







> When James and my mother met over 20 years ago, James was in his early 60's. He had already retired from the Navy, been married and widowed, and had raised and seen his only daughter married. He had also lost his oldest brother, his siblings were grandparents and his nieces and nephews were all grown with children of their own. However, at the time I was only 15 years old. So yes, we came along late in his life, but it was early in mine. I am now 36, so it is safe to say that James was a father to me for well over half my life. So, to say he influenced my upbringing is an understatement. James taught me many things while growing up. Here are a couple of examples:

How to work: James was my first employer. The first job responsibility I had was to feed and water worms. Although, I was not actually given a salary for this I was "privileged" to gain the knowledge and experience. My second job, which I was paid for, was picking okra - every 16 year old girl's dream job. After that, I was promoted to helping with the produce stand. I wasn't actually paid money for this responsibility, but was more than happy to be compensated with all the fresh produce I could eat. In this responsibility, I also learned how to sell. I was always amazed to see James in action. To see little gray haired ladies come up and want to buy just one home-grown tomato and walk away with \$20 worth of produce. Additionally, I learned to appreciate and distinguish good produce, which in fact, has ruined me. Store bought tomatoes are only purchased out of sheer necessity and there is nothing better than a good Black Diamond or Desert King watermelon. Which of course in East Texas are both

non-existent. How to drive: James taught me how to drive, and to my brother and sister's amazement, lived to tell about it. If anyone ever questioned James' patience, I can personally vouch that the man had more than any one person I have ever known. Énough said.

How to relate: James never ceased to amaze me on how he reacted to things. For example - I will never forget the very first time James and mother allowed me to drive my car out of town. It was to a football game in Fritch and, of course, I had a car full of girls with me. On the way home, almost into Mobeetie, I was pulled over and given a speeding ticket, which is what happens when you're too busy talking and not paying attention. When I got home I told them what happened and mother about went through the roof. James didn't say a word, but went on to bed and let mother say all the words she wanted. Of course I was grounded and was given a list of chores to be done early the next morning. When I sat down at the table to eat breakfast with James, I was just waiting for him to get his two cents worth in since he missed out the night before. After a few minutes of silence he said, "I remember when I got my first speeding ticket . . . " What relief. Instead of a lecture (which James was quite good at), I spent the morning laughing at the story of one of his many "adventures". I am proud to say, this was one of many times he made me feel better, rather than worse.

How to cook a steak: James taught me the proper way to grill a good steak: good cut of meat, certain mixture of spices, hickory chips soaked, coals just right, steak

cooked on one side so many minutes, turned and cooked on the other so many minutes - and all this had to be done while drinking a beer. We actually had several debates as to which brand of beer produced a better steak. If any of these key ingredients or instructions were not followed exactly, the steak just wasn't right. To this day, I can honestly say that James cooked the best steak I ever ate. In fact, I would eat left-overs cold, right out of the fridge. This is quite amazing for someone who isn't that crazy about steak.



Looking back, I think how difficult it must have been for him to have raised one child and then gain three. Not only that, but to have a teenager in the house again (yikes!). Luckily, James and I always got along very well, and in fact, were very close when I was living at home and when I was in college. It wasn't until the last few years that we experienced some tense moments. Age playing against us both I think. Nevertheless, I never regretted one moment we were a part of each others lives. 


4-H Awards Banquet Held


