WHY A DOLLAR?

The Citizens of Wheeler have been asked to donate \$1.00 per month to assist the Wheeler Volunteer Fire Department in Fire Service Training. This voluntary donation will be on your monthly water bill from the City of Wheeler.

As State and Federal laws change, they necessitate changes in training requirements for local fire departments.

At this point in time the State Board of Insurance requires "Key-Rated" volunteer fire departments to have a minimum of 4 hours of fire service training per month. This training covers all phases of fire prevention and fire suppression. An additional minimum of eight hours per year of hazardous/ material training is required by the federal government. In the future, a given percentage of the fire department membership will be required to hold state certification as a "Basic Firefighter". This certification will require a mum of 162 hours of training in 27 subject areas. Certification training as well as training currently required will compound the need for training materials such as videos, slides, lesson plans, workbooks, handouts, etc.

Training materials are available from numerous sources, (I.E. National Fire Prevention Association, State Fire Marshals and Firefighters Association, International Fire Service Training Association) but they are expen-

This training is valuable for our present firefighters, but is even more important for future firefighters in this department.

All of the "dollars" go directly into a special fund administered by the department for training and specialized equipment only.

The Wheeler Volunteer Fire Department has 25 members, conducts training classes on the first, third and fifth Thursday of each month and donates approximately 3,000 hours per year to the fire protection and safety of the Wheeler Community. No member of the department receives personal compensation for his time involved in fire suppression, fire prevention, training, public educational programs, tours of department facilities and educational programs for youth, storm watch activities, maintenance of firefighting equipment/apparatus or assisting various county officials in emergency situations. In the above activities members furnish their own radios, vehicles and fuel.

From The Minister's Desk: In 1983 the Lubbock Avalanche-Journal contained an article about a bus company that was located in one of the eastern states. 




