Commissioner's Court Monday; Courthouse Completion In July

The Wheeler County Commissioner's Court met in regular session on Monday, May 24, 2004, in the courthouse annex at 410 S. Main Street, Wheeler, Texas. Nine items on the agenda.

The commissioners voted to approve the hourly payroll time sheets as presented.

The bills presented for payment were paid.

No action was taken on the budget.

The courthouse renovation was the subject of item 4. The court voted to not cave in the septic tank

on the courthouse lawn. They were not sure it would be cost effective. Remeasuring of the tank, shows it is not as large as first reported, due to the thick walls. Plugs will be purchased to fill the holes in the tank and it will be available, if at some time a use is found for it.

Completion date for the courthouse will be an estimated 31 days from Monday's meeting. When the work is complete the lawn will be ready to sod.

The commissioners voted to reinstate the burn ban.

a. Remove section regarding tenure pay increases. Replace with an Annual cost of living increase perhaps 2% per year. If merit increase is to stay in the hand book recommend that department heads, with administrative approval, be allowed to give raises based on performance evaluations.

b. Change to read, "5 days off with pay in the event of a death of the employee's immediate family." Immediate family is defined as spouse, child, father & mother. "3 days off with pay in the event of a death in the employee's other family." Other family defined as sister, brother, grandparents, grandchildren, aunts, uncles or any individuals who have acquired these family relationships through marriage.

c. Appearance and Dress - leave as is but add, "no one shall be permitted to wear rubber flip-flops.

d. If an employee uses three or more scheduled consecutive days of sick leave, supervisor shall have the right to require a physician's statement or some other acceptable means of documentation of injury or illness.

e. Page 26 item #2 delete and add addendum approved August 1, 2002 that employees may use 5 of their sick days for family sickness per calendar year.

f. Sick Leave: If it is not possible to leave the accrued sick days at 120 working day, request that 65 working days be allowed. Recommend that the seven employees who have accrued over 65 days be allowed to keep those days. These employees will not accrue additional days until they fall below the 65 days. Also recommend that employees be able to "give" accrued days to fellow employees with a catastrophic illness if they use up their own sick days.

g. Request an additional paid holiday for the employee's birthday to be taken on the birthday or the following Friday.

Chairman Tipps thanked the Committee for their work. After some discussion among the Board members, consensus was to postpone any decisions regarding this until June or July.

4. Presentation Regarding Audit Services from Parrish, Moody and Fikes, Waco, Texas

ORDER PROHIBITING OUTDOOR BURNING

On this 24th day of May, 2004, the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in Regular Session, and found that circumstances present in all the unincorporated area of Wheeler County, Texas, create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning therefore.

The Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas, by this Order, hereby prohibits outdoor burning in all of the unincorporated area in Wheeler County, Texas. This burn ban takes effect **May 27, 2004**, and will terminate **August 27, 2004**. Ninety (90) days from that date.

A person who violates this prohibition will be charged with a Class C misdemeanor pursuant to Section 240.906 of the Texas Local Government Code.

