The Commissioner's Court of Wheeler County, Texas, will met in regular session on Monday, May 23, 2005, at 10:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Courtroom, Wheeler County Courthouse, Wheeler, Texas.

Twelve items were on the The court voted to pay the hourly

payroll time sheets for payment as presented.

The commissioners voted to pay the bills as approved.

County Judge Jerry Hefley reported the commissioners were running close on the budget, but foresees no problems.

There remains a few loose ends on the courthouse restoration project, but it will soon be completed.

The commissioners accepted the resignation of Joe Montgomery, Constable, Pct. 1, effective May 31, 2005. Montgomery asked to be paid his salary for the 16 years, 8 months of service -\$16.75.

Item #9, concerning the reimbursement for Continuing Education expenses, was tabled.

The commissioners voted to remove the 10 year cap on longevity for employees. At the begining of the new 2005-2006 year, county employees will receive \$10 per month for each year served over 10 years.

The court voted to post speed limit signs on County Road 22 from Highway 152 north to County Road E. The court felt the signs The commissioners voted to were necessary with the proposed reinstate the burn ban for 90 days drilling connected to this road.

County Sheriff Joel Finsterwald ask the court to remove Russell Munselle from the county payroll, effective May 16, 2005. The court so moved.

Court was adjourned with the next regular meeting to be June 13, 2005 in the Commissioners' Court Room of the courthouse.

Narvetta Robertson, 71, died Thursday, May 19, 2005, in Allison, Texas: she was formerly from



My favorite description of God hasn't got anything to do with his appearance, but rather his size. In Isaiah 6:1-5, the prophet had a vision where he saw the Lord. What intrigues me in the end of verse 1 is that it says "the train of his robe filled the temple." How

The wedding dress my wife wore had a train that followed her on the ground as she walked, but that entire dress fits well in a box. So for God's train to be that long, God must be ... immense! I can't even begin to fathom how large God is. Isaiah was intimidated by this

sight (I would be, too!). He believed that just seeing God would cause him to die on the spot, but God spared him for a purpose. In Isaiah 1:8 the Lord says "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" Isaiah answered the way that we should all answer when it is God who is asking the question: "Here am I. Send me!" Isaiah was then commissioned to present a message, that occupies the rest of that book.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 204**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WHEELER, TEXAS, MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO PLACE OR PARK MOTOR VEHICLES OR MOTORCYCLES FOR SALE IN ANY PARK-ING AREA ADJACENT TO THE WHEELER COUNTY COURTHOUSE IN WHEELER, TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE, AND PROVIDING FOR PUBLICATION.

#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF WHEELER, TEXAS: Section I

As used in this Ordinance, the following words, terms and phrases are defined as follows:

a. Motor Vehicle: (1) any motor driven or propelled vehicle required to be registered under the laws of this state; (2) a trailer or semitrailer, other than manufactured housing, that has a gross vehicle weight that exceeds 4,000 pounds; (3) a house trailer;

(4) a four-wheel all-terrain vehicle designed by the manufacturer for off-highway use that is not required to be registered under the laws of this state; or

(5) a motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, or moped that is not required to be registered under the laws of this state, other than a motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, or moped designed for and used exclusively on a golf course.

b. Motorcycle: a motor vehicle other than a tractor, designed to propel itself with not more than three wheels in contact with the ground.

c. Motor Vehicle or Motorcycle for Sale: Any motor vehicle or motorcycle as defined above which is offered for sale by private treaty or otherwise and displayed to the public for the purpose of affecting such a sale.

#### Section 2

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, whether natural or artificial, to place or park a motor vehicle or motorcycle for sale in any parking area adjacent to the Wheeler County Courthouse in Wheeler,

#### Section 3

Any person, whether natural or artificial, who shall violate any provision of this Ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$200.00 for each day said violation shall continue.

#### Section 4

A. Should any provision of this Ordinance be declared invalid for any reason, such declaration shall not affect the validity of other provisions of this Ordinance, it being the intent that the provisions of this Ordinance be severable and remain valid notwithstanding such declaration.

B. This Ordinance shall become effective from and after its final passage and publication as provided by law.

C. The City Secretary is hereby authorized to cause publication of the descriptive caption of this Ordinance as an alternative method provided by law.

