



SPS confirms no agreements have been reached.

W.R. Esler, SPS chairman of the board and chief executive officer, said, "We are interested in acquiring certain of the electric utility assets of PNM. Our service territories can be integrated easily, and the acquisition should be of benefit to the ratepayers and stockholders if an agreement can be reached on appropriate terms." SPS primarily provides electric service to a population of about one million in a 52,000-square-mile area of eastern and southeastern New Mexico, the South Plains and Panhandle of Texas, the Oklahoma Panhandle and Southwestern Kansas.
