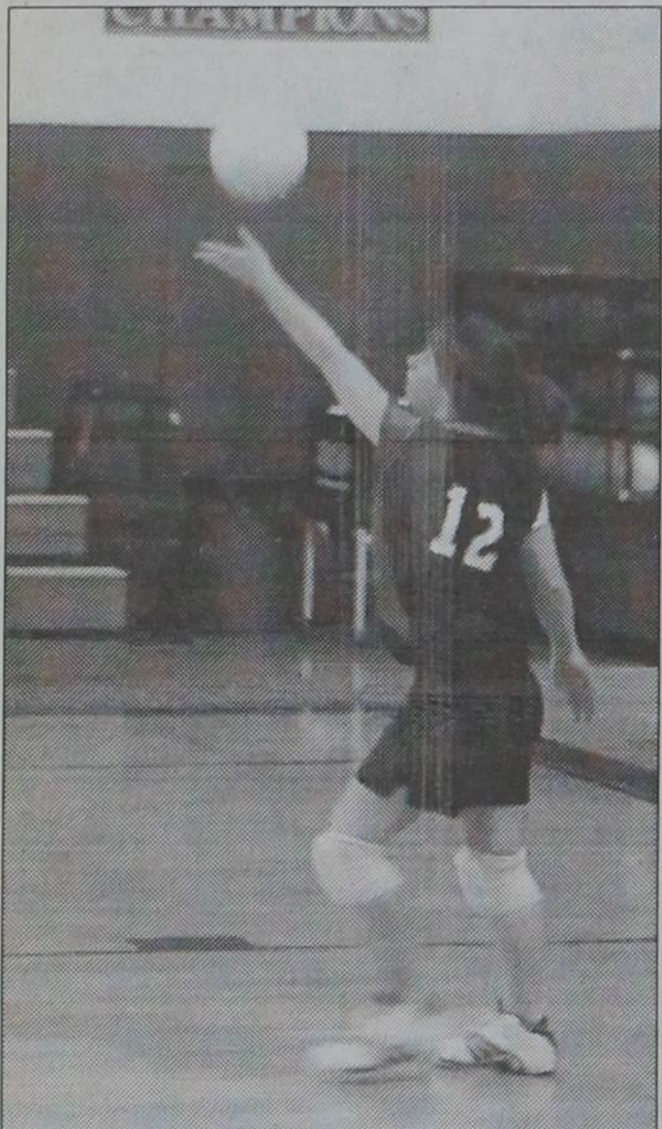

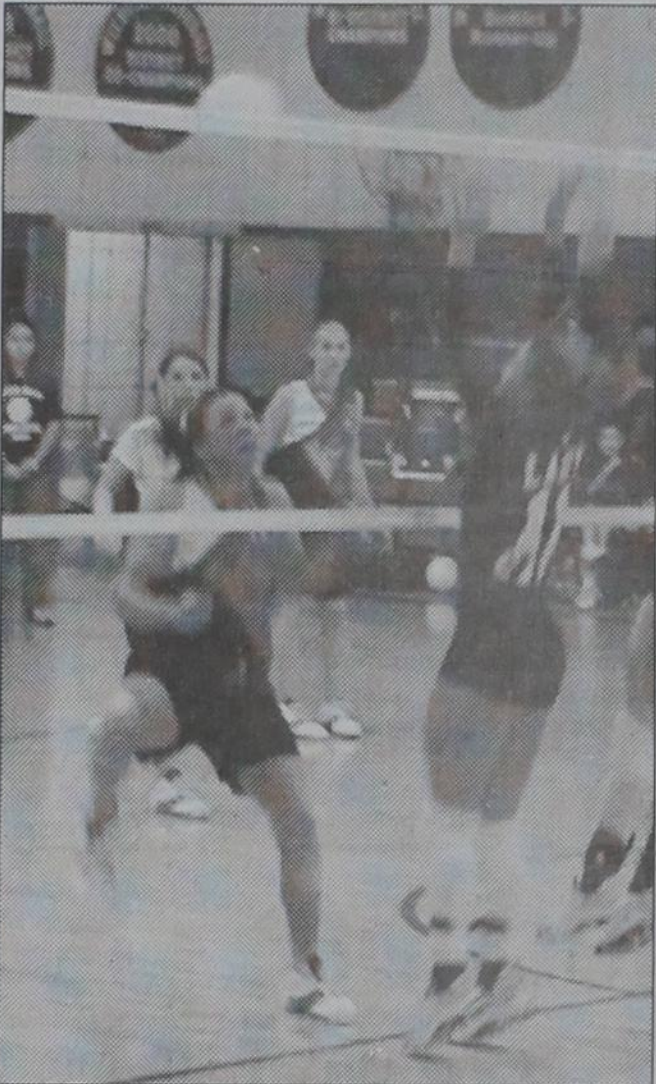
Ft. Elliott's Lady Cougars are lined up and ready to play.



