The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County met in Special Session on Monday, September 15, 2008, at 8:30 a.m., in the Commissioners' Courtroom of the Wheeler County Courthouse, The purpose of this meeting is to set the Tax Rate for the 2008-2009 fiscal year and to adopt the budget for the 2008-2009 fiscal year.

The tax rate for the coming year is set at \$0.268812 per hundred dollars taxable value. The budget for the year is \$3,500,000.

In other business, North Plains Electric Cooperative was given permission to install an electric utility line in the north part of Wheeler County.

Note: In the article on the Sept. 8 commissioners' court, reference was made about a \$30,000 county vehicle. The used 4-door, 4-wheel drive pickup was purchased used for \$24,150. An additional \$5,400 was spent for a flatbed and grill guard for the ve-



Small Town Cuts Energy Expenses

"Wheeler; town of friendship and pride."

The Central Texas town of Lometa will use solar power to help manage the costs of treating its wastewater, thanks to a \$488,714 grant from the Office of Rural Community Affairs (ORCA).

The grant will enable 50 kilowatts of solar panels to be installed at the wastewater treatment plant, which is owned and operated by LCRA and serves

"Rising energy costs are hitting everyone hard, but especially rural communities," said Charles S (Charlie) Stone, ORCA's executive director. "Solar power and other forms of renewable energy can help small towns have more control over their energy costs."

The grant to Lometa is the second awarded for renewable energy by ORCA through its new Renewable Energy Demonstration Pilot Program (REDPP) Lometa, with a population of about 800, is located in Western Lampasas County.

The first grant in the program was awarded in March to the City of Seminole for a project using wind power to desalinate groundwater, providing a new source of drinking water for the West Texas

ORCA's \$500,000 grant for the Seminole project was supplemented with a \$300,000 grant from the Texas Water Development Board and \$200,000 from Texas Tech University. Construction of the Seminole project is expected to begin in November.

For the Lometa project, LCRA will contribute \$51,738 toward inkind services to design and construct the facility that will house the solar array. LCRA will eventually assume ownership and maintenance responsibilities for the solar installation.

"LCRA is very pleased to be part of this important renewable energy project," said Marcus Pridgeon, LCRA assistant general manager and chief operations officer. "Adding another form of energy will help prevent plant operation costs from being as heavily impacted by dramatic changes in the cost of fuels like natural gas or coal."

The 50-kilowatt solar installation - one of the largest in Texas - could reduce the plant's annual energy bill by as much as 50 per-

cent. "The cost of solar power remains relatively high," said ORCA Board Member Charles Butts Sr., who is originally from Lampasas County and recently retired and moved back home eight miles east of Lometa. "But those costs are declining rapidly. This project can provide a blue print for how other rural communities in Texas can begin to cut their energy

costs.' The Hamilton County Electric Cooperative, which serves Lometa, has agreed to a net-metering arrangement in which excess power from the solar array would feer into the cooperative's grid. The energy bill for LCRA's wastewater treat nent plant would then be credited for that excess power fed into the cooperative's griu.

ORCA's governing body in 2007 approved allocating \$500,000 in Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for a Renewable Energy Demonstration Pilot Program. The committee has allocated another \$500,000 for the program for Fiscal Year 2009. Funding for the Lometa project comes from unused CDBG money.

As the state agency dedicated solely to rural Texas, ORCA makes the broad resources of state government more accessible to rural communities. ORCA was created by the 77th Legislature to ensure a continuing focus on rural issues, monitor governmental actions affecting rural Texas, research problems and recommend solutions, and administer rural-focused state and federal resources. It should contain enough supplies to enable you and your family to take care of yourselves without outside help for at least three days. Supplies List: Water 3-day supply of bottled water. Pack 1 gallon for each person per day. Food - 3-Day supply. Choose foods your family will eat and that do not require refrigeration. Examples include protein and fruit bars, dried fruits, nuts, peanut butter, crackers, canned juices and canned food. First Aid Kit, Extra Clothing, Cash - You may not be able to access a bank or ATM machine for days, and Prescription Medications. Items to be included in a disaster kit are Battery Powered Radio, flashlights, extra batteries, basic tool kit, whistle, garbage bags, toilet paper, can opener, disposable eating utensils, and state map. You can put these items together in a back pack or plastic






