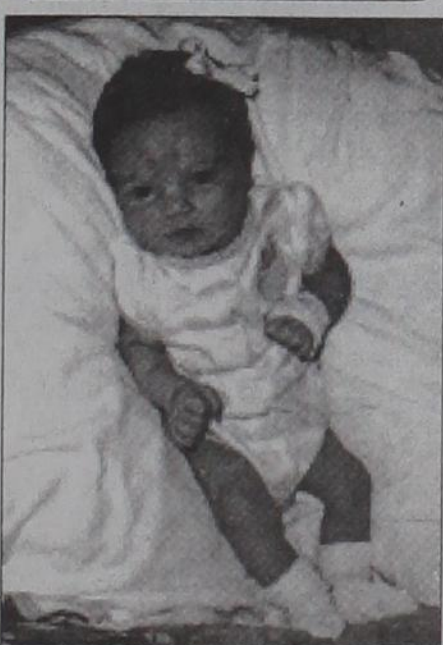

Family Watches As Rochelle Rives Competes In New York Triathlon

On July 20th, Rochelle Rives, competed in the 8th Annual Nautica New York City Triathlon. Three thousand athletes gathered at the Hudson River's edge to begin their swim early Sunday morning in waves that began at 6 A.M. This urban race began with a 1500-meter swim in the Hudson River. Rochelle along with other competitors reported being stung numerous times by jellyfish. This unnerved many of the swimmers, but Rochelle calmed down after the stinging subsided. After the swim, the athletes boarded their bikes to ride the 40-kilometer course that took them from the Westside Highway to the Bronx, turning and returning to Riverside Park. Then the 10-kilometer run began at Riverside continuing up 72nd Street to the upper west side of Manhattan entering Central Park traveling the upper loop to Bethesda Fountain and Sheep Meadow. Rochelle finished this course in 2 hrs. 57 minutes. She was 81st out of 261 women in her age group. The race was especially difficult because of the heat and humidity. Her family was there to support her. Traveling from Wheeler County were her parents, Doug

and Betty Rives, and grandmother, Mot Coleman. Rochelle's sister, Amanda and family along with friends were also there watching her compete. Rochelle lives and works in New York City as an English professor at Manhattan Burroughs College, and her husband, Matthew Wadiak, is a private chef.