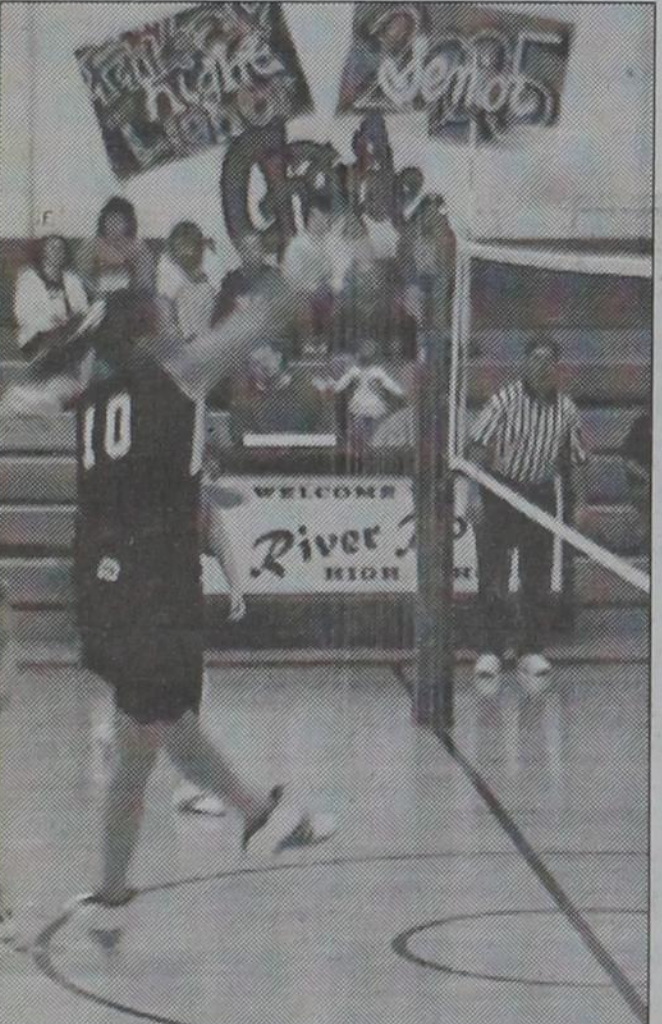
Shealee Coulter, #5, is down on her knees to return the ball. Randi Barr, #00, is in the foreground.



Tamara Hefley, #12, returns the ball.



