

# Assembly Fri. To Present Wheeler's PRIDE Awards

Wheeler I.S.D. scheduled Wheeler PRIDE assembly is scheduled for Friday, October 7, 2005. Recognition will be given the 126 students, grades 7-12, with perfect attendance for the first six week period.

The assembly will begin at 9:45. The Wheeler PRIDE Program is new to Wheeler this year. The program promotes academic excellence, improved citizenship between administration, faculty, staff

and students and involves the community in promoting a successful school.

The purpose of the program is to increase student attendance, improve overall academic performance, create a positive school environment, encourage excellence and provide rewards for excellence.

The goals of the program is 50% of 7-12 grade students meet criteria for program, to drastically reduce absences, improve TAKS scores and promote Wheeler I.S.D.

At the end of each six weeks, students will be recognized for 90 and above average, no more than 1 unexcused absence per six

weeks; 80 and above average with no unexcused absences per six weeks or perfect attendance.

Each student qualifying will be honored at an assembly at the end of each six weeks. This will receive a special award. This will range from T-shirts, car decals, hats, and other special awards promoting Wheeler I.S.D.

Students with a 90 or above average with no more than 2 absences, no ISS and no more than 1 tardy will be exempt from taking final exams. Students with an 80 or above average, no more than 1 absence, no ISS and is not tardy will also be exempt from taking final exams.

At the end of each six week period, a major award will be given. Each student will receive one chance for perfect attendance for each six weeks. They will also receive a chance if they are not tardy or have no office referrals occur during that six-week period. This includes tardiness and dress code violations. Each teacher will also be allowed to award a chance from time to time during the class setting. All of the chances will be compiled and used to draw for a major award at the assembly.

PRIDE stands for Performance, Recognition, Innovation, Determination and Excellence.

Mobeetie News is missing this week because Sue and Bob Mayfield's son had an emergency appendectomy Monday evening in Ft. Worth.

