



John 8:44, "Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do." Il Corinthians 2:11, "Lest Satan should get an advantage of us: for we are not ignorant of his devices." The first Scripture I refer to here tells us that all non-Christians are dominated by the devil. Some people are controlled to a greater degree than others, and some people are demon-possessed. But, all people who have not accepted Jesus Christ as the Lord and Saviour of their lives are children of the devil and follow his desires for their lives, whether consciously or unconsciously.

The second Scripture above makes us to know that even Christians can be dominated by Satan. He can get an advantage of us if we allow it. Some people think the idea of the devil is humorous. They think it is the colorful imagination of wildeyed fanatics. That type of thinking pleases the devil. If you don't know about him and how he operates, if you don't even really believe he exists, he gets the advantage.

Usually, Christians who are dominated by the devil are giving him the advantage through either disobedience to God or through igno-

I Peter 5:8 says, "The devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour." When you don't know whether or not certain things come from God or the devil. (such as sickness), you don't know whether to cuddle and thank God for or resist. Hosea 4:6 says that God's own people are destroyed because they lack knowledge." Let's learn the truth about the devil and what comes from Him. Learn the truth about your rights and authority over the devil. Learn what God has provided for you as a believer. Don't accept Satan's control.
