Cancellation Available

Postmaster Ada Lou Lester has received permission for a Special Cancellation for an Old Mobeetie Station, for September 3, 1990

The cancellaton features a pen and ink drawing of the Old Mobeetie Jail by the late Bernice Caldwell, longtime resident of Mobeetie.

This one time cancellation will be available during the Mobeetie Labor Day weekend/Old Settlers Reunion at the Old Mobeetie Jail from 9:30 a.m. -3:00 p.m.

Postmaster Lester asks that anyone who wants to have this one-time cancellation may send a stamped, self-addressed envelope or card to Mobeetie Post Office and she will hold until Labor Day and mail back to the sender with the special cancellation.

The stone jail was begun in 1880 after the Wheeler County Courthouse was completed. The rock was hauled seven miles from the Emanuel Dubb's farm east of town the Pit is still visible where the rock was quaried over one hundred ten years ago. The rock masons who cut and built the jail were shipped to Mobeetie from Ireland. The jail took five years to complete


QUIVIRA GIRLS SCOUTS Needs Volunteers

J.J. (Uncle Johnnie) Long came to Mobeetie as a soldier at Ft. Elliott. He was chosen to go the Canadian River Cedar breaks, thirty miles north of the fort and cut two trees tall enough to make a flag pole. Each pole was 50 feet long and he hauled them in a wagon. When the fort was discontinued, Uncle Johnnie Long placed the flag pole in front of his store. It was moved to New Mobeetie and used at the school until 1950 and it was moved to the jail.

This very special flag pole is still used at the Old Mobeetie Jail Museum today. It is included in the pen and ink drawing cancellation.