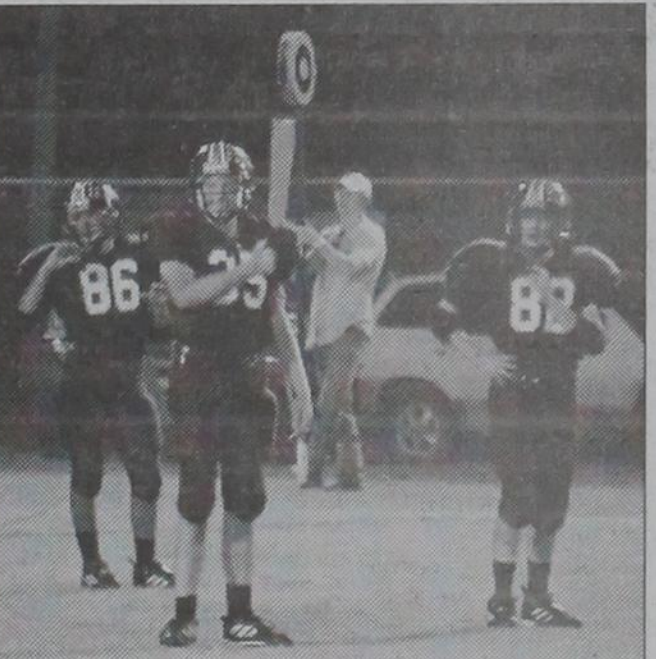
The ball is on the Cougar's side of the net.

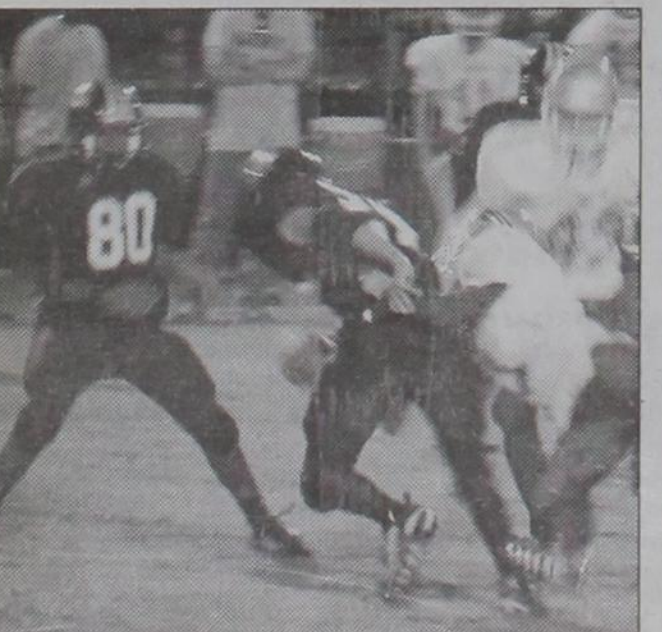

Here is a special invitation for you to be at worship at the Church of Christ in Wheeler this Sunday, November 7. It will be a normal first Sunday of the month for us, meaning that after our morning services we will have a pot-luck fellowship luncheon in our Multi-Purpose Building, and immediately after that we will have our afternoon services and then be dismissed for the day. But what I really want to announce is that we will have a guest co-speaker that morning. I will still be doing most of the sermon, but I have invited an expert to be with us to help us out in our morning's discussion. The sermon is going to be on the relationship between Faith and Physical Health (please don't misunderstand this to think it is about televangelist faith healing). The Bible has a lot to say about prayer, treating one's body as a temple, following God's instruction as a means to living a long life. Yet this still brings up so many questions

such as why faithful Christians still get sick or die, or why do bad things happen to good people? Why does Jesus give physical healing to some, and yet there are still some people who do not receive that gift of healing?

I can answer the theological issues, and will talk about them during the first part of the sermon that Sunday. But for the second part of the sermon, I have invited a medical doctor to talk about some medical situations where he sees the value of faith as helping be a part of the well-being of many of his patients. Dr. Luther Gohlke, now a retired physician, was a member at the Church of Christ in Ranger when I used to preach there. He had at one time been an elder at that congregation. He and his wife Pat are good Christian people and I respect and admire both of them so much. I know that listening to Dr. Gohlke will be a great blessing for all of us as we discuss this difficult subject on Sunday. See you here!

