Abandoned Wells Threat To Safety An estimated 150,000 aban-
doned water wells exist in Texas, and each one poses a threat to
water safety, said Dr. Bruce Lesikar, Texas cooperative Ex-
tension cogricultuan tension agricultural engineer here.
"An abandoned well is a direct "An abandoned well is a direct aquifer below," "Lesikarsaid. "Con-
taminants that enter a well are taminants that enter a well are

If the abandoned well is un-
capped, a contaminant can easily capped, a conntamed well is un-

Plugging abandoned wells is not Plugging abandoned wells is not
just a smart move to keep water sate, but it's also the law, said Dr. Monty Dozier of College Station,

holds landowners responsible tor plugging abandoned wells and for
any contamination or injury the any contamination or injury the
well caused. "Abandoned water wells need to be properly closed," Dozier said.
A well is considered abandoned if A well is considered abandoned if
it has not been used for six consecutive months.
In some cases, landowners can
close the well the close the well themselves. Land-
owners can generally plug both owners can generally plug both
water wells with less than 100 feet of standing water, and large diam-
eter, hand-due wells, Lesikar said. eter, hand-dug wells, Lesikar said.
But before any work is done, they need to contact the Water Well Drillers Program of the Texas De-
partment of Licensing and Regupartment of Licensing and Regu-
lation and get a plugging method approved, he said. A well|llugging
report must be completed and filed report must be completed and filled
with the Texas Department of $L$ iwith the Texas Department of Li-
censing and Regulation and the local Groundwater Conservation
District. To plug the well, the dimensions
are taken, debris is removed, and the well is disinfected with bleach. moved, and the well is properly
filled. The last step is completing the well plugging report. Filing this
report is critical to documenting the e proper closure of the water
well. Wells can be filled using bento-
nite chips (an absorbent alum nite chips (an absorbent alumi-
num silicate clay), cement slurry,
clay or caliche soil, Lesikar said. clay or caliche soil, Lesikar said.
If well type or depth requires a professional to fill the well, or if
the job is too much to handle, a licensed well driller and pump installer can legally fill wells accord-
ing to code. Water is one of Texas' most
