Entertainment will be provided by local talent throughout the afternoon. The chairman for this year will be Judy Woollard. If you are interested in per-

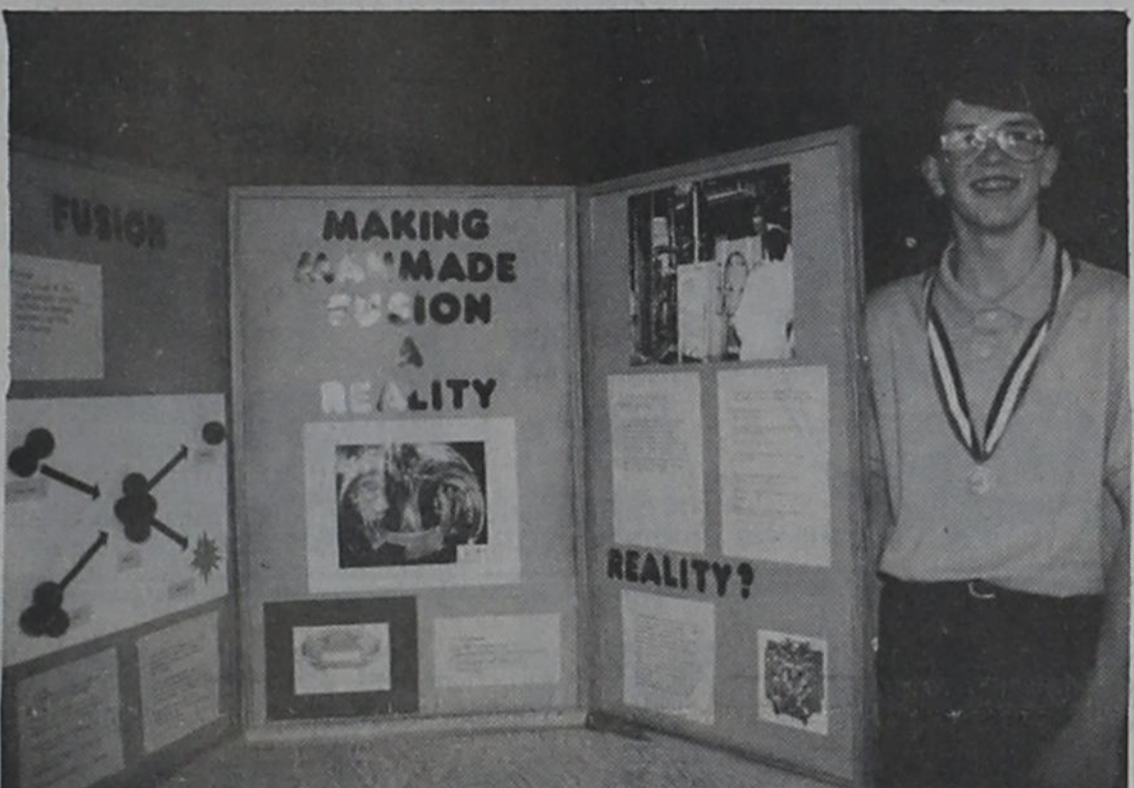

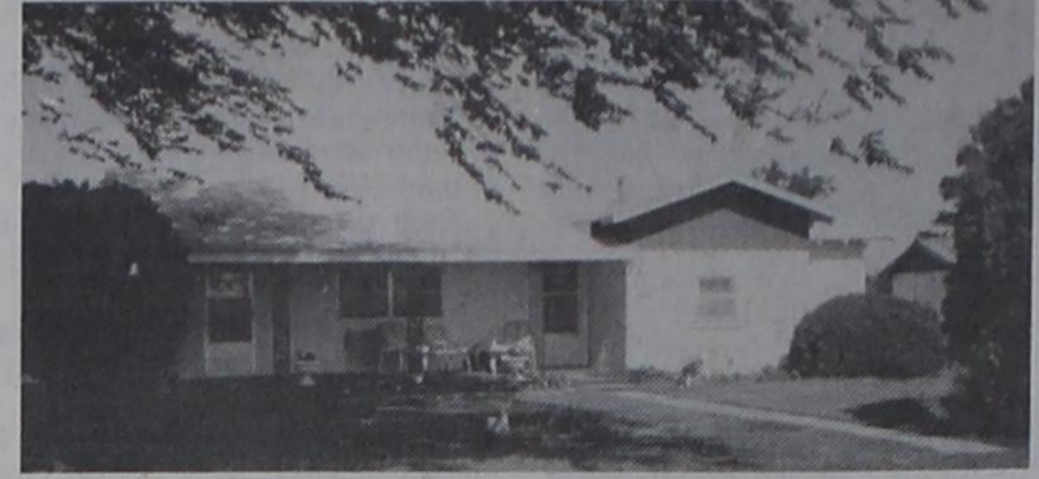

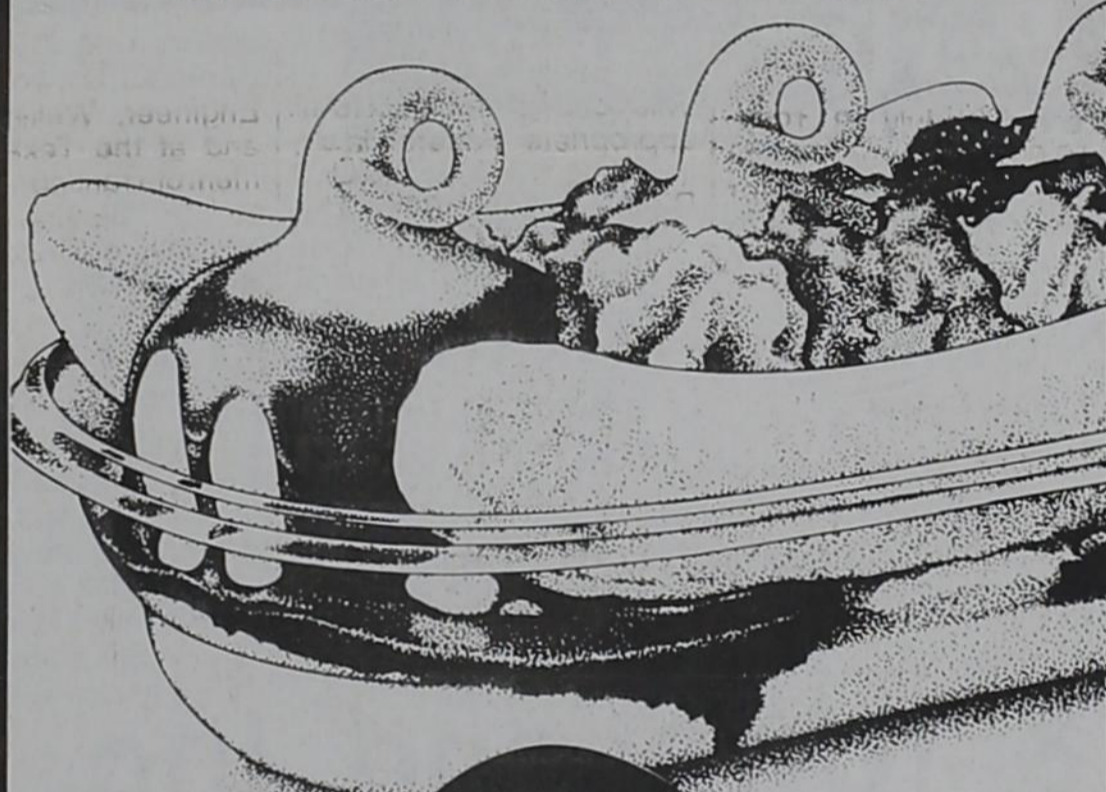
