

Take Time To Smell The Flowers



PGCD Remands Proposed 1.25%

The Board of Directors of the Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District Wednesday, May 26, 2004, remanded to the rules committee a proposed decline limit of 1.25 percent a year for the Ogallala Aquifer.

Board members said they wanted to carefully consider all the comments made at the public hearing and ensure that water users clearly understand the rule remifications.

The limit proposal is part of a newly proposed Rule 16 intended to implement the District's goal of preserving 50 percent of the groundwater in 50 years time.

In other business the District approved 113 Initial Production Permits and 4 single well production permits. The district also approved one Agricultural Conservation Equipment Loan.










Calf scramble at Ft. Elliott Ag Day at the elementary campus.




