

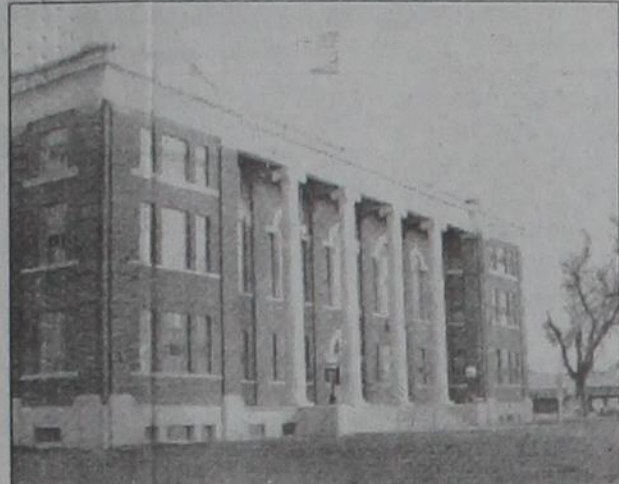

Co. Commissioners Approve Co. Budget

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County met in Special Session on Monday, September 15, 2008, at 8:30 a.m., in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse. The purpose of this meeting is to set the Tax Rate for the 2008-2009 fiscal year and to adopt the budget for the 2008-2009 fiscal year.

The tax rate for the coming year is set at \$0.268812 per hundred dollars taxable value. The budget for the year is \$3,500,000.

In other business, North Plains Electric Cooperative was given permission to install an electric utility line in the north part of Wheeler County.

Note: In the article on the Sept. 8 commissioners' court, reference was made about a \$30,000 county vehicle. The used 4-door, 4-wheel drive pickup was purchased used for \$24,150. An additional \$5,400 was spent for a flabed and grill guard for the vehicle.

