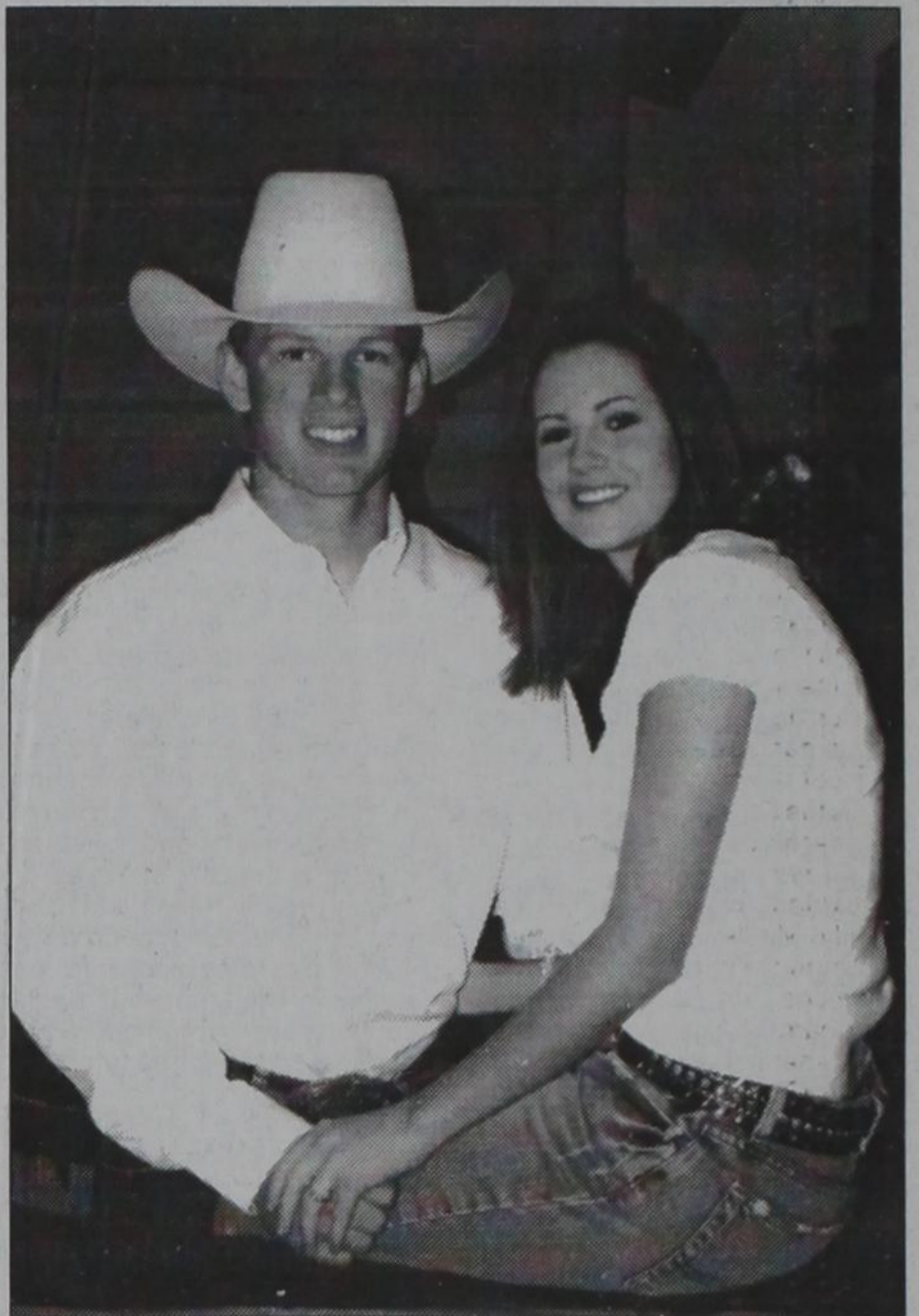

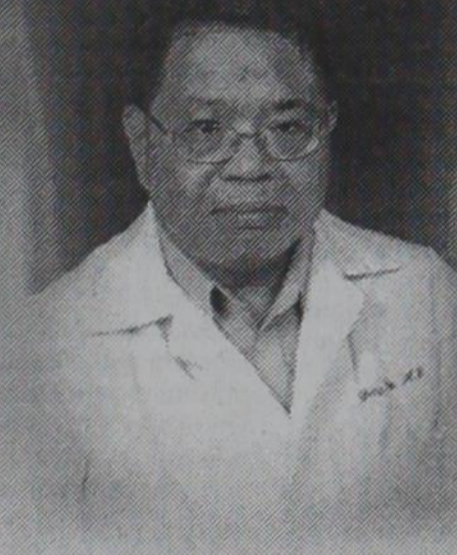
**The View of a Southern Woman**