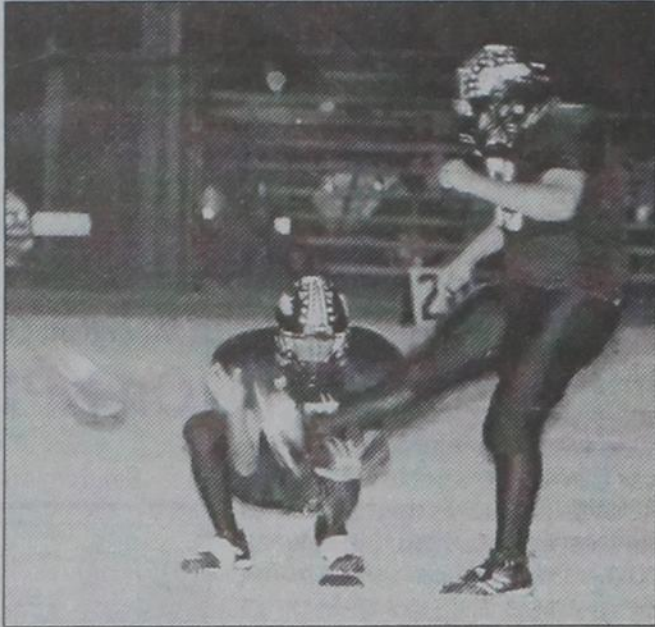

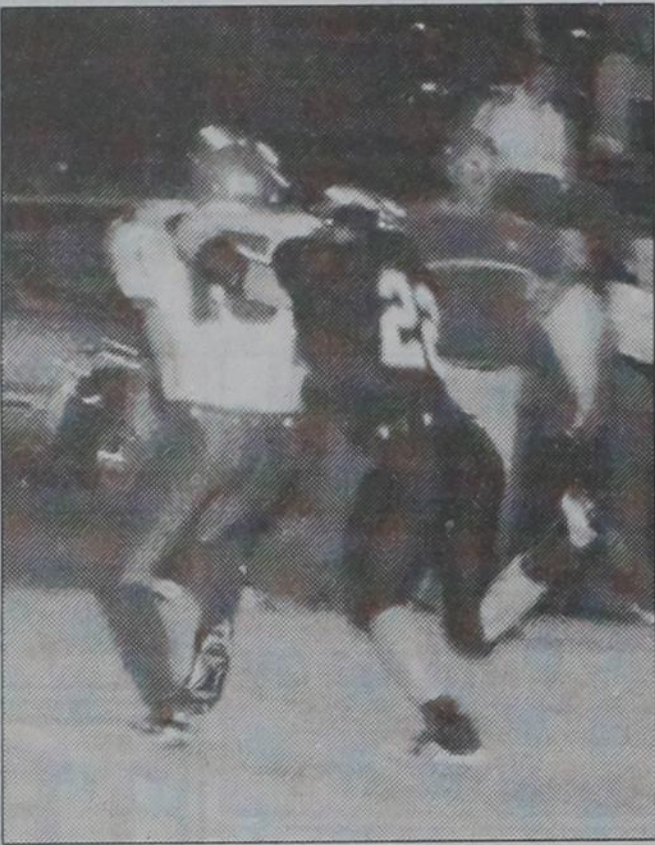

