

Five vehicles, including the Nissan were damaged in the chase, Adams said. One of the Wheeler County's vehicles, a Texas Cattle Raisers Association brand-inspector's vehicle, a private vehicle and a Texas Department of Public Safety vehicle were damaged. The engine on the DPS Mustang ex-

Adams said about 20 officers from several agencies were involved in the Wheeler County chase, including the Department of Public Safety, the Shamrock Police Department, the Wheeler County Sheriff's Department, the Shamrock constable and one brand inspector.

"It was a concentrated effort-it had to be," Adams said. "We had all the agencies around the east Texas Panhandle notified because of the way he had run, but he never did leave Wheeler

County after he got into Texas. Adams said shots were fired at the Nissan outside of Wheeler in order to try and disable the vehicle.

"We were trying to keep him from entering a populated area," he said. "We didn't want him killing a bunch of people in

One of the reasons the vehicle was finally stopped was because it was running low on fuel, Adams said.

When Steffan surrendered himself at the roadside park, no weapon was found, the sheriff

"Just the car-and that's deadly enough," he said.

The Adams County Sheriff Department in Colorado had two felony warrants for \$5,000 each on Steffan.
