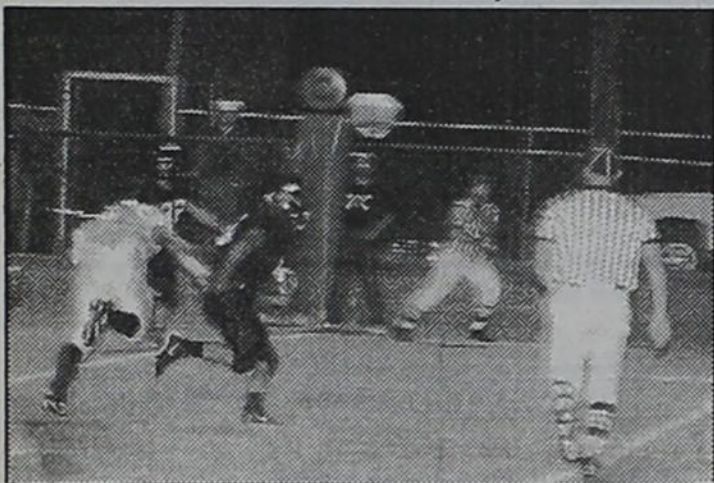

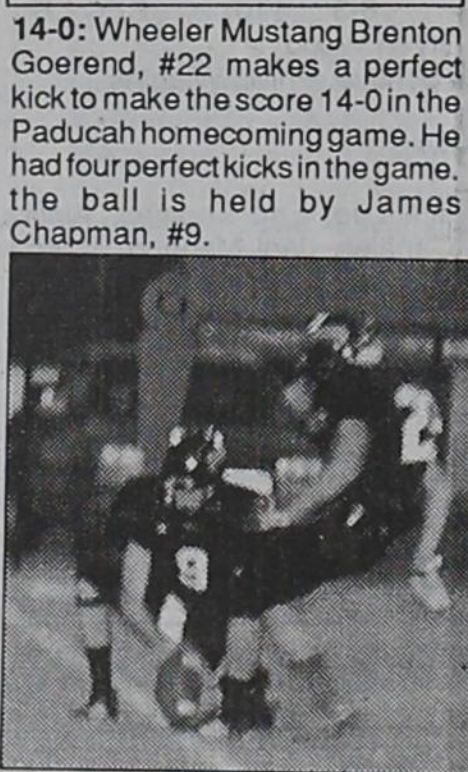

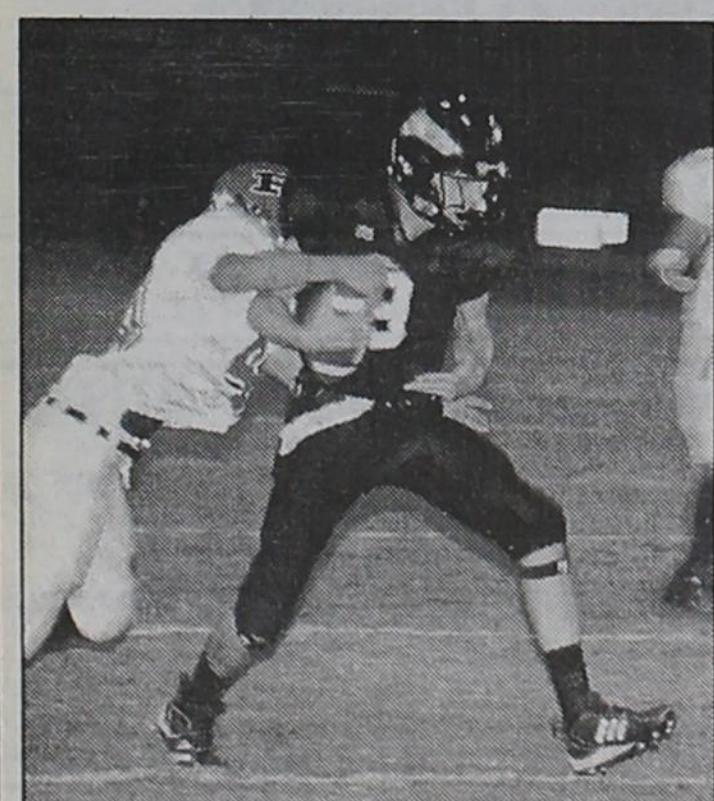

 Whipped topping, optional

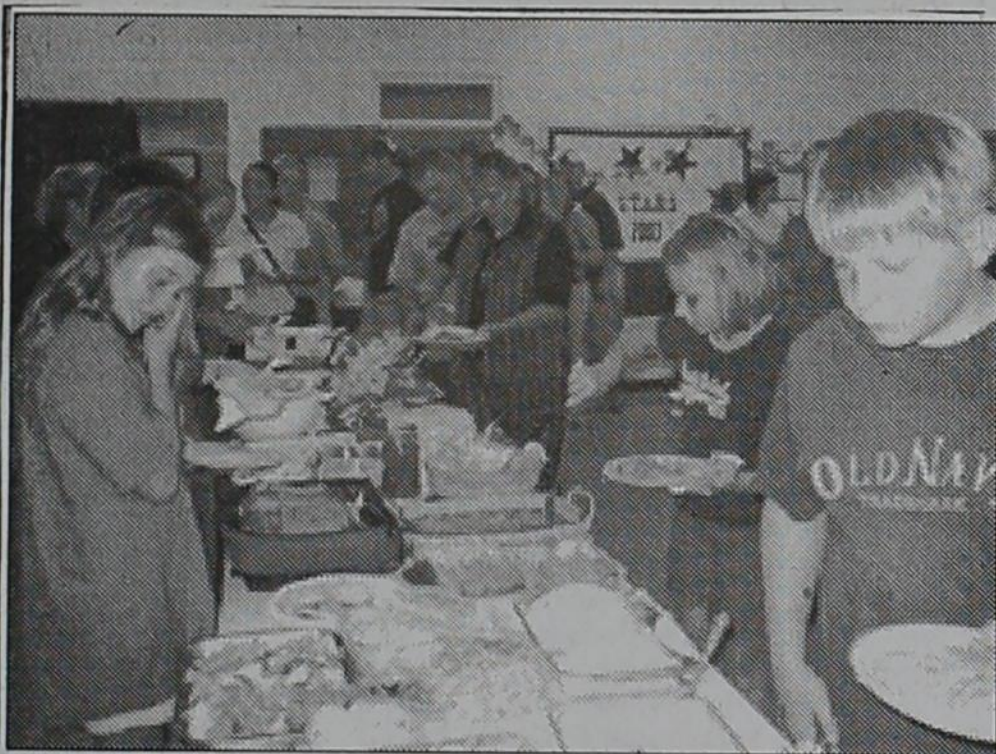

Many residents have been noticing and complaining to the City of Wheeler elected officials of the junked vehicles sitting around town, the grass and weeds grown up around vacant houses, and houses that are unsafe and provide areas for illegal activities, therefore, we feel action must be taken to correct these matters.

We also have residents not abiding with Ordinance No. 92, which regulates the size of pens for keeping livestock in the City.

If any of the things mentioned above pertain to you or your property, we request that you please take care of the matter in a timely manner. Enclosed are copies of Ordinances concerning these problems, and the actions that will be taken if not corrected.

Things gradually build up without us even noticing, but let's restore the pride that has long been synonymous with Wheeler.

The City of Wheeler Elected Officials and Employees City Code

Art. 2. Junked Vehicle Ordinance

Note: For state law relating to junked vehicles, see VACS art. 6701d-11.

Sec. 10-21. Brief title. This article shall be known and cited as the "Junked Vehicle Ordinance".

