

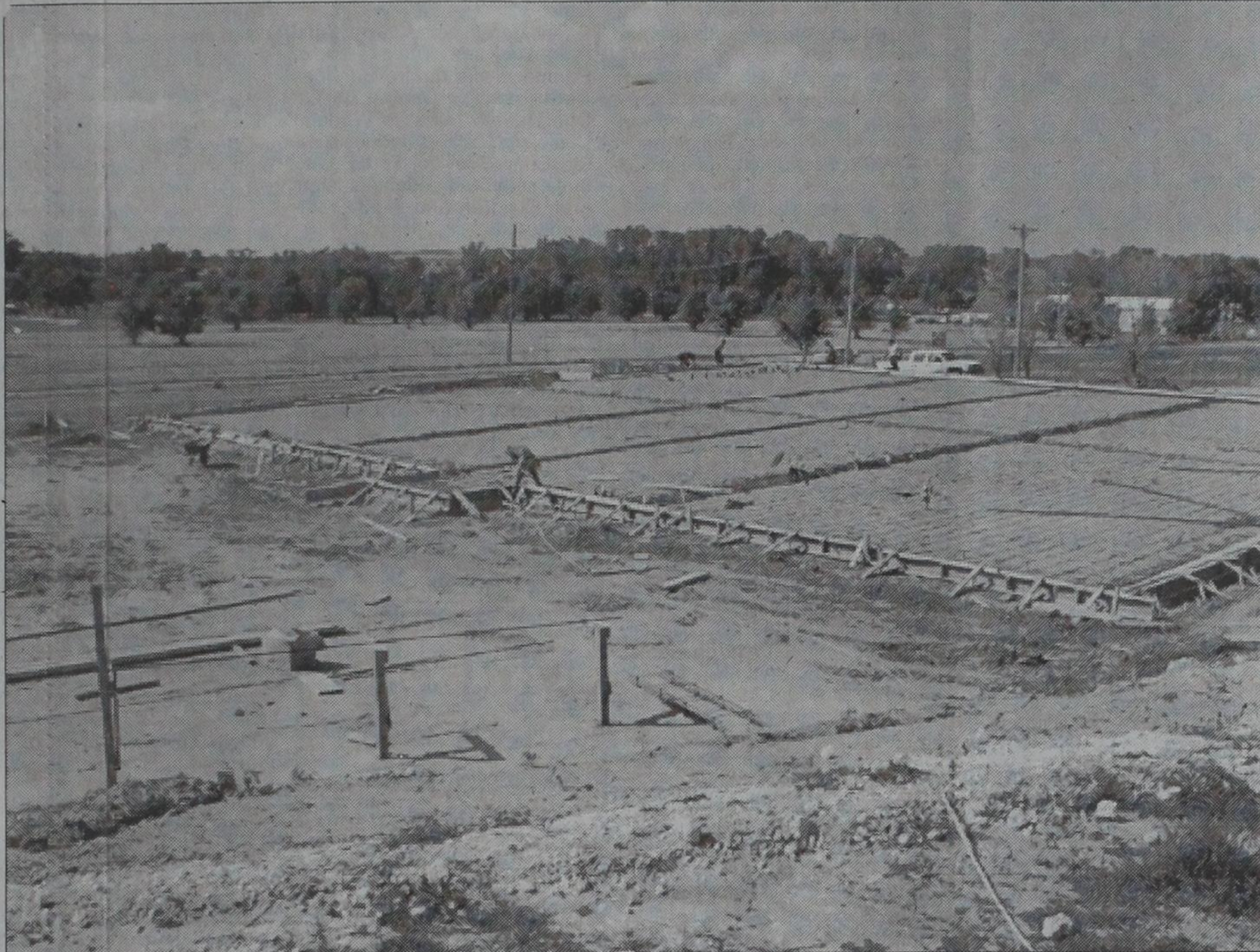

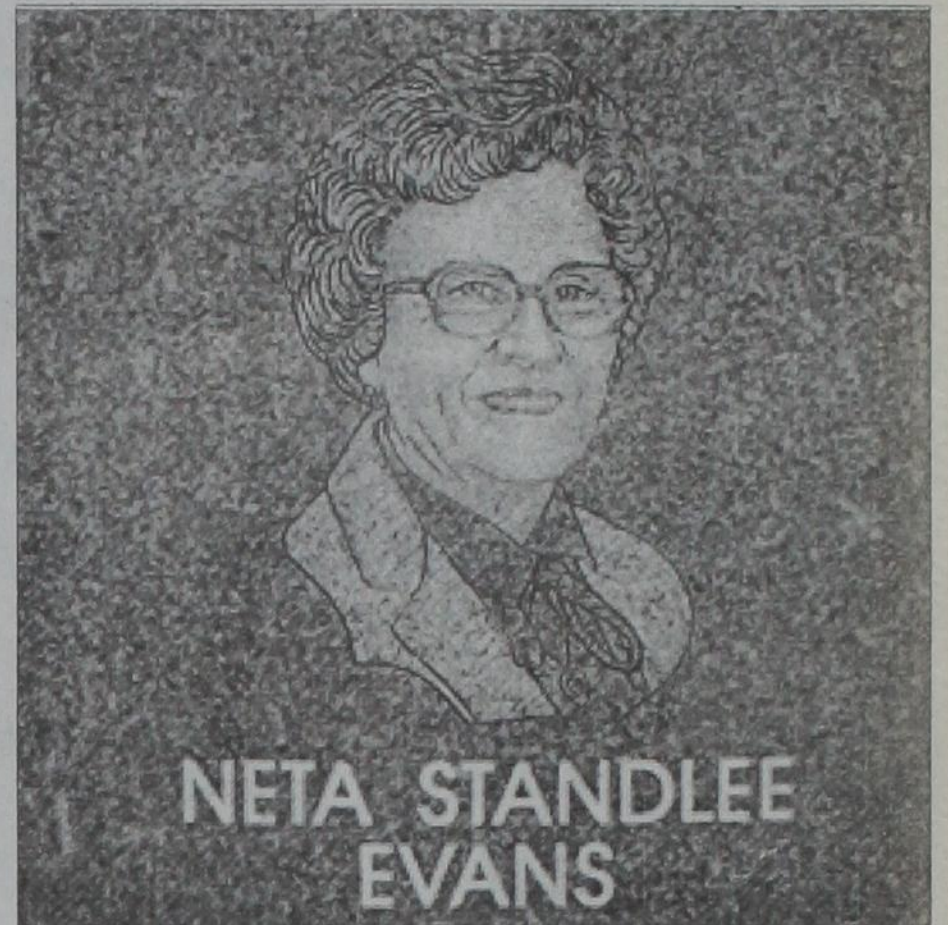

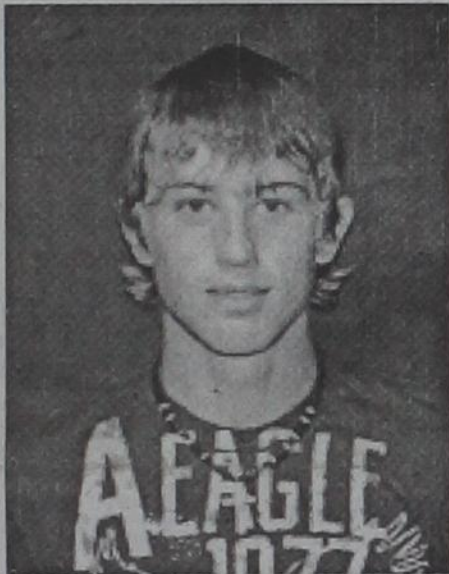

Ft. Elliott's **Colbey Hanson** was named *Amarillo Globe-News* "Athlete of the Week. On the Field: In a 106-82 six-man victory against Miami on Friday, the junior running back/linebacker had a hand in 15 of the team's 16 touchdowns. Hanson ran for 10 touchdowns, threw for four and returned one of his two interceptions 73 yards for a TD. He rushed for 399 yards on 19 carries and completed 6 of 8 passes for 186 yards.

Coach Jim Burns: "He has moves to get by people that are incredible. Colbey is just hard to handle one-on-one because he has tremendous speed and cutting ability. Off the field, he's easy-going, and the kids like him. On the field, he has a nose for the end zone and leads by example."