Money Available For Rural Development

Funding will Create or Save Over 2,000 Rural Jobs/189 Rural Business Ventures

TEMPLE, TEXAS, April 22, 2004 - Agriculture Secretary Ann M. Veneman today announced that \$15.5 million will be invested in 24 organizations in 16 states and the Virgin Islands for business development and job creation. 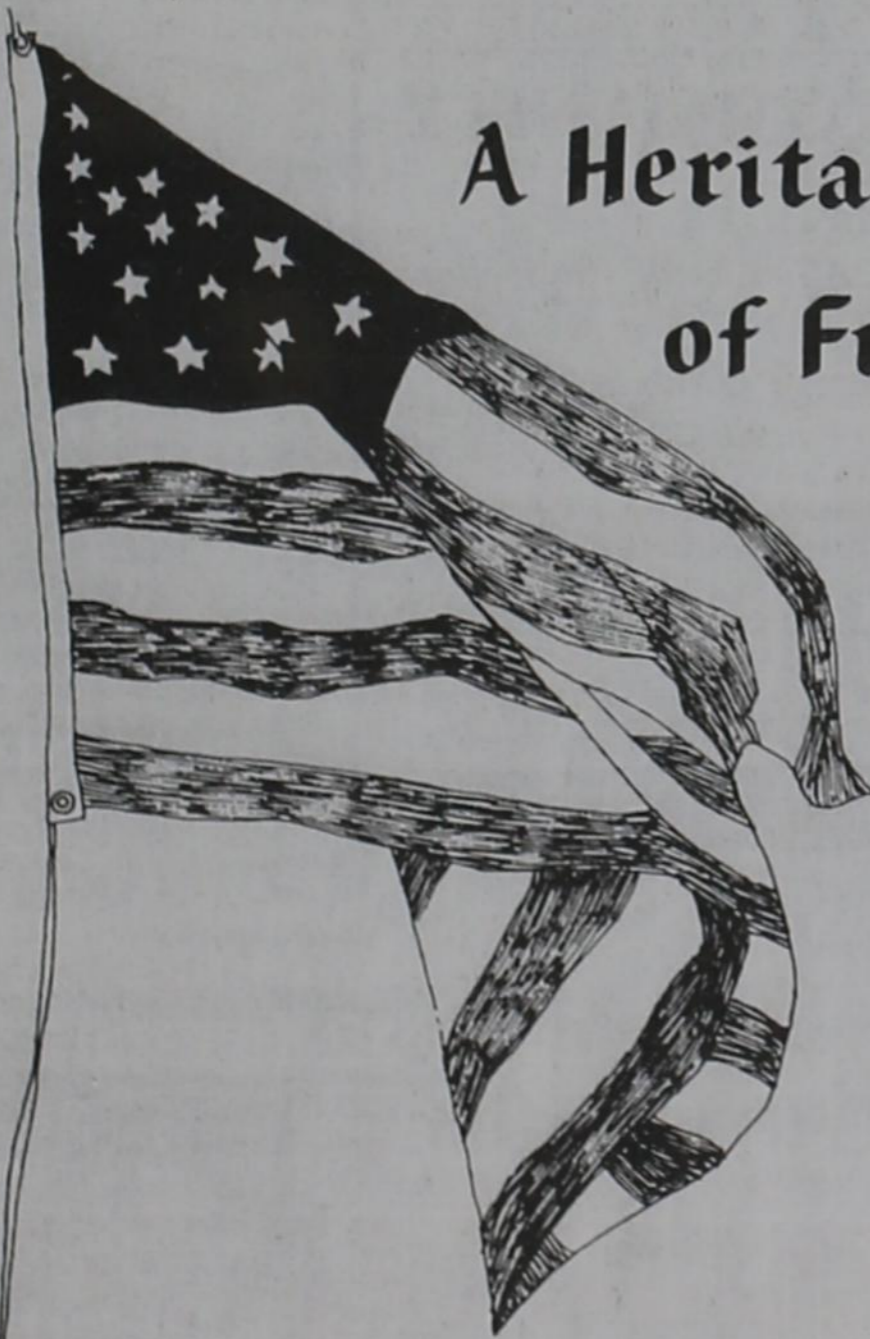

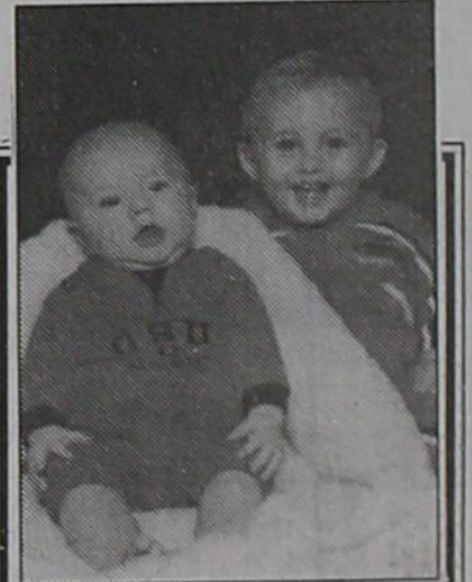