#### **COUNTY WIDE BURN BAN WITH** SPECIFIC RESTRICTIONS

The Wheeler County Commis- this time. sioners Court adopted a County Wide Burn Ban EFFECTIVE MAY 26, 2005, THROUGH AUGUST 26, 2005. Specific restrictions will apply. Those producers wishing to burn crop residue on land designated for Ag use will have to follow the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission guidelines as set out below AND contact the local Sheriff's Office or Police Department BEFORE ANY burning may be done.

GUIDELINES: 1. Burning shall be commenced and conducted only when wind direction and other meteorological conditions are such that smoke and other pollutants will not cause adverse effects to any public road, landing strip, navigable water, or off-site structure containing sensitive receptor(s).

2. If at any time the burning causes or may tend to cause smoke to blow onto or across a road or highway, it is the responsibility of the person initiating the burn to post flag-persons on affected roads.

commence no earlier than one hour after sunrise. Burning shall be completed on the same day not later than one hour before sunset, and shall be attended by a responsible party at all times during the active burn phase when the fire is progressing. In causes where residual fire and/or smoldering objects continue to emit smoke after this time, such areas shall be extinguished if the smoke from these areas has the potential to create a nuisance or traffic hazard conditions. In no case shall the extent of the burn area be allowed to increase after

b. Burning shall not be commenced when surface wind speed be less than six miles per hour (mph) (five knots) or greater than 23 mph (20 knots during the burn

c. Burning shall not be conducted during periods of actual or predicted persistent low level atmospheric temperature inversions.

111.221 RESPONSIBILITY FOR CONSEQUENCES OF OUT-DOOR BURNING.

THE AUTHORITY TO CON-DUCT OUTDOOR BURNING UNDER THIS REGULATION DOES NOT EXEMPT OR EX-CUSE ANY PERSON RESPON-SIBLE FROM THE CONSE-QUENCES, DAMAGES, OR IN-JURIES RESULTING FROM THE BURNING AND DOES NOT EX-EMPT OR EXCUSE ANYONE FROM COMPLYING WITH ALL OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS OR ORDINANCES, REGULATIONS, AND ORDERS OR GOVERN-MENTAL ENTITIES HAVING JU-RISDICTION, EVEN THOUGH THE BURNING IS OTHERWISE CONDUCTED IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS REGULATION.

#### Increased Enforcement Of Safety Belt Laws Will Start This Month

Transportation (TxDOT) is marking the 20th anniversary of Texas citation to get drivers and passensafety belt laws by kicking off the largest-ever statewide Click It or Ticket education and enforcement of traffic operations. "Since we campaign. Thousands of state started participating in the national troopers and local officers will be patrolling Texas highways and streets between May 23 and June 5 to issue citations to drivers and front seat passengers not wearing safety belts. Drivers whose children aren't buckled up also will be

Thanks to the state's safety belt laws, federal officials estimate that 17,800 fewer Texans have been killed in traffic crashes since 1985 and 420,000 injuries have been prevented, resulting in economic savings that top \$77 billion. In the past twenty years, the safety belt use rate in Texas has climbed from 14 percent to 83 percent.

TxDOT says its goal this year is to get at least another 3 percent of Texans -- roughly 350,000 drivers -- into the habit of buckling up. That's why officials are directing stepped up law enforcement efforts at the one in five Texans who don't fasten their safety belts. They include pickup drivers and passengers, teens and parents whose children aren't properly secured.

"Most people know the benefits

The Texas Department of of safety belts, but sometimes it takes the threat of an expensive gers to obey the law," said Carlos Lopez, TxDOT's divison director Click It or Ticket Initiative three years ago, safety belt compliance in Texas has climbed by almost 10 percent."

With almost 4 million pickups on the road in Texas, this year's Click It or Ticket campaign also includes a special focus on pickup drivers.

"In a crash, pickup trucks are twice as likely to roll over as cars, but their riders buckle up less than any other group of drivers and passengers on Texas roads," said Georgia Chakiris, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration's regional administrator. "We want people in pickups to know their chances of surviving a rollover crash increase by up to 80 percent if they buckle up in their trucks. "Drivers and front seat passengers are required to use safety belts in Texas. Children under 17 must be buckled up, whether they ride in the front or back of a vehicle. Child safety seats are required for children under four years of age or less than 36 inches tall. Fines for violations range from \$25 to \$200 plus court costs.