Sec. 10-22. Definitions. As used herein:

(1) The term "junked vehicle" means any motor vehicle as defined in Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, art. 6701d-11, § 1, as amended, which is inoperative and which does not have lawfully affixed thereto both an unexpired license plate or plates and a valid motor vehicle safety inspection certificate and which is either wrecked, dismantled, partially dismantled or discarded.

(2) The word "demolisher" means any person whose business is to convert a motor vehicle into processed scrap or scrap metal, or otherwise to wreck or dismantle motor vehicles.

(3) The term "motor vehicle" means any motor vehicle subject to registration pursuant to the Texas Certificate of Title Act.

(4) The term "antique auto" means passenger cars or trucks that were manufactured in 1925 or before, or which become 35 or more years old.

(5) The term "special-interest vehicle" means a motor vehicle of any age which has not been altered or modified from original manufacturer's specifications and, because of its historic interest, is being preserved by hobbyists.

(6) The term "collector" means the owner of one or more antique or special-interest vehicles who collects, purchases, acquires, trades, or disposes of special-interest or antique vehicles or parts of them for his own use in order to restore, preserve, and maintain an antique or special-interest vehicle for historic interest.

Sec. 10-23. Declared public nuisances.

The City Council hereby finds that "junked vehicles", as defined above, which are located in any place where they are visible from a public place or public right-of-way are detrimental to the safety and welfare of the general public, tending to reduce the value of private property, to invite vandalism, to create fire hazards, to constitute an attractive nuisance creating a hazard to the health and safety of minors, and are detrimental to the economic welfare of the City of Wheeler, Texas, by producing urban blight which is adverse to the maintenance and continuing development of the City; and any such vehicle is, therefore, declared to be a public nuisance.

Sec. 10-24. Chief of Police to give notice.

(a) The Chief of Police of the City of Wheeler, Texas, upon noticing or having brought to his attention that a nuisance exists, as defined above, within the City, either upon private property or public property or on a public right-of-way, shall give or cause to be given to the owner or occupant of such private or public property, or to the owner or occupant of the premises adjacent to the public right-of-way whereupon such public nuisance exists, a written notice stating the nature of the public

nuisance and that same must be removed and abated within ten (10) days.

ORDINANCE NO. 92 AN ORDINANCE REGULATING SIZE OF PENS FOR KEEPING LIVESTOCK IN CITY LIMITS

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WHEELER, COUNTY TEXAS:

That for the safety, welfare

and protection of the public no one be allowed to keep livestock in the City limits of the City of Wheeler unless a pen of the size of 22,500 square feet is used, pre animal.

The fact that the necessity of the passing of this ordinance creates an emergency, the rule requiring three readings of this ordinance is hereby suspended. PASSED AND APPROVED this 26 day of January, 1976.