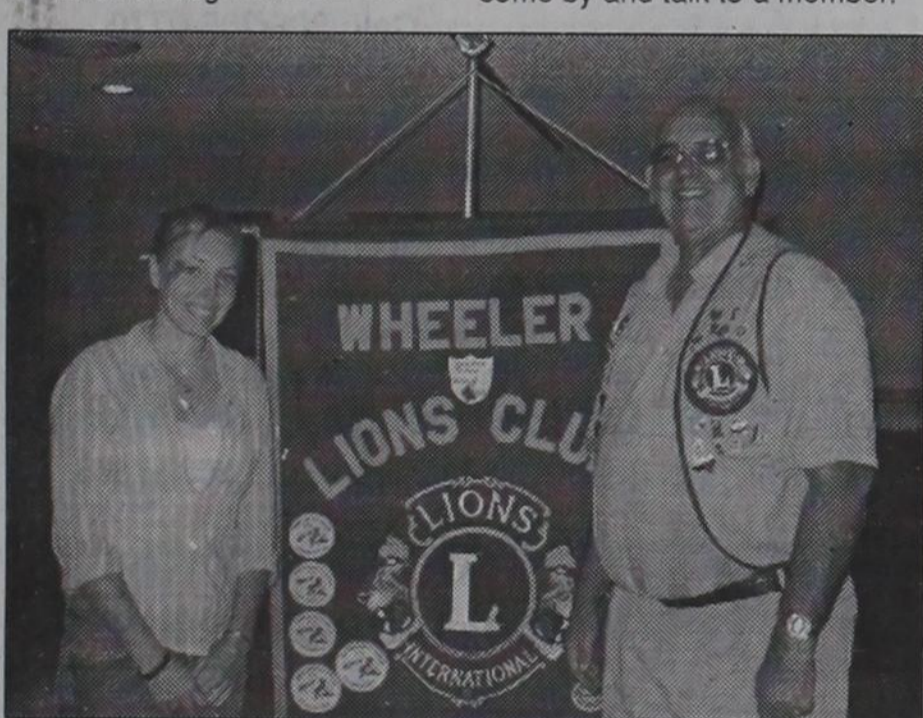

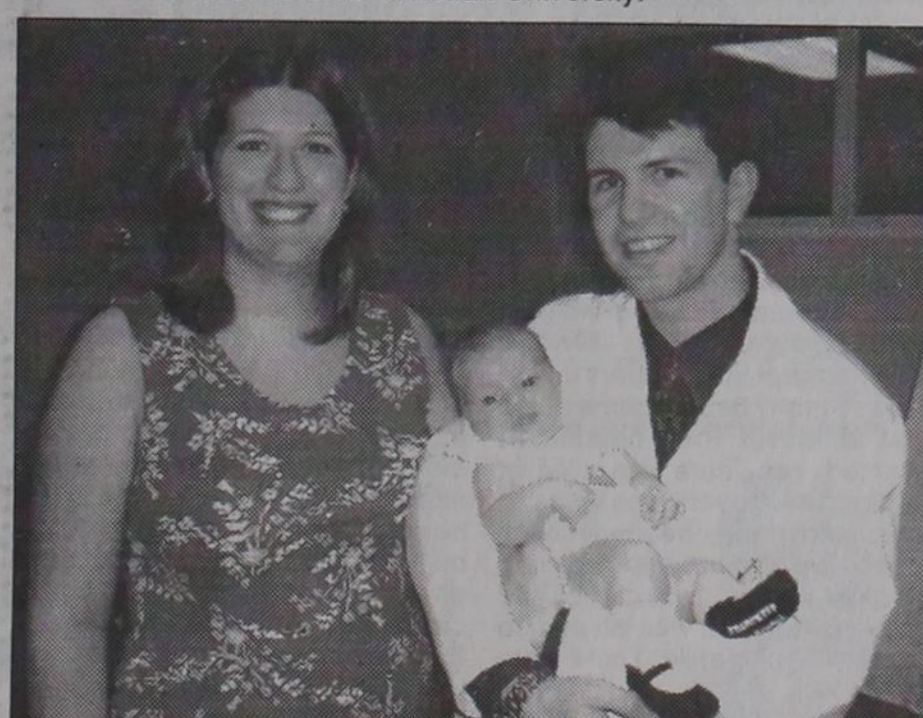
## Order Butter Braids

## Benefit Is Planned For Millie Williams

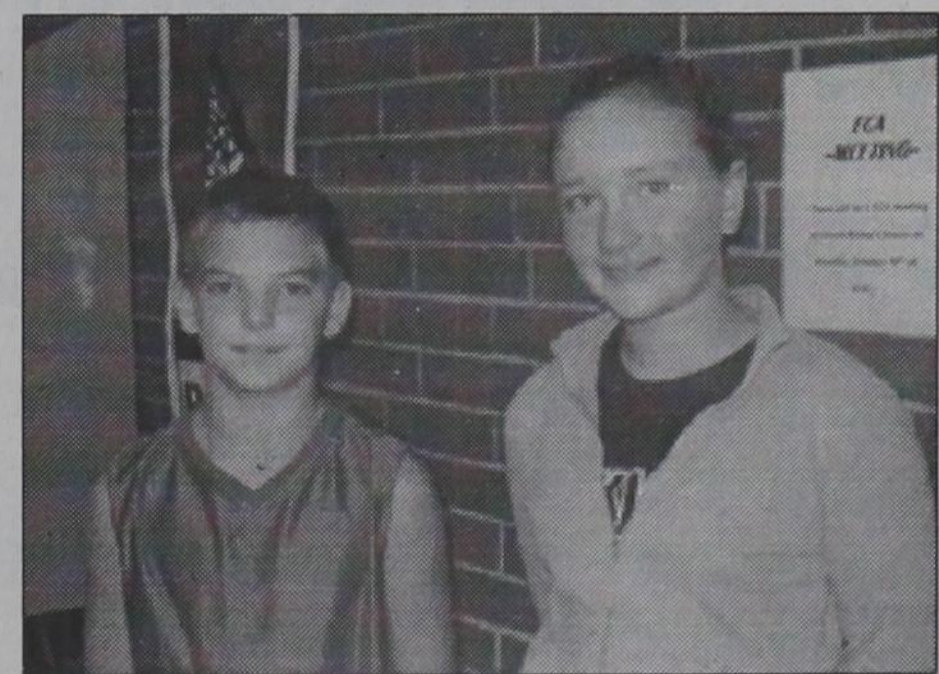

Brooke (Stevens) is having to have knee replacement and her baby is so young. Pray for her. So many troubles and heartaches in this world. But God loves us!