Hanson: "I just play football. I didn't expect to score the way I did and score so much. On the field, I feel like I have to play hard on every play and never give up. I play hard each week and try to come into each game with as much intensity as I can."

EQIP Sign-up At Local NRCS Office

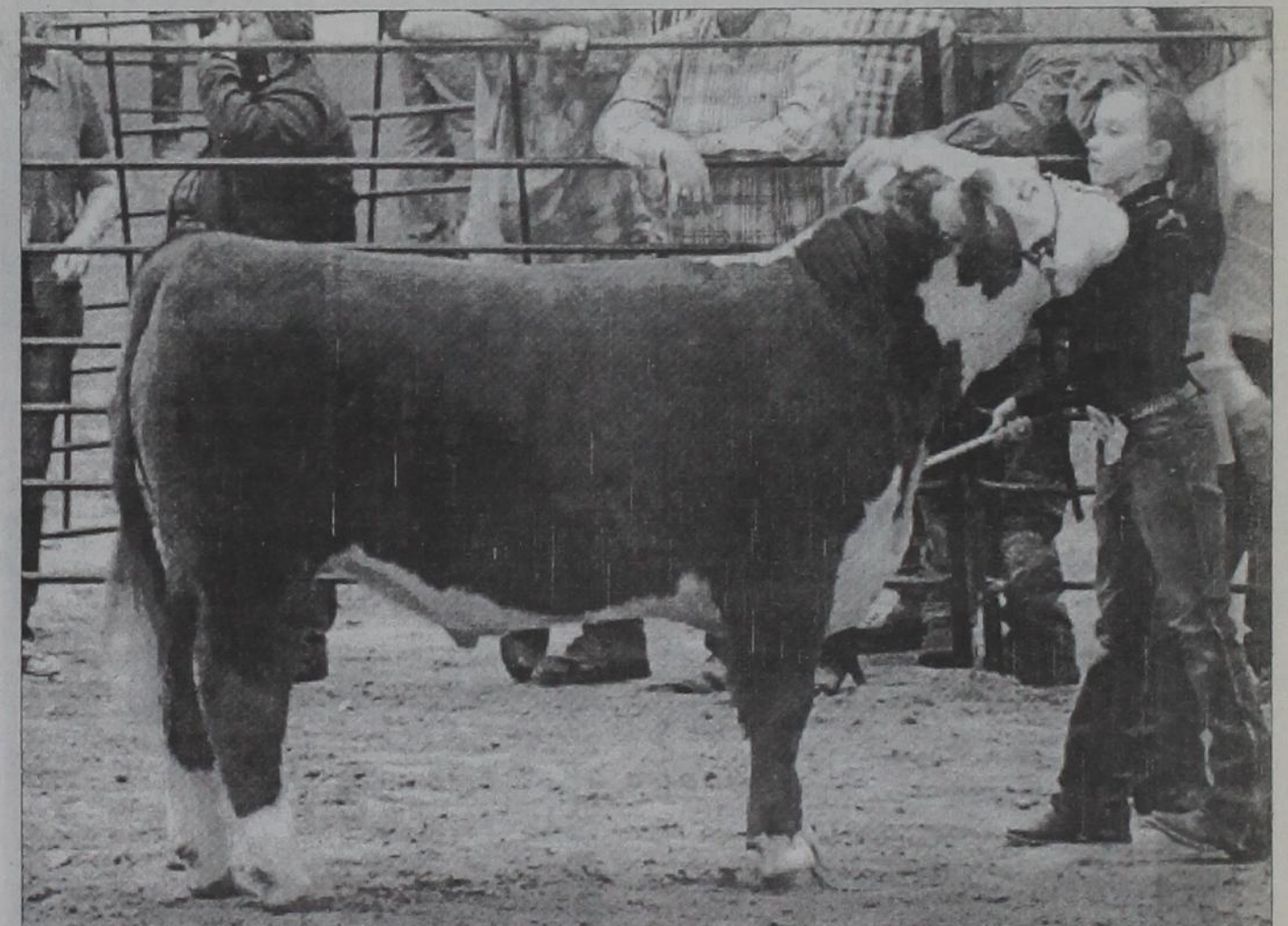

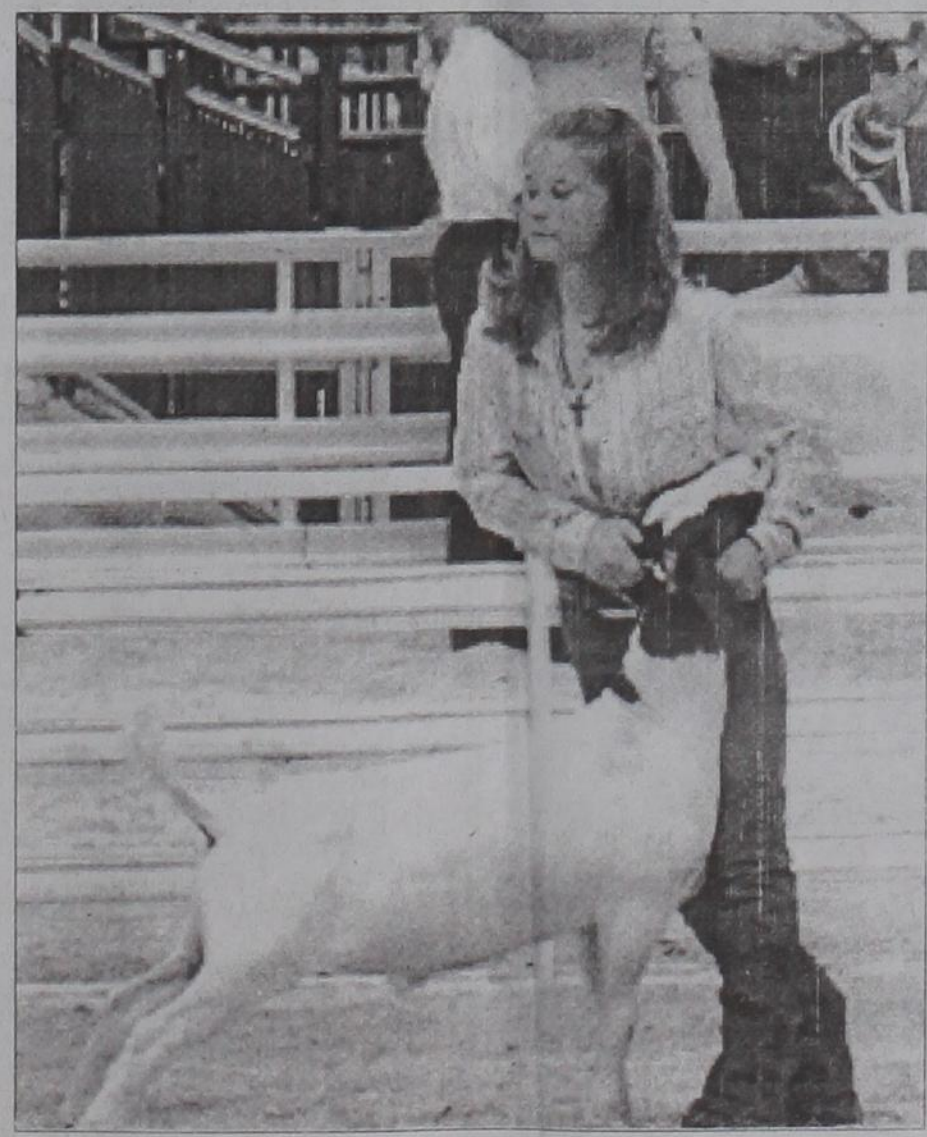

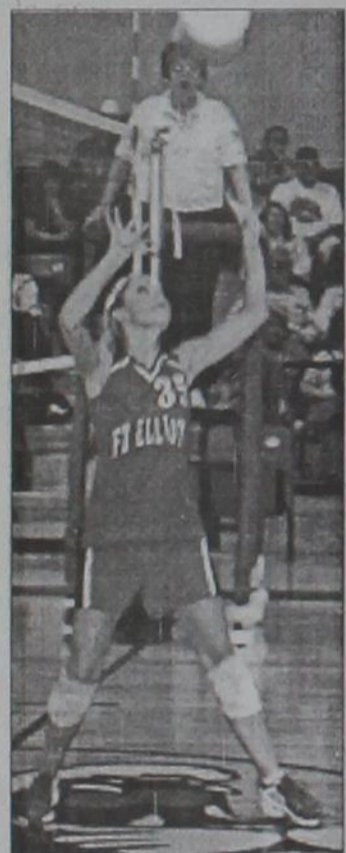

Texans Continue To Buckle Up

Texas Safety Belt Use Tops 90% for Third Straight Year. Millions of Motorists Continue to Buckle Up. Nine of ten Texas motorists are continuing to buckle up, thanks to almost a decade of annual campaigns conducted by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) urging drivers and passengers to fasten their safety belts.

A new survey completed by the Texas Transportation Institute (TTI) indicates that 91.2 percent of drivers and front seat passengers in Texas are abiding by state law to buckle up. It is the third year in a row that the Texas safety belt use rate has topped 90 percent. "We are extremely pleased that Texas is one of only 11 states in the nation where more than 90 percent of motorists have gotten the message to buckle up," said Terry Pence, director of TxDOT's

Traffic Safety Section. "Our ongoing challenge is to reach the drivers and passengers who still aren't in the habit of using safety belts, particularly those who drive or ride in pickups." TTI's survey found that drivers and passengers of pickup trucks are the least likely to buckle up. While an estimated 88 percent of pickup drivers comply with state law, pickup passengers are lagging behind. Observ-

