While an estimated 88 percent of pickup drivers comply with state law, pickup passengers are lagging behind. Observ-

ers found that only 78 percent of passengers in pickups use safety belts, even though required by law. Researchers say the state has made steady progress to convince the state's 15 million licensed drivers and their passengers to buckle up. "When we first conducted a safety belt survey in 1985 in 12 Texas cities, only 14 percent of drivers and passen-
