





Meetings on the Trans-Tex. Corridor

Texas future transportation sys- additional environmental studies tem - the Trans-Texas Corridor will be the topic of 44 public meetings that are set to begin this week.

Beginning today and continuing through November 18, transportation officials are seeking public input on the Oklahoma-Mexico/ Gulf Coast element of the Trans-Texas Corridor

While no final route decisions have been made, the Texas Department of Transportation is identifying environmental issues that should be considered in determining where the project could be located. These environmental issues include a large, critical habitat for the Houston Toad in Bastrop County, proposed or existing water reservoirs, dedicated parkland, large populated areas and military

A map of the corridor and a list of the public meetings are available on www.dot.state.tx.us and www.transtx.com.

These meetings are part of an ongoing environmental study by TxDOT. The study of the Oklahoma-Mexico/Gulf Coast corridor element covers a 77-county area 800 miles long and 50-60 miles wide. This element generally parallels I-35 and extends from north of Dallas/Forth Worth to Mexico and/or the Gulf Coast.

The study, expected to be completed in late 2005, will result in one of two options - additional environmental studies along a narrowed corridor or a decision not to build the proposed project. If a narrowed corridor is selected,