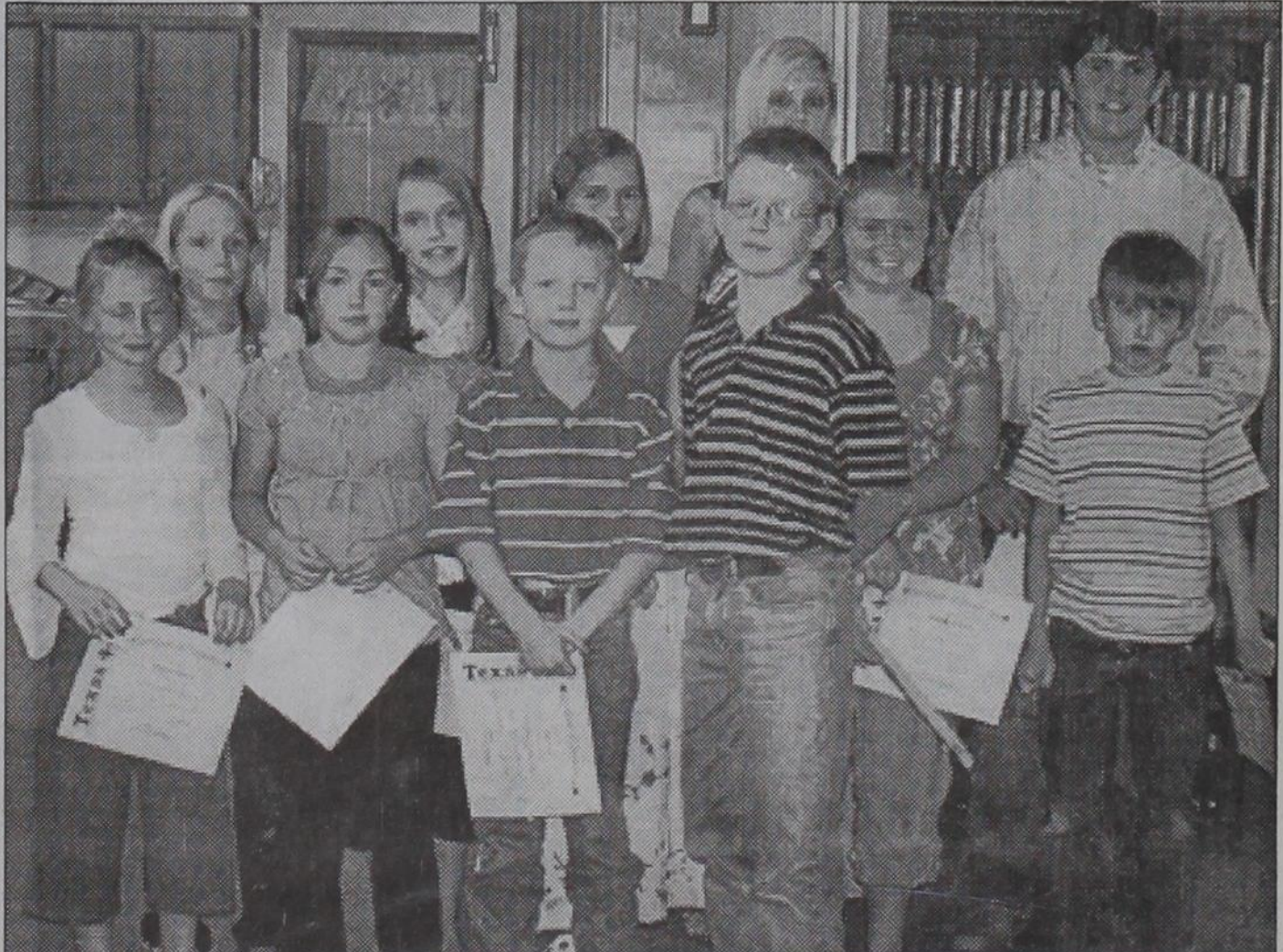

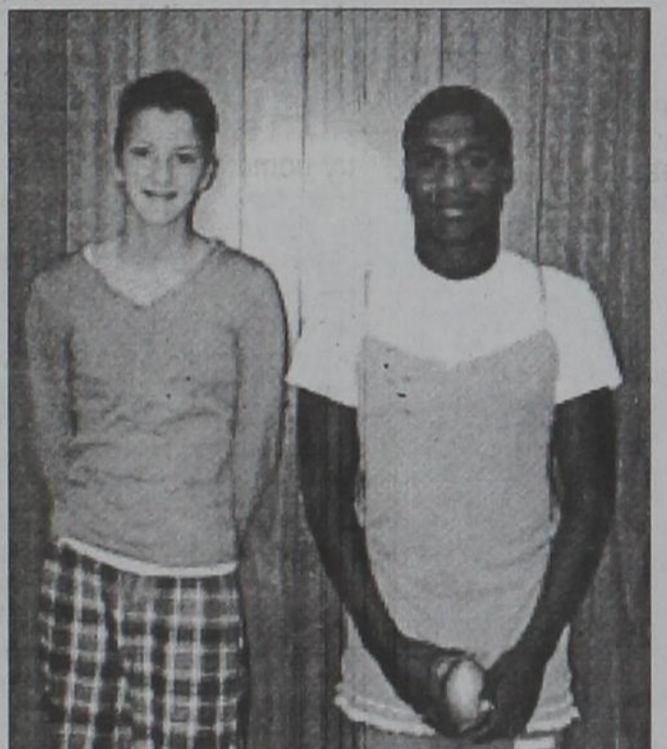
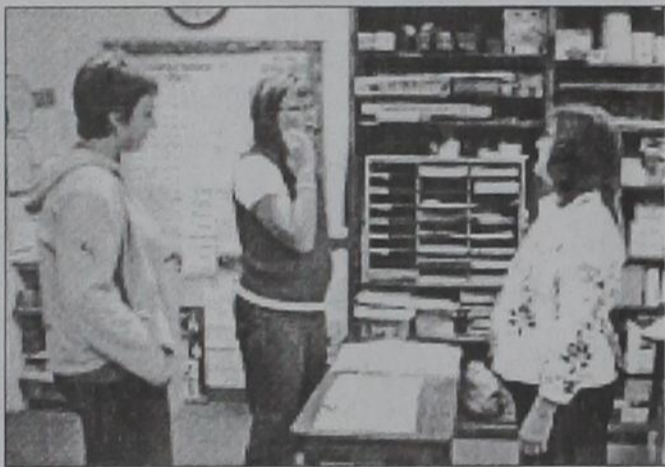