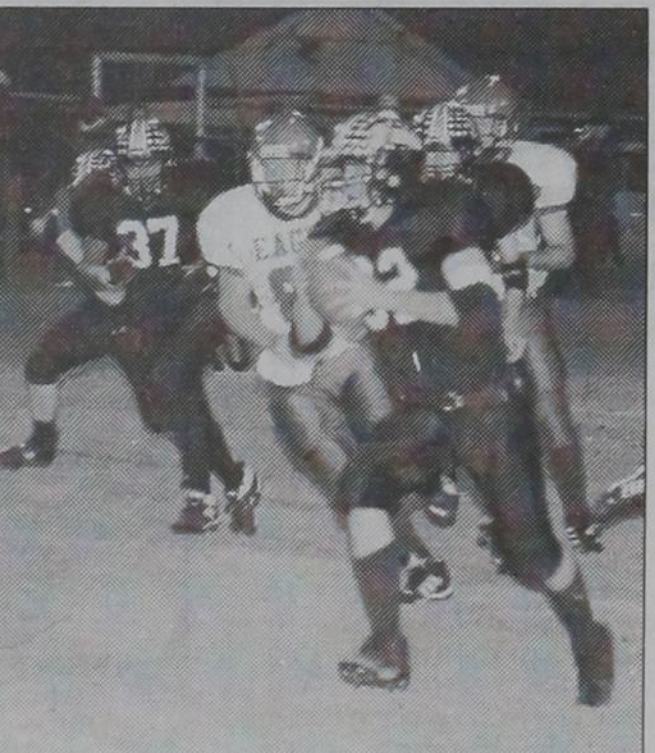

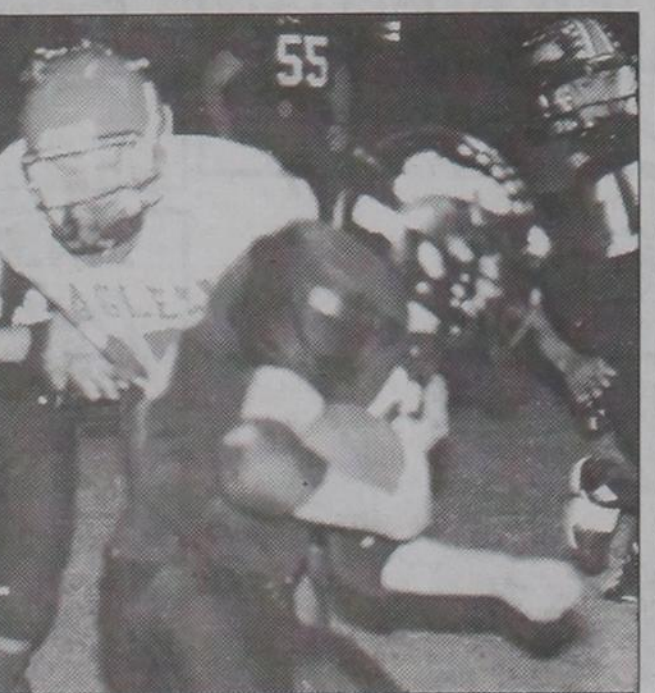

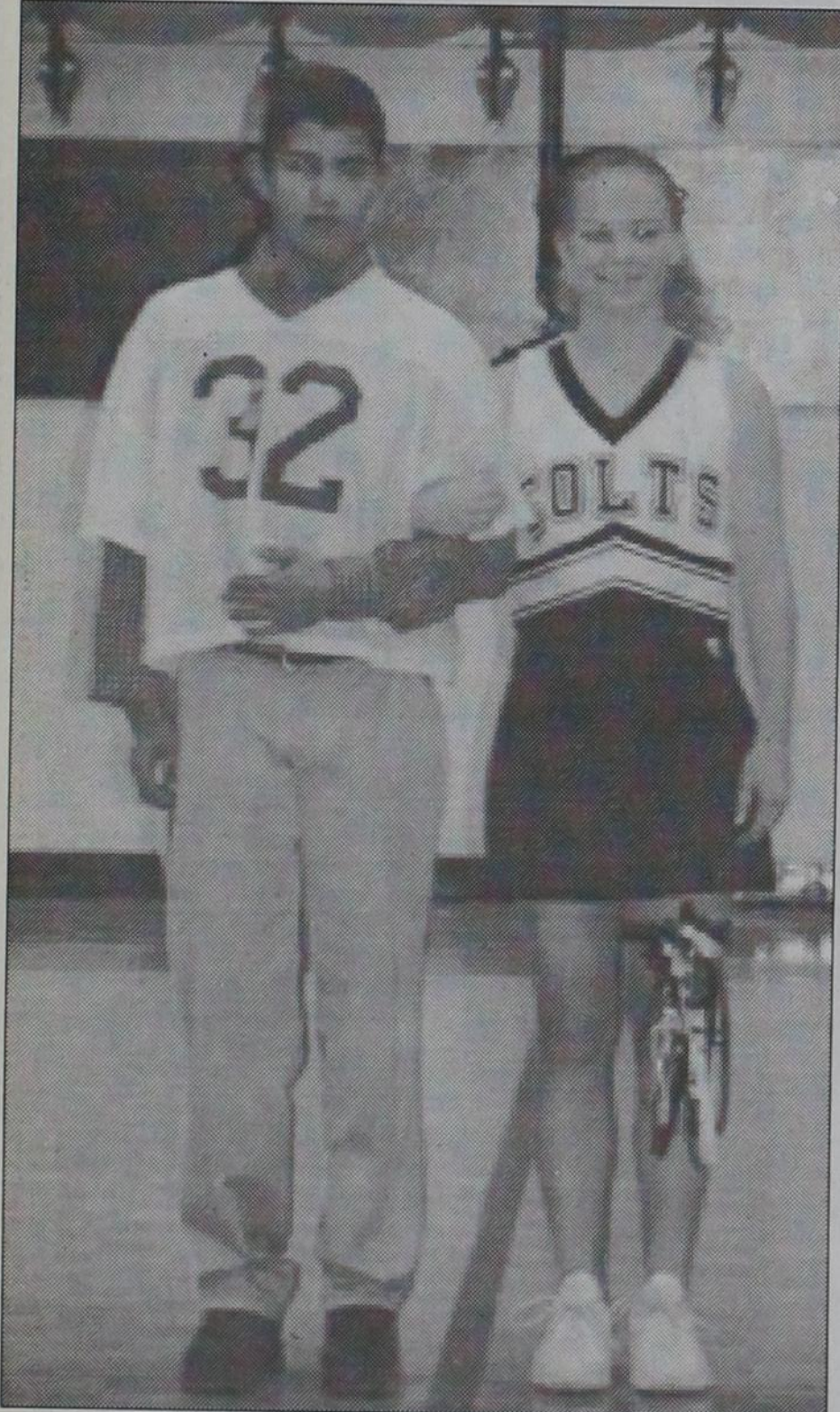

