18 Miles Of Transmission Line Under Construction In County

First and foremost, Greenbelt Electric Cooperative, Inc. (GEC) would like to apologize to their consumers for all the blinking that has occurred in and around the Wheeler area. As with any progress come problems and obstacles to overcome. GEC hopes to have these inconveniences resolved in the very near future.

In order to better serve our Wheeler County service territory, Golden Spread Electric Cooperative, Inc. is constructing 18 miles of 69KV transmission line from GEC's Wheeler Substation to a 12.5MVA substation that is located 8 miles north of Kelton on the Huff Ranch. This will provide power to a recently un-serviced area in GEC's certified territory.

Golden Spread Electric is a tax exempt, consumer-owned public utility, organized in 1984 to provide low cost, reliable electric service for its rural distribution cooperative members. Its 16 member systems, which includes GEC, serves approximately 205,000 retail consumers located in the Panhandle, South Plains and Edwards Plateau Regions in Texas, and area covering 24 percent of the state, and in the Panhandle of Oklahoma and in Southwestern Kansas. Golden Spread operates in the Southwest Power Pool and the Electric Reliability

Parkview Artery Four Wheeler Safety

The four-wheeled, all terrain vehicles, also known as quads or ATVs, have become common, particularly in rural areas where they double as gas-powered workhorses and off-road

But according to the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) at least 555 people including 111 children, died riding all-terrain vehicles in 2006. (Latest figures Feb.2008) In the last year alone, the CPSC added 199 deaths to the 2005 total, raising it to 666. The agency also estimates every year that the figures are much higher than reported. While the 2006 death estimates were not included in the report, the agency estimates 870 people actually died since many deaths are not properly reported. Of the 555 deaths in 2006, 20 percent - or 111 - were children younger than 16. Fifty were younger than 12.

Aside from deaths, the CPSC estimates that the total number of ATV-related injuries in 2006 is 146,600, the highest total yet and up 10,000 from 2005.

Lets avoid further accidents and fatalities by reviewing the laws you need to know."

State Laws: All ATV owners must apply for a title before selling or disposing of their ATV.

 All ATVs operated on public property must be registered, renewing registration once every

 No passengers are allowed at any time while the ATV is on public lands, unless the ATV is designed to carry a passenger.

• ATV use on public streets is prohibited, except to cross these roads or for agricultural purposes.

 All operators under 14 must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

· While on public lands, all operators must have a safety certificate or be with a parent who has obtained a safety certificate.

 ATVs shall not be operated from Ω hour after sunset to Ω hour before sunrise without a lighted taillight and headlight. Medcat

plained in just one word. Sincerity. When a hillbilly sings a crazy or emotional song, he feels crazy. When he sings, "I Laid My Mother Away", he sees her a layin' right there in her coffin. He sings more sincere than most entertainers because the hillbilly was raised rougher than most entertainers. You got to know a lot about hard work. You got to have smelt a lot of mule manure before you can sing like a hillbilly. The people who has been raised something like the way the hillbilly has knows what he is singing about and appreciates it," Williams explained.

"Burns as Williams talks about this in the show. His songs reveal an interior snapshot. Williams, the man, felt the need to mask his tenderheartedness with callousness and bravado, but Williams, the performer and the writer, let his personal weaknesses show, especially once he discovered that everyone has these same weaknesses and fears. His troubled relationship with his wife Audrey, played by Farrhen Sewell, gave him most of his material. He often cited "I'm so Lonesome I Could Cry" as his personal favorite and this song is one of the core songs Burns uses throughout the show and is echoed by the other vocalists, Perkins, Lori Park Daubenspeck, Mike Mathews, Shirley Robison, Patti Macumber, and Dayva Spitzer," Patt Ward Curtin, director said.

The fact is, Mr. Pickens isn't the only one seeking to develop wind energy. He's just the only one who personally owns a governmental entity (a new freshwater supply district) to obtain the rightof-way for him.

There is an undeniable demand growing for renewable energy. Wind power is coming to Texas and it will be developed in the Panhandle and West Texas, regardless of whether Mr. Pickens' latest venture succeeds. To transport the much-needed renewable energy to the rest of the state and nation, companies will construct transmission lines. Mesa Power is proposing one transmission line, but it isn't the only proposal.

Within the next few weeks, the PUC will complete its Competitive Renewable Energy Zones (CREZs) proceeding, consistent with the public policy priority of efficient and orderly development of wind energy. A transmission route will be selected to carry wind energy to the state's energy grid. Since this process began in 2006. more than a hundred people have filed comments with the PUC, and 85 parties, Mesa among them, have participated in this process.

The Panhandle and West Texas have a long history of helping our neighbors. Our cotton, grain, beef and oil have clothed, fed and moved Texans for generations, and we're proud of that heritage. While we look forward to developing renewable energy to be purchased by our neighbors, we cannot give up an important future source of water for our region - nor are we required to do so. The Ogallala is not "surplus" water; it is a critical source of water for future generations who choose to settle and raise their families in the Panhandle and West Texas.

We are working with our colleagues in the Legislature to develop long term solutions for water and wind resources. We intend to address the issues raised by this poorly conceived project. Water is not like oil; it is like blood life-sustaining.

Senator Robert Duncan, R-Lubbock, serves 46 Panhandle and West Texas counties in the Texas Senate. Senator Kel Seliger, R-Amarillo, represents 26 counties from the Panhandle to the Permian Basin.

Researchers will talk about the latest progress in breeding drought-tolerant corn for food, feed and silage at a corn field day on Aug. 7 at the Texas AgriLife Research North Plains Research

The field day, sponsored by Texas AgriLife Research and the Texas Corn Producers Board, will begin with registration at 9:30 a.m., said Thomas Marek, research field superintendent and AgriLife Research irrigation engi-

This field day is to show the progress of the AgriLife Research corn breeding program and the Southeast Regional Aflatoxin Testing program, said Dr. Wenwei Xu, AgriLife Research corn breeder in Lubbock.

Additionally, participants interested in research details will have the opportunity to tour other corn, bioenergy crops and forage grass


