Wheeler The Commissioner's Court met in regular session on Monday, May 24, 2004, in the courthouse annex at 410 S. Main Street, Wheeler, Texas. Nine items on the agenda. The commissioners voted to

approve the hourly payroll time sheets as presented.

The bills presented for payment were paid. No action was taken on the bud-

get. The courthouse renovation was the subject of item 4. The court voted to not cave in the septic tank

and got cold water on her face. At least it didn't blister and won't scar. But the rest is pretty puffy. Keep Melie in your prayers. Bless her heart.


Our sympathy to the family and friends of Neta Evans. She will be greatly missed. She was guite a lady!


I met a very nice young man at Dr. Chaffins's office Monday. Matt Wright does the echo-grams for doctors Chaffin, Slatton and Osborne.

ORDER PROHIBITING OUTDOOR BURNING

On this 24th day of May, 2004, the Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in Regular Session, and found that circumstances present in all the unincorporated area of Wheeler County, Texas, create a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning therefore.

The Commissioners Court of Wheeler County, Texas, by this Order, hereby prohibits outdoor burning in all of the unincorporated area in Wheeler County, Texas, This burn ban takes effect May 27, 2004, and will terminate August 27, 2004, Ninety (90) days from that date.

A person who violates this prohibition will be charged with a Class C misdemeanor pursuant to Section 240.906 of the Texas Local Government Code.






