Don D. Earney, 69, died Saturday, August 20, 2004, in Abilene, Texas, at a local medical center.

A graveside service was at 2:00 p.m. Tuesday in Clinton Cemetery in Clinton, Oklahoma.

Don was born December 13. 1934 to Jewel (Walker) and Ferd Earney in Clinton, Oklahoma. He moved to Wheeler in January, 1958, and owned and operated The Wheeler Times until 1961. Don also co-owned and operated V&E Real Estate and was involved in the oil and gas business during his time in Wheeler.

Don promoted Wheeler and the Wheeler area and worked hard to

see Wheeler grow. Don was elected mayor of Wheeler in 1966 and served in that capacity until 1967. He moved to Abilene in 1976. Don was a former banker and an operator in oil and gas. He was a Baptist.

Don was preceded in death by his parents.

Survivors include two sons. Chuck Earney and wife, Jodean, and Steve Earney, all of Denton. Texas; daughters, Carletta Burton and husband, Richard, of Wheeler, Texas, Schuyler Earney of Abilene: a sister, Dorothy Adkins of California; and three grandchildren, Keenan Burton, Trevor Burton, and Chase Brown.

## Wheeler County Citizens Have Access To Nat'l Weather Radio

Wheeler County Emergency Management Coordinator, Ken Daughtry

National Weather Radio is now operational in Wheeler, Gray, Hemphill and Roberts Counties of the Texas Panhandle

You can receive the NWR broadcasts on a "Weather Alert Radio" or a scanner. The frequency is 162.450mhz. This is a continous broadcast channel from the National Weather Service in Amarillo. All warnings, alerts and watches will be announced on this frequency at the same time they are released to the TV stations.

If you would rather not listen to the continuous broadcast, I suggest you purchase a "Weather Alert Radio Monitor" with S.A.M.E. (Specific Area Mechanical Encoding) technology. I also recommend a telescoping antenna, for better reception and battery back-up for times when the commercial power is off. These monitors are available at Radio Shack, Wal-Mart and other electronics retailers (price range is from \$30 to \$100). These monitors are silent until

Wheeler County (or others you select) are alerted, then they will set off an alarm and announce the watch, warning or alert for a minimum of five minutes.

Specific codes can be entered into the monitors to alert you only when Wheeler County (and/or any other Counties you want to monitor) is affected.














Wheeler Meets Valley In Season Opener Saturday At Groom

There is a type of Psalm in the Bible that is called a "Psalm of Lament." Although they take on a variety of different looks, generally they report how bad or sad the current situation is, a plea to God to help out, and then a resolution where the Psalmist acknowledges his trust in God. A good example of this is Psalm 13, one composed by King David. In this Psalm of Lament David almost seems to be complaining to God in ways that we might feel uncomfortable doing. It is a short

Psalm, so here it is: How long, 0 Lord? Will you forget me forever? How long will you hide your face from me? How long must I wrestle with my thoughts and every day have sorrow in my heart? How long will my enemy triumph over me? Look on me and answer, 0 Lord my God. Give light to my eyes, or I will sleep in death; my enemy will say, "I have overcome him, "and

my foes will rejoice when I fall. But I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation. I will sing to the Lord, for he has been good to me." I like this Psalm because it

reflects an emotion that is within all of us at times, but we might be unwilling to voice these emotions without feeling intense guilt - after all, are we actually allowed to complain to God? Yes, I believe we are allowed to express to our Creator how we are honestly feeling. "God, I'm upset. God, I'm tired. God, I am

confused. God, I am not happy with the way things are at this moment." Those are all legitimate expressions. But we also must be able to come to the same conclusion that David does in this Psalm. "God, I'm upset...but I know that You are still in control and I trust that things will turn out just right."






