Maybe you have heard about the teacher who sent a note home with a boy who was in her fourth grade class. The note read: "Joey excels in initiative, group interaction, responsiveness, and activity participation. Now if he would only learn to read and write."

This teacher apparently believed that education should be pragmatic. She believed that education should be objectively demonstrated.

It is my conviction that Christianity should have the same characteristic. The New Testament does not describe Christianity as a faith that consists of platitudes like, "Something good is going to happen to you" or "God loves you and so do I." Rather it is described as a pragmatic faith that is objectively demonstrated.

Such a description of Christianity is emphasized in several New Testament tests. But it is strongly emphasized in the letter that James, the brother of Jesus, wrote. For example, in the first chapter he wrote: "...Prove yourselves doers of the word and not merely hearers who delude themselves." (James 1:22) Ac-

cording to this text, Christianity does not merely consist of hearing biblical truths. Rather it consists of the objective demonstration of these truths.

Then in the second chapter, he wrote: "What use is it, my brethren, if a man says he has faith, but he has no works? Can that faith save him?" According to this text, Christianity does not merely consist of Biblical truths that are spoken. These truths can be emphatically, eloquently, and dogmatically spoken, but before they constitute Christianity these truths must be objectively demonstrated.

From these tests, it is apparent that the New Testament makes a clear-cut distinction between a profession of Christianity and a possession of Christianity. A profession of Christianity is characterized by words. But a possession is characterized by actions.

Do not be content with a profession of Christianity. I challenge you to have a possession of Christianity which is objectively demonstrated in every aspect of your life.

**CHRISTMAS FIRE SAFETY**

**TREES:** Shop carefully when buying an artificial tree (plastic). Some plastic trees burn with extreme vigor. Buy a tree that has been tested for fire safety.

Do not rely on chemical coatings or sprays to make your live evergreen flame-resistant. Follow the safety rules below when shopping for a natural tree.

A fresh tree will stay green longer and be less of a fire hazard than a dry tree. To check for freshness remember: Check for color and scent. A fresh tree is deep green in color and has a strong scent of pine. Be sure that the needles do not readily fall from the tree. The trunk butt of a fresh tree should be sticky with sap. Place your Christmas tree in a location away from fireplace, radiator, or other heat vent or source. Be sure that it is out of the traffic pattern and does not block the doorway.

Cut off about one to two inches of the trunk. Mount trees in a sturdy, water holding stand with wide-spread

legs. Be sure that the tree is stable.

Fill base holder with water. Keep it full of water while the tree is indoors. Should the water stand become dry the tree trunk will seal over and will no longer take in water unless a new fresh cut is made. Remember, heated rooms dry trees out rapidly; and a dry tree is a fire hazard.

**TRIMMINGS:** The trimming of your Christmas tree is very important part of your holiday festivities. Keep the safety of your family in mind when selecting trimmings and decorating your tree.

When buying new holiday lights, look for those carrying the UL label stating that they have been checked for safety by Underwriters' Laboratories. Make sure any lights used outside are clearly marked as safe for outdoor use.

Check each strand of your old lights, looking for frayed or bare wires, loose connections, and cracked sockets. don't connect more than 200 small or 50 large bulbs to make one strand, and never plug a strand of more than three sets of lights into one extension cord. As an extra precaution, don't connect sets of large and miniature bulbs to make one strand. Using small twinkle lights instead of larger, hotter lights will help your tree last longer.

Because lights generate heat, never allow bulbs to come in direct contact with tree branches, greenery, draperies, or other potentially flammable materials. And never leave your house or go to bed without safely disconnecting the lights by pulling out the plug, not tugging on the cord.

When choosing other finishing touches for the tree, purchase tinsel or artificial icicles of a non-leaded material. Leaded materials may be hazardous if eaten by children or pets.

If youngsters are a part of your family, take special care to: Avoid any decorations that tend to break easily, or have sharp edges. Keep tree trimmings that are small or have removable parts out of the reach of your child. These pieces may be swallowed. **HAVE A SAFE HOLIDAY!**

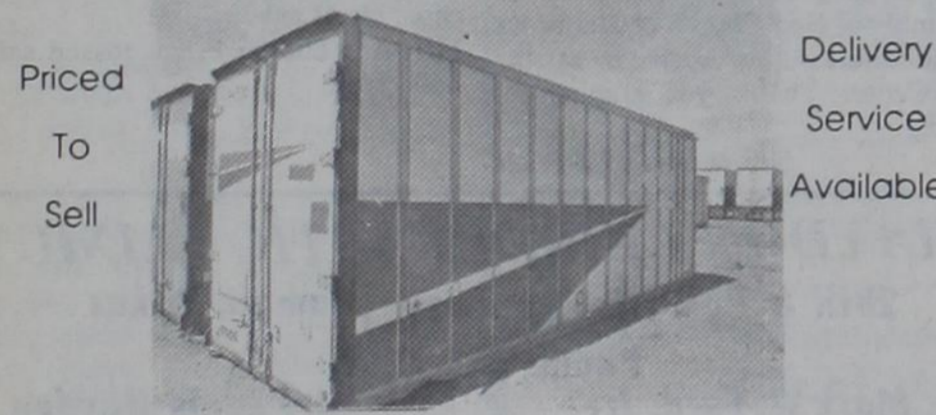
Dear Editor:
