Enbridge Pipelines (Texas Gathering) L.P., was given permission to cross County road 22 for installation of an oil and gas pipeline and allowed to cross County Road E for installation of an oil and gas pipeline. Chesapeake Energy Marketing, Inc. was given permission to cross County Road A for installation of an oil and

The court voted to adopt a resolution to participate in the Texas Building and Procurement Commission Cooperative Purchasing

The court voted to renew a contract with the Texas Attorney General's Office to receive grant money for the Texas VINE Program on the reccomendation of Sheriff Finsterwald.

Tracie Simpson presented her Registered Texas Assessor/Collector (RTA) Certificate. It was accepted by the commissioners.

David Baker was added to the county payroll as a full time maintenance employee. His salary will be \$1475.00, as of September 16, Daryl Snelgrooes, Commis-

sioner Pct. 1, requested the court's permission to remove Luke Horton from his payroll, effective September 6, 2005. Commissioner Snelgrooes ask

the court's permission to add Randy Finsterwald to his payroll as a full time employee, effective Septemver 12, 2005. Jauna Benefield, County trea-

surer ask the court to consider her request that her part-time employee, Melanie Moya, be advanced to a full time Deputy, effective October 1, 2005. Her salary will be \$1616.96.

County Tax Assessor Scott Porter ask the court to consider his request for approval to allow third party to accept electronic payment for vehicle registration renewal VIA the internet and the RTS online renewal event. Permission was granted; county citizens may now register their vehicles via internet.

Ken Daughtry, Emergency Management Coordinator asked the court to adopt the Annex P-Mitigation Action Plan and Wheeler County Hazard Analysis. The plan was adopted. Daughtry was commended for the job he has been doing for the county.

The commissioners voted to accept Margaret Dorman's recommendation to use the DRE voting machines. The machines use a paper ballot, which may be marked by hand or through the computer; it also indicates if the voter failed to mark the ballot properly at the time the vote is cast. The county will have 10 machines, purchased through grant money. The commissioners voted to spend \$6,000 over the grand funds in order to have ten counting machines. Delivery is expected around the first of the year.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS SPECIAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 8, 2005

PROPOSITION 1 (HJR 54)

HJR 54 would create a Texas rail relocation and improvement fund in the state treasury and would authorize grants of state revenue and issuance of public debt to relocate, rehabilitate, and expand privately and publicly owned passenger and freight rail facilities and to construct railroad underpasses and overpasses.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment creating the Texas rail relocation and improvement fund and authorizing grants of money and issuance of obligations for financing the relocation, rehabilitation, and expansion of rail facilities."

PROPOSITION 2 (HJR 6)

HJR 6 would provide that marriage in Texas is solely the union of a man and woman, and that the state and its political subdivisions could not create or recognize any legal status identical to or similar to marriage, including such legal status relationships created outside of Texas.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment providing that marriage in this state consists only of the union of one man and one woman and prohibiting this state or a political subdivision of this state from creating or recognizing any legal status identical or similar to marriage."

PROPOSITION 3 (HJR 80)

HJR 80 would provide that local economic development program loans or grants (other than debts secured by a pledge of ad valorem taxes or financed by the issuance of any bonds or other obligations payable from ad valorem taxes) do not constitute or create debt. Any provision of state constitutional law that may prohibit or limit the authority of a political subdivision of the state to incur debt does not apply to those loans or grants.

The proposition will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment clarifying that certain economic development programs do not constitute a debt."

PROPOSITION 4 (SJR 17)

SJR 17 would authorize a district judge to deny reinstatement of bail or new bail to a person accused of a felony, if the person's bail had been revoked or forfeited as a result of the person's violation of a condition of release related to the safety of a victim of the alleged offense or to the safety of the communi-

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the denial of bail to a criminal defendant who violates a condition of the defendant's release pending trial."

PROPOSITION 5 (SJR 21)

SJR 21 would authorize the Legislature to exempt commercial loans from state usury laws that set maximum interest rates. "Commercial loans" are loans made primarily for business, commercial, investment, agricultural, or similar purposes and not primarily for personal, family, or household purposes.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment allowing the legislature to define rates of interest for commercial loans."

PROPOSITION 6 (HJR 87)

HJR 87 would increase the size of the State Commission on Judicial Conduct from eleven to thirteen members by increasing from four to five the number of public members and by adding a constitutional county court judge. The additions would ensure that the commission has an odd number of members, which is required by another provision of the state constitution.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to include one additional public member and a constitutional county court judge in the membership of the State Commission on Judicial Conduct."

PROPOSITION 7 (SJR 7)

SJR 7 would authorize new options for reverse mortgage agreements for senior homeowners allowing them to draw advances at unscheduled intervals, if and when needed, and only in the

amounts needed, during the loan term. These are in addition to options that would allow a lump sum payment after settlement or regular periodic, predetermined equal amounts over a term of years or the lifetime of the homeowner. Additionally, SJR 7 would: (1) prohibit the agreement from requiring the use of a credit card, debit card or similar device to obtain an advance; (2) prohibit the charge or collection of a transaction fee solely in connection with any debit or advance, after the time the extension of credit is established; and (3) prohibit the lender or holder from unilaterally amending the extension of

The proposition will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing line-of-credit advances under a reverse mort-

PROPOSITION 8 (SJR 40)

SJR 40 would clear individual land titles by relinquishing and releasing all claims of state ownership interests, including mineral interests, in two local areas, namely, a roughly 4,600 acre area located roughly 14 miles southeast of Gilmer, Texas, and a separate 900 acre area located north of Tyler, Texas.

The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment providing for the clearing of land titles by relinquishing and releasing any state claim to sovereign ownership or title to interest in certain land in Upshur County and in Smith County."

PROPOSITION 9 (HJR 79)

HJR 79 would authorize the Legislature to provide staggered six year terms of office for board members serving on regional mobility authorities, with no more than one-third of the board positions being appointed every two years.

The proposition will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for a six-year term for a board member of a regional mobility authority."


The Seitz family came to the United States from Germany in the 1700's and to Texas in the late 1800's. In the early years of immigration to the US, various spellings of the name appeared including Seiz and Sides. The first proven ancestor for this particular family was a George Sides (Seitz) of North Carolina. The Seitz men fought in the Civil war on both sides. The present days Seitz of the Panhandle of Texas are descendents of Abel Seitz. He and his wife, Catherine Gross Seitz had 9 children: Laborn (or Laban), Jones, Darius (possibly Darius David), George Pinkney, Eliza, Jane, Emeline, Katie, and Hester. Laborn married Susan Emeline Sherrill and they had nine children, 5 sons and 4 daughters. Their first three children, Julius Lafayette, born in 1865, Mary Jane born in 1867, and Sara Annie born 1869 were born while the family lived in Catawba County, North Carolina. Later in 1869 the Seitz family left North Carolina with plans to move to Texas. They reached Benton County, Arkansas and settled near Ratskin, Arkansas until 1877. Four children were born in Arkansas; W.J. (Bill) in 1871, B.P. (Pink) in 1872, L.J. (Jeff) in 1875 and Susan Belle in 1877. The family arrived in Texas in the early part of 1880 and lived in Collin or Denton