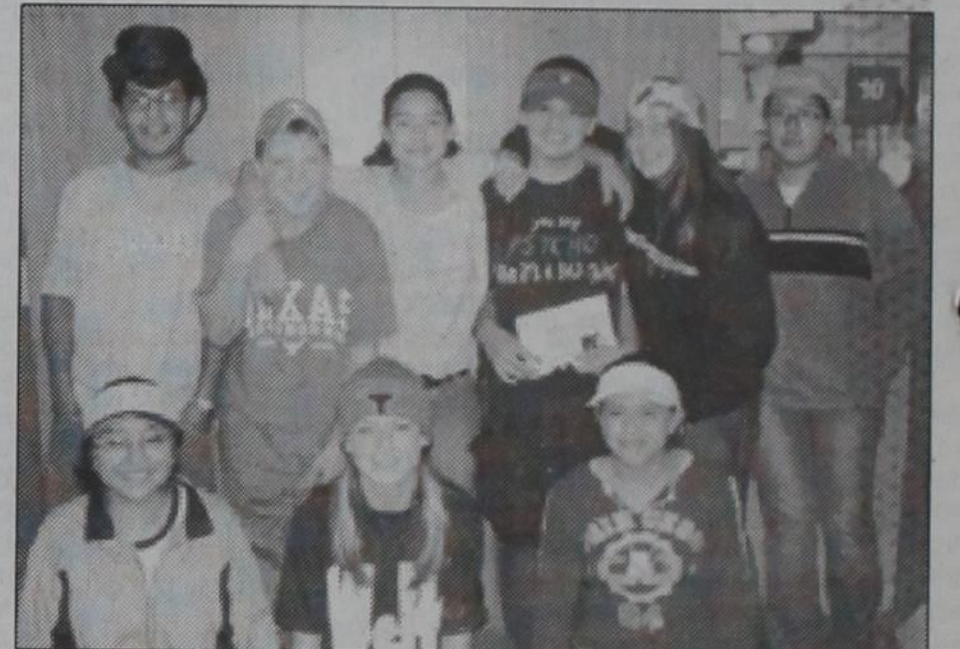

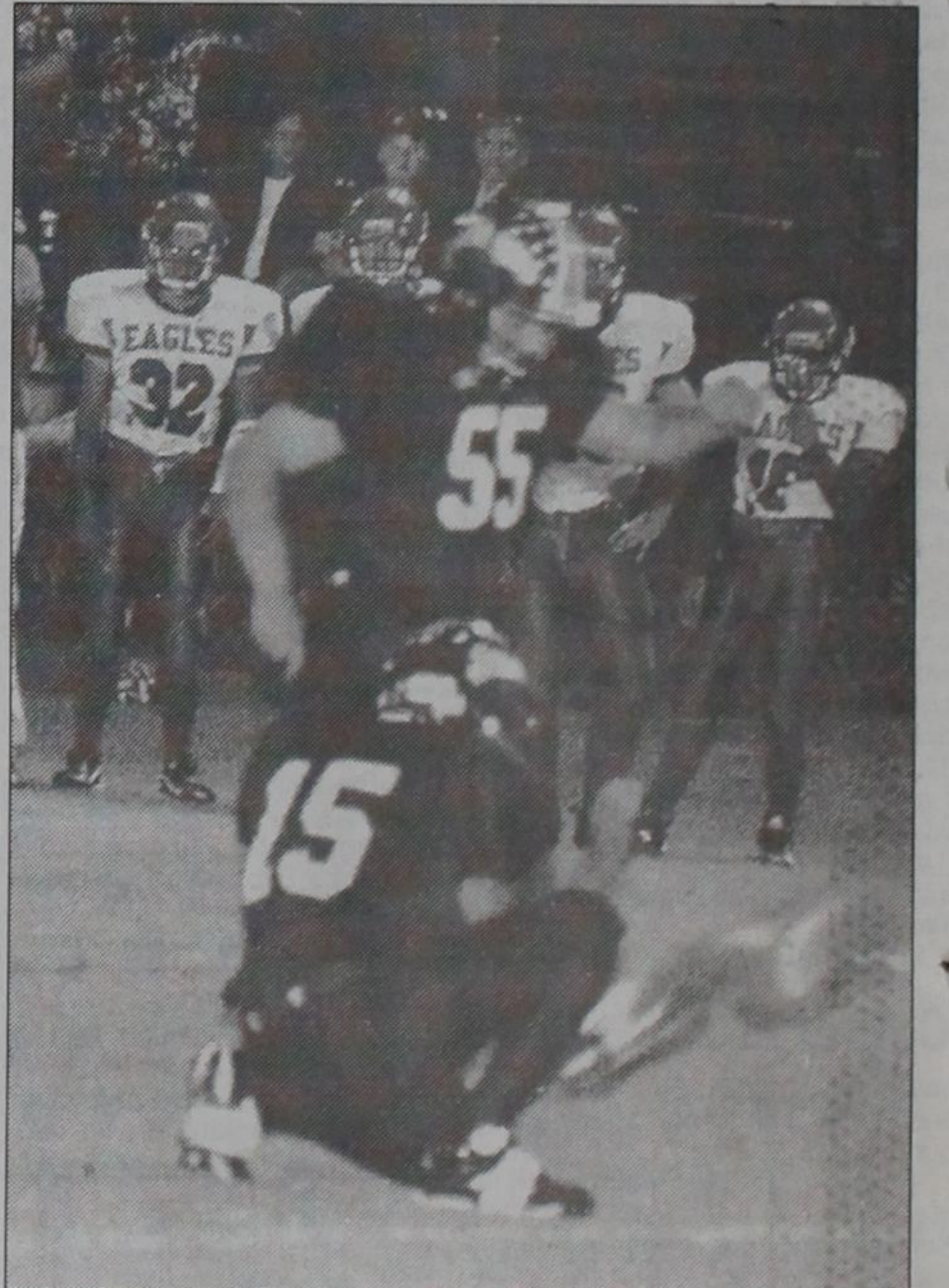