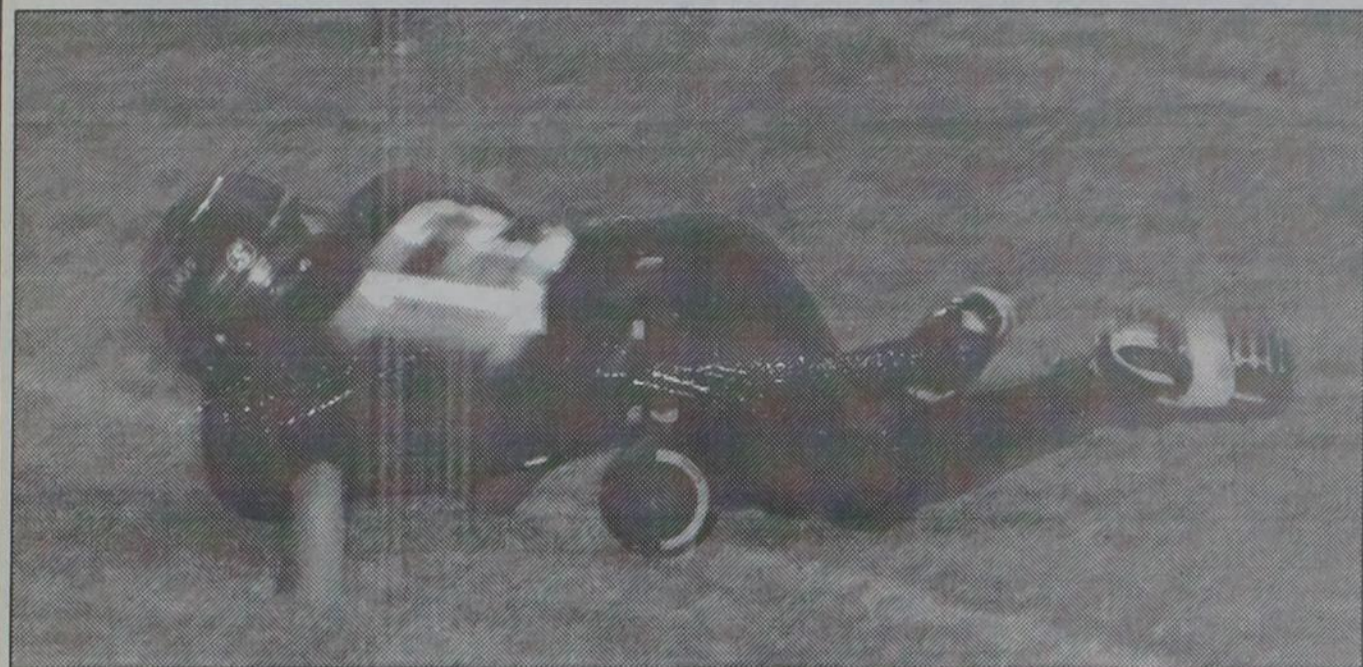

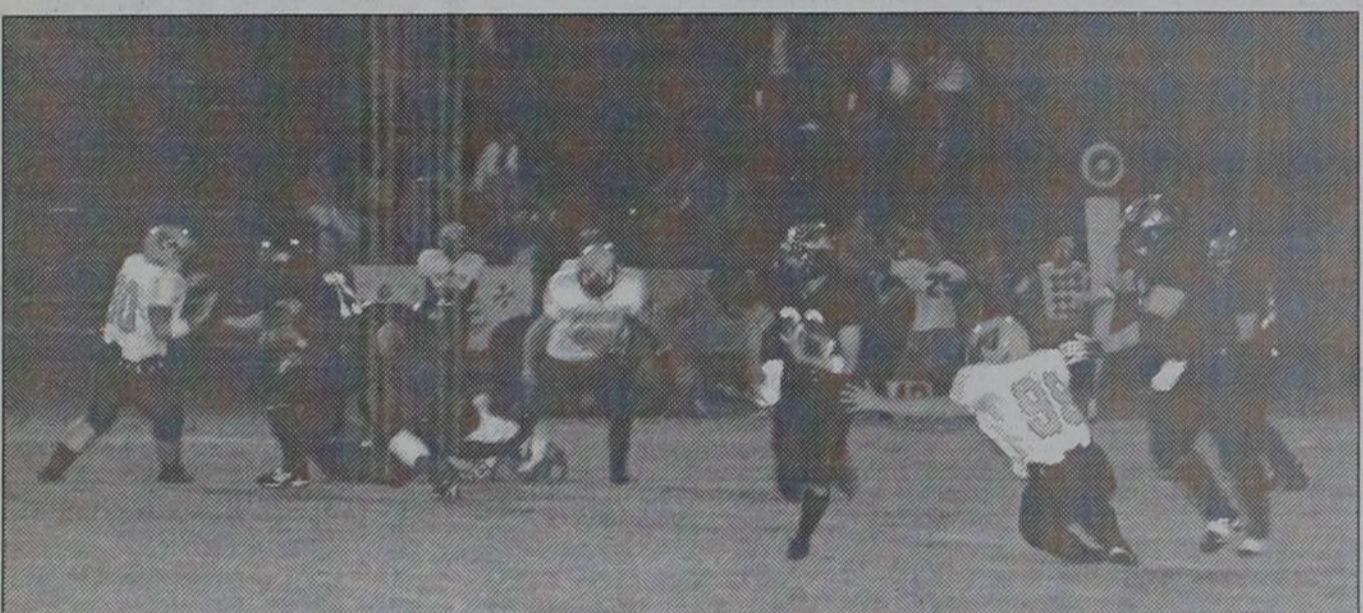
Carlos Hernandez, #12, recovers the onside kick.

