PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Ft Elliott's Colbey Hanson was named Amarillo Globe-News Player of the Week in Six-Man Football (Aug. 28-30). Colbey is a running back and safety for the Cougars. In the Cougars' seasonopening victory against Lubbock Christ the King, Hanson rushed for 244 yards and five touchdowns and caught four passes for 139 yards and three TDs. Commenting on the junior, head coach, Jim Burns, said that Colbey also played solid on defense and his outstanding speed probably makes him the most elusive running back in our district. "He has great change of pace and can almost stop and turn on a dime. When other players try to tackle him one on one, they are most often out of luck. He got some good blocking from players such as Cody Selby, Kory McLaughlin, Ryan Vandever and Blake Baker.