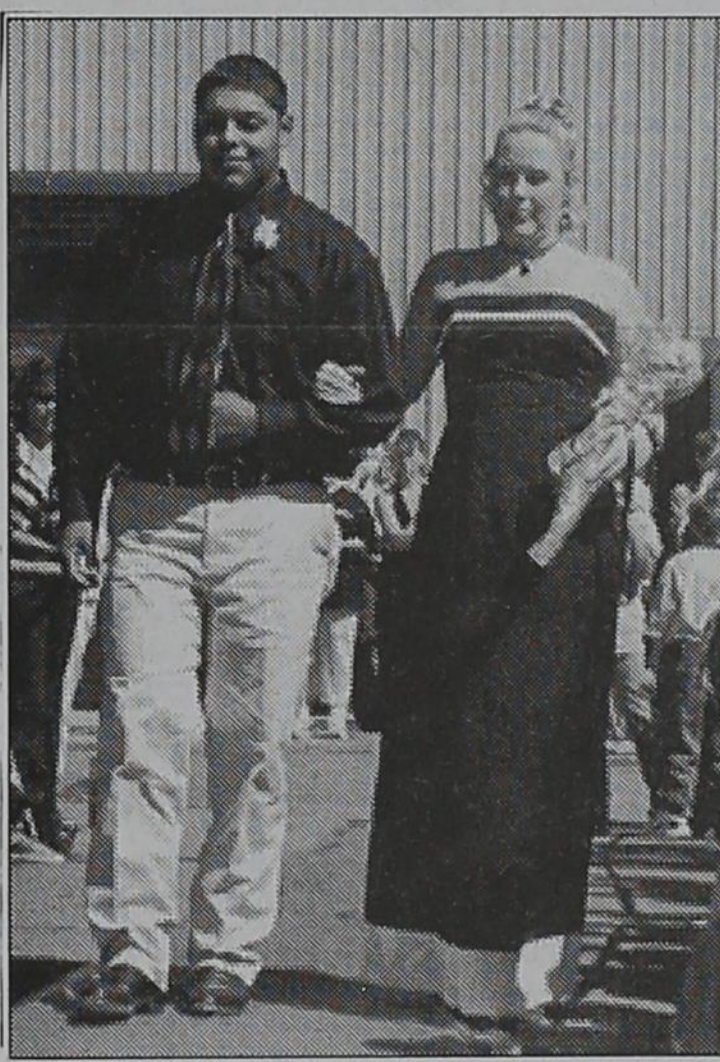

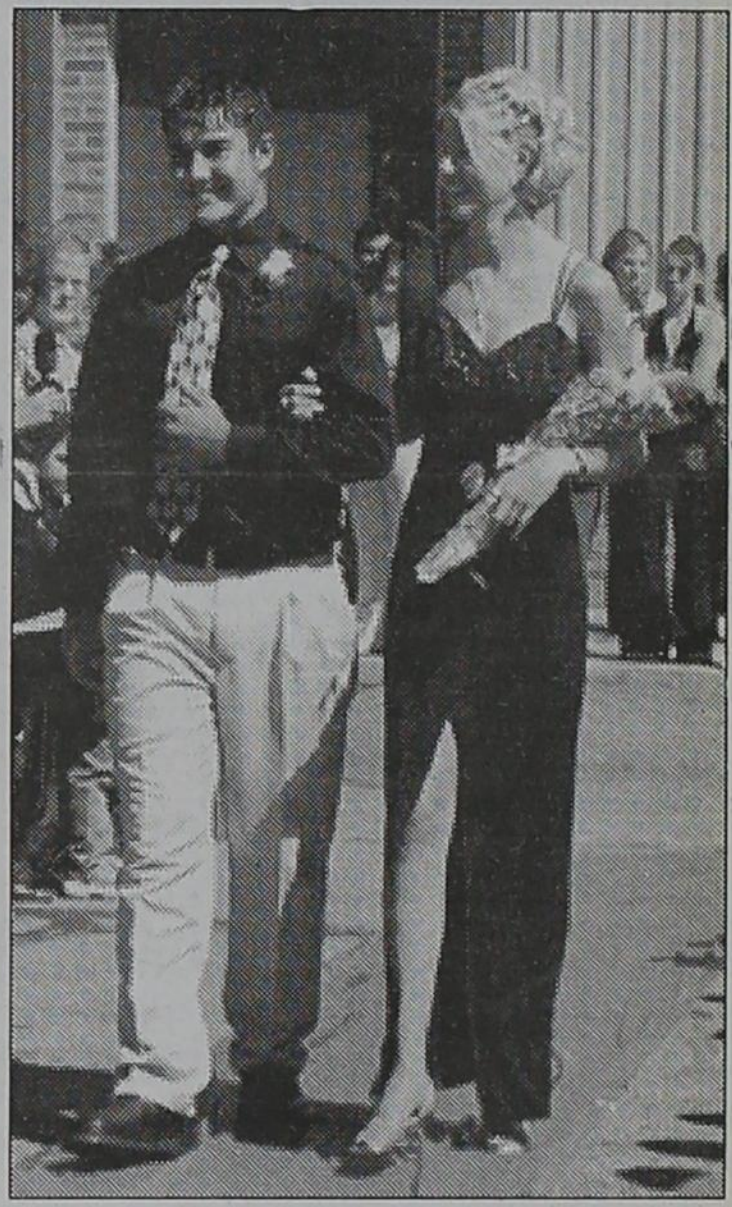

SECTION VI

The County shall pay into the City, fifty percent (50%) of all personnel services along with fifty percent (50%) of telephone and teletype expenses, such combined expense not to exceed \$49,760.00 (personnel - \$43,760.00; communications - \$6,000.00), without prior approval of the County, as billed by the City on a monthly basis.

SECTION VII

The County shall provide housing for the dispatch system and shall be responsible for all utilities with the exception of telephone service. All long distance calls shall be paid for by the department responsible for making the calls. Each party hereto shall be responsible for fifty percent (50%) of the base telephone and teletype charges. The City shall be responsible for insuring the communications equipment of the dispatch system.

SECTION VIII

This contractual agreement shall be for a period of one year beginning October 1, 2003 and ending September 30, 2004. At or before the end of such period, the Parties hereto shall meet together for the purpose of renegotiating a similar contract for the ensuing year. This contract may be terminated by either of the parties with such termination to be effective not less than thirty (30) days from date of such written notice.

PANHANDLE TRANSIT DISTRICT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, on the 22nd day of September, 2003, a duly called meeting of the Commissioners' Court for Wheeler County was held in the City of Wheeler, Texas; and WHEREAS, a quorum of the Commissioners' Court was present, and

WHEREAS, Panhandle Community Services, a community based non-profit organization has served as a rural public transportation provider and provided coordinated rural public transportation services in the counties of Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collingsworth, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Donley, Gray, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, rural Potter, rural Randall, Roberts, Sherman, Swisher, and Wheeler, and

WHEREAS, Panhandle Community Services has been providing public transportation services for these counties since before September 1, 1995, and in so doing, received public transportation funds from the Texas Department of Transportation and the Federal Transportation Administration, or the administrations' successor; and