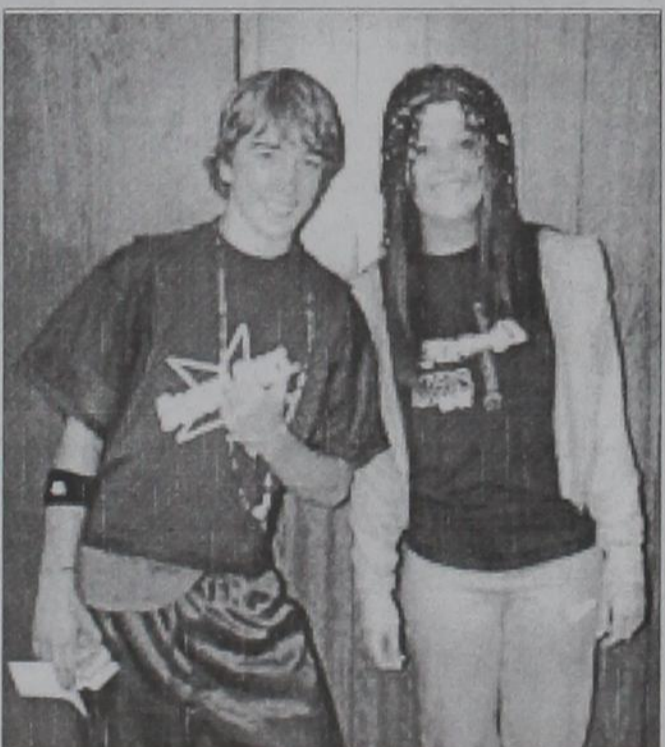

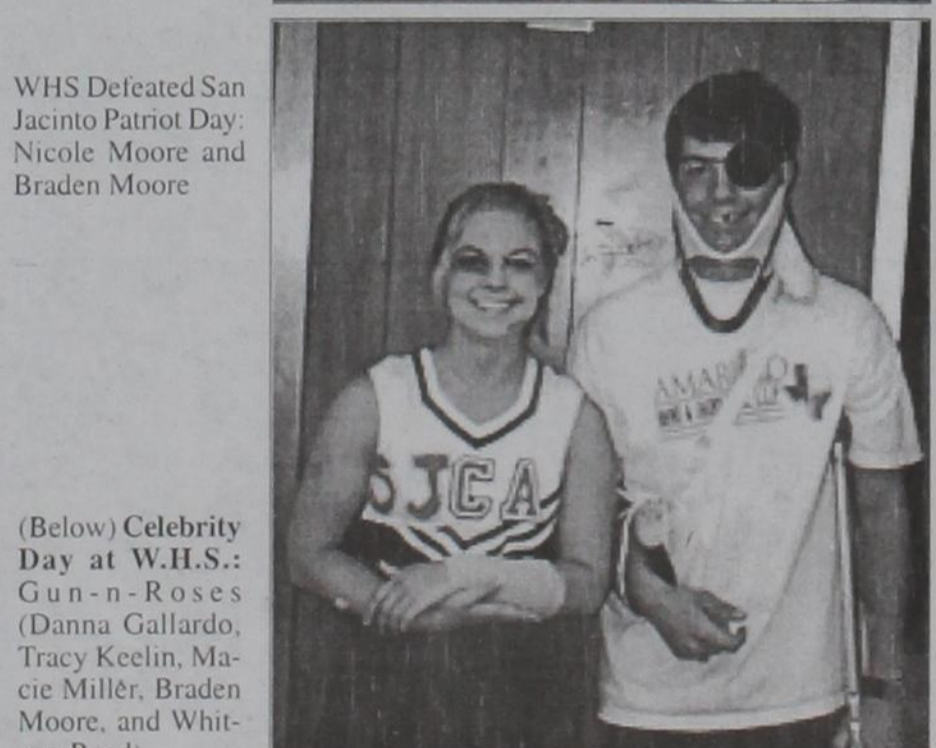

Pipeline Explosion Injures 2 Workers

On Tuesday September 9, 2008 a pipeline explosion in Northeast part of Wheeler County sent

Garrett Leslie Keenan a 51 year old Perryton man and Binaja Salome a 43 year old Clinton Oklahoma man to the Lubbock Burn Center with 3rd degree burns. The explosion was reported to the Wheeler county Sheriff's office at 1:53 PM Tuesday. The Explosion happened on county road 28 located approximately two miles from the Oklahoma State Line.

The two men were working for Gorman & Phillips Pipeline from Perryton. The men were digging a trench for a 16 inch main line for Enogex and hit a low pressure product line. After the explosion, a fire erupted as natural gas leaked out of the hole. The pipeline was shut down and the fire burned itself out in about an hour. The trencher and a welding truck both caught fire. Both the trencher and welding truck were destroyed.

The Wheeler, Mobeetie, Kelton, and Allison fire departments responded to the fire.

Wheeler ambulance transported both victims to meet Life Star Transport.

As of this press release time there is still no word of the two men's medical condition.

This incident is still under investigation.

The grant will enable 50 kilowatts of solar panels to be installed at the wastewater treatment plant, which is owned and operated by LCRA and serves Lometa.

Wheeler County Extension Agent for Family and Consumer Sciences, Karen Tellman with Texas AgriLife Extension, presented programs about Emergency Preparedness, making a plan and making a disaster kit at home for Wheeler 5th and 6th grade and Kelton ISD, Mrs. Davis Health Classes. The students made lists of items that belong in a disaster kit. The students vowed to take a letter home to their parents to make an emergency plan and start making a disaster kit. Why is a disaster supply kit important? If you are forced to evacuate from your home or shelter-in-place, you will not have time to gather the necessary supplies. Assembling a disaster supplies kit will help your family stay safe and be more comfortable after a disaster. What should your disaster supply kit contain? It should contain enough supplies to enable you and your family to take care of yourselves without outside help for at least three days. Supplies List: Water 3-day supply of bottled water. Pack 1 gallon for each person per day. Food - 3-Day supply. Choose foods your family will eat and that do not require refrigeration. Examples include protein and fruit bars, dried fruits, nuts, peanut butter, crackers, canned juices and canned food. First Aid Kit, Extra Clothing, Cash - You may not be able to access a bank or ATM machine for days, and Prescription Medications. Items to be included in a disaster kit are Battery Powered Radio, flashlights, extra batteries, basic tool kit, whistle, garbage bags, toilet paper, can opener, disposable eating utensils, and state map. You can put these items together in a back pack or plastic tub.