Tanner Collins, #32, scores on a 30 yd. run.

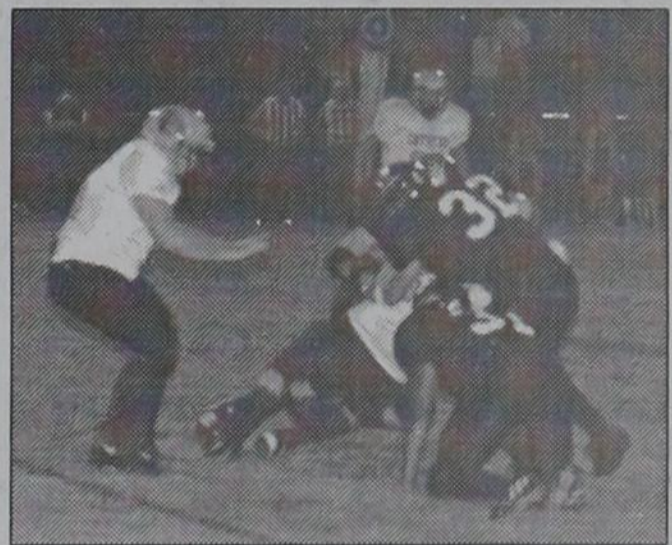

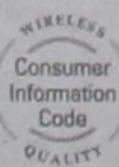

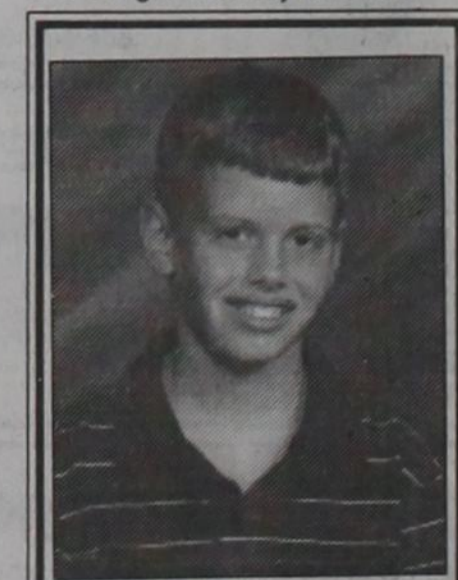
