One Dead, One Injured In Shooting

Keith Leon McLaughlin, 46, died early Monday morning as the result of gun shot which severed the femoral artery in the upper thigh. McLaughlin died shortly after arrival by ambulance at Parkview Hospital.

The situation is being investigated by the Wheeler County Sheriff's Department under the direction of Sheriff Jimmy Adams.

A domestic quarrel led to the shooting. The incident occured at the victim's home, McLaughlin Ranch 5 miles northwest of Mobeetie. It has been 'Times' on the Monday before reported that two shots were fired, but it is not certain who fired first. The shooting took place shortly after midnight.

> Also injured in the shooting was the wife, Vickie McLaughlin, 37. She remains in Parkview Hospital in satisfactory condition. An autopsy was performed on the body in Amarillo.

> Funeral services for McLaughlin will be today, Thursday, June 7, 1990, at 2:30 P.M. at the First Baptist Church of Mobeetie. Rev. Ralph Hovey, pastor will officiate.
