The Commissioners' Court, still located in Mobeetie, designated School District 17 to become the Wheeler School District on August 8, 1907. A motion was made and carried to form District No. 17 out of the South end of School District No. 2.By August, many parents were asking that their children be transferred to the new school district.

While not much remains in the way of early newspapers or school records of the Wheeler school, the 1930 Wheeler Mustang Annual gives the most official account of the early days. The first teachers in the one room school building located on the Wheeler campus were Mrs. John T. Hilburn, Miss Frances Reynolds and Miss Dorothy Reynolds, daughters of the County Judge. In 1907 a four room concrete structure was erected, consisting of two stories.



On July 19, 1909 the County Commissioners met and the first item on the agenda was sale of the school house in Common District 17. Whether the school was sold or left on the property is a contradiction. Mrs. Porter reports that the structure was used for elementary classes for years to come. Helen Green Sabbe, Loyd Lee, Bill Owen and Max Wiley remembered starting to school in the building. The 1930 Mustang annual reported the superintendent's salary was \$75.00 in 1911 and students numbered 157. An increase was shown in the number of pupils the next year to 179. The Superintendent's salary was increased to \$100.00 and all assistants received \$60.00. In 1916 Wheeler High School received state aid and \$25.00 was spent on library books. There were 59 high school students in 1916 and R. H. Forrester was the superintendent.

Enough money was raised by the class plays in 1917 to pay for the publication of a little year book entitled Sayonara. Sports were already a big interest for students of Wheeler in 1917. Wheeler fielded the following teams: men's football, basketball and baseball and women's basketball. Fine arts were offered with a music class and a drama class. Domestic science and domestic arts was offered to the young women.

Property Tax Protest and Appeal Procedures

The law gives property owners the right to protest actions The hearing will be informal. You or a designated agent may concerning their property tax appraisals. You may follow these appeal procedures if you have a concern about:

- the market or appraised value of your property
- · the unequal appraisal of your property
- the inclusion of your property on the appraisal roll
- · any exemptions that may apply to you
- the qualification for an agricultural or timber appraisal
- · the taxable status of your property · the local governments which should be taxing your prop-
- ertv
- · the ownership of property
- · the change of use of land receiving special appraisal
- · any action taken by the chief appraiser, appraisal district or appraisal review board that applies to and adversely affects you.

Review by the Appraisal Review Board

If you can't resolve your problem informally with the county appraisal district (CAD) staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board (ARB).

The ARB is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals or other concerns listed above. It has the power to order the CAD to make the necessary changes to solve problems. If you file a written request for an ARB hearing (called a notice of protest) before the deadline. the ARB will set your case for a hearing. You'll receive written notice of the time, date and place of the hearing. If necessary, you may request a hearing in the evening. Saturday or Sunday. Prior to your hearing, you may ask to review the evidence the CAD will use to uphold their determination. The CAD may ask you for a copy of the evidence you plan to present.

appear in person to present evidence or you may send notarized evidence for the ARB to review at your hearing. The CAD representative will present evidence about your case. You may cross-examine the CAD representative. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. The CAD has the burden of establishing the property's value by a preponderance of the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at

402 South Main in Wheeler

Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires ARB members to sign an affidavit saying that they haven't talked about your case before the ARB hears it.

Review by the District Court or an Arbitrator

After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy of its order by certified mail. If you're not satisfied with the decision, you have the right to appeal. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the ARB's order. As an alternative and within the same time period, you may file a request for binding arbitration with the county appraisal district in certain cases.

Tax Payment


You must pay either the amount of taxes due on the portion of the taxable value not in dispute or the amount of taxes due on the property under the order from which the appeal is taken.