ers found that only 78 percent of passengers in pickups use safety belts, even though required by law. Researchers say the state has made steady progress to convince the state's 15 million licensed drivers and their passengers to buckle up. "When we first conducted a safety belt survey in 1985 in 12 Texas cities, only 14 percent of drivers and passengers were using safety belts," said

Katie Womack, a senior research scientist with TTI's Center for Transportation Safety. "After the safety belt law was enacted in 1985, the usage rate jumped to 65 percent, and it's continued to go up, hitting the 90% mark for the first time in 2006." TxDOT attributes the steady rise in safety belt use in recent years to the annual Click It or Ticket campaign, which combines extensive



public service announcements with stepped-up law enforcement efforts each May. As a result of the surge in safety belt use

and an auditor for 2008. The commissioners voted in the \$200 pay raise for the elected officials and employees as budgeted. County longevity will also be increased from \$10 to \$15 as allowed in the new budget.

No action was taken on the burn ban.

The minutes of the previous meeting were approved as read.

Sue Stiles met with the commissioners to request a tax abatement and request help from the county in moving dirt for a proposed day care.

Bob and Sue Stiles propose the construction of a day care to be located on north of the First State Bank at the south side of Wheeler.

The day care will cost in excess of \$1 million and employ approximately 8-12 individuals. The day care will also be eligible for grants to help with the care of low-income youngsters. The facility will include a 'safe room'.

