WATCHTOWER

Amarillo Officials of the Watchtower Bible and Tract Society have revealed completion of plans for a series of 142 district conventions of Jehovah's Witnesses in the United States during the summer of 1990.

Spokesman Pat Shropshire said in Amarillo that 59 separate facilities would be used to accommodate 1,412,000 delegates expected for the four-day district convention meetings.

Shropshire said the convention program would be presented in nine languages. In addition to English they include: Spanish, Chinese, French, Greek, Italian, Japanese, Korean, and Portugese. Shropshire said 2,300 delegates

would represent the congregations from this area at the convention scheduled June 28 - July 1 at the Civic Center in Amarillo.

Speaking of language, shropshire said language has been a divisive factor for centuries.






The United States Achievement Academy announced today that Melissa Walker has been named a United States National Award winner in Foreign Language.


