Tex. Water Develop. **Gives PGWCD Grant**

The Texas Water Development Board recently approved financial assistance in the amount of \$300,000 to the Panhandle Groundwater Conservation District to purchase approved agricultural water conservation equipment. The funds were made available through the TWDB's Agriculture Water Conservation Loan Pro-

Under this program, the TWDB can make loans to lender districts such as PGCD. In turn, the lender districts make loans to individual borrowers (farmers, ranchers, etc.) to purchase and install more efficient irrigation equipment on private property.

The District will utilize these funds to make loans to individual borrowers for purchase of center pivot irrigation systems.

"We are very pleased to receive this loan,' said PGCD General Manager C. E. Williams. "We are moving from furrow to center pivot irrigation and are seeing a great increase in water, efficiency.

Interest on the individual loans will be 2.05%, with 20% down. For more information, or to receive a loan application, contact the PGCD office, 201 W. Third Street, White Deer, Texas, 806/883-2501.

Although we are nearing the completion of our Wednesday night series on the Twelve Apostles, we have noticed a very unique and diverse group that Jesus chose to be closest to him during his ministry. Some of this number we know a lot about while others we know virtually nothing about. There are some details that can be found in extra-biblical materials that may or may not be accurate, but let me toss out a few things

that can be found in the Bible. Peter and Andrew were brothers who were fishermen, just like James and John. Andrew was responsible for bringing Peter first to Jesus (John 1:35-42). Philip came from the same area as Peter and Andrew (John 1:43-45) and based on the amount of other passages in which Philip and Andrew are paired together, I imagine they had been good friends before their apostle days. Philip intro-(probably also known as Bartholemew) to Jesus in John

1:46-51. Matthew had been a tax collector, but he immediately responded to the invitation from Jesus to follow him (Matthew 9:9-13) We don't know how the other apostles were chosen, but including the ones already mentioned, they are Thomas, another man named James, Thaddeus, Simon, and Judas Iscariot.

A few other things that do jump to mind with these men are the brashness of Peter in speaking his mind when he probably should have just stayed quiet. The desire to bring down fire upon the Samaritans who had rejected Jesus by James and John in Luke 9:51-56. The discussion Jesus has with Philip and Andrew about how they would feed a crowd of 5,000 and they eventually brought forth a little boy with a sack lunch (John 6:1-15).