WHEREAS, by virtue of Chapter 458 of the Transportation Code of the State of Texas, PCS is a "Rural Public Transportation Provider" and

WHEREAS, the 26 counties of the Panhandle is a Rural Transit District as defined in said Chapter 458; and

WHEREAS, the Panhandle Community Services Board of Directors recognize the need to establish a governing body for the public transportation district in accordance with the applicable laws in order that the rural transportation district may conduct business as a Rural Transit Provider; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the residents of Wheeler County to formally unite with residents of neighboring counties and establish a service area within the Panhandle Transit District, hereinafter referred to as the "District" in order that the District may continue to provide transportation services in accordance with the guidance of TXDOT for implementation of Chapter 458 of the Transportation Code of the State of Texas.

WHEREAS, BE IT RESOLVED that Wheeler County wishes to join and be recognized as a member of the Panhandle

Transit District.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in joining the Panhandle Transit District, the Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County is in agreement with the following aspects of the Panhandle Transit District:

1. Service areas will be maintained to assure each county receives adequate transportation services. Counties within a local service area shall establish an inter-local agreement and provide at least one elected representative to serve on the District Board of Directors.

2. The Board of the Panhandle Transportation District shall select a Chairperson. The transit district Chairperson shall serve as the liaison between the District and the Panhandle Community Services Board of Directors.

3. Panhandle Community Services will serve as the administrative structure to engage in contracts or agreements on behalf of the Panhandle Transit District. As the administrative structure, Panhandle Community Services will serve as the responsible grantee/contractor for all funds from the Texas Department of Transportation or the Federal Transit Administration for public transportation district activities.

4. The Executive Director of Panhandle Community Services will have signatory authority for any and all agreements involving the Panhandle Transit District.

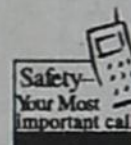