The county cannot legally approve a tax abatement.

It was proposed that the county furnish trucks to haul necessary dirt from Stiles Ranch to the construction site and in return Stiles would give the county an equal amount of dirt for use by the county. Since this would be in competition with local dirt contractors, the county is not able to enter into such an agreement.

Sharon Braddock was appointed by the commissioners to a 2-year term on the Board of

Trustees of the Texas Panhandle Mental Health Mental Retardation.

County Sheriff, Joel Finsterwald, reported that the county jail would be back in compliance with the state in a couple of months. The jail was overpopulated and it will be necessary for the county to pay another county to house prisoners when the number exceeds 14. This cost is figured into the budget for the new year.

Jauna Benefield, County Treasurer, informed "the court of her problem with getting receipts from elected officials and employees when credit cards are used for purchases for the county. In order to solve the problem, receipts will be required at the time tickets are

presented.

The treasurer further informed the court of her problem with not getting receipts for travel expenses from elected officials and/or employees. The new rule will be no receipts, no travel expenses reimbursement.

Ms. Benefield presented the county audit report for 2006. The audit shows everything in order. The county is required to get an audit every 2 years.

The county approved the crossing of County Roads N and 25 by Elk City, Oklahoma Pipeline, LP, for the installation of an oil and gas pipeline.
