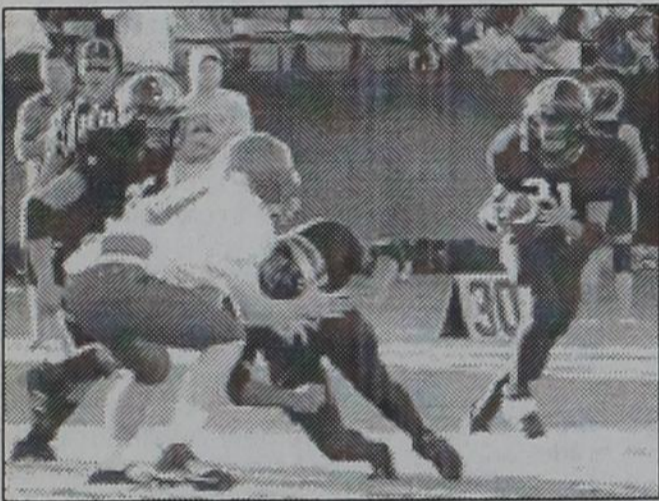

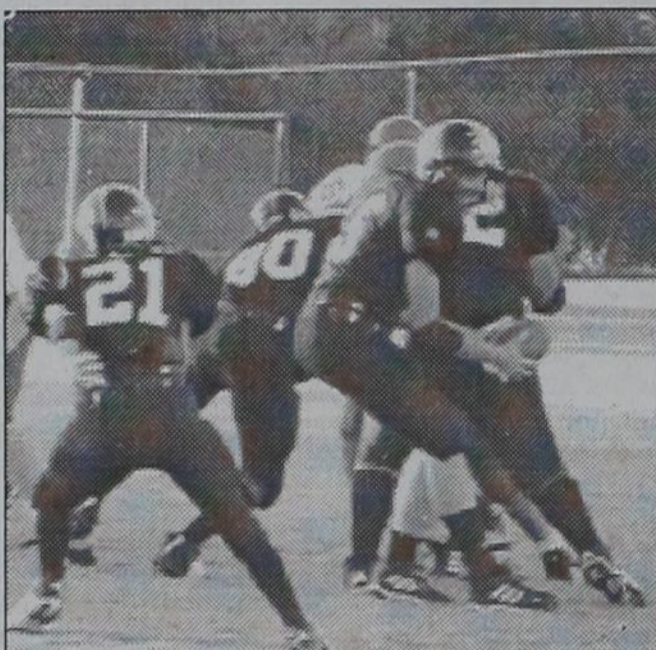

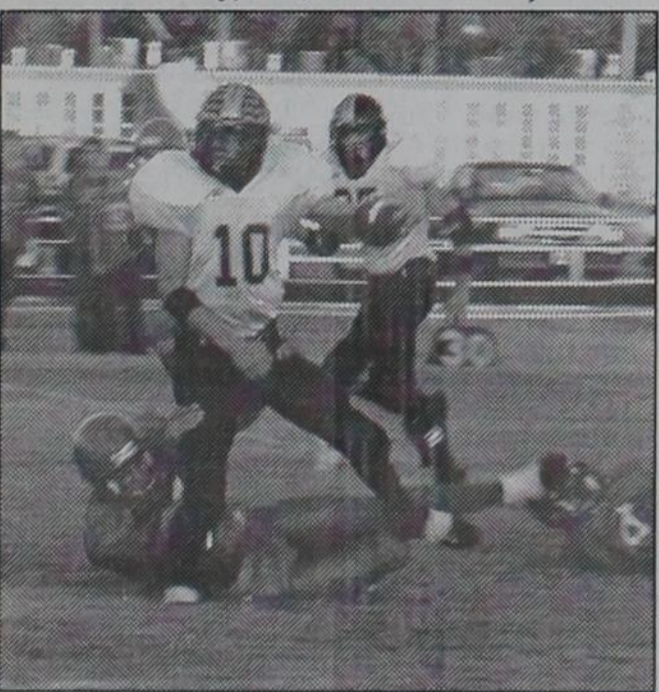

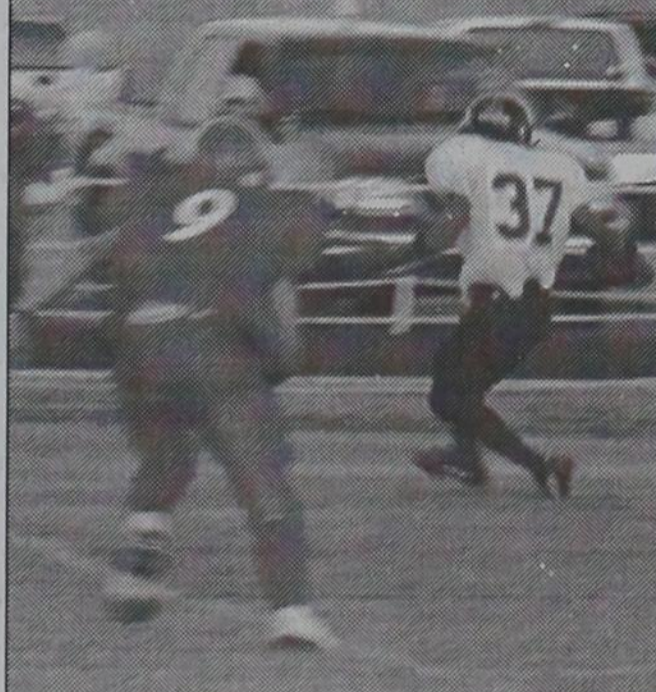

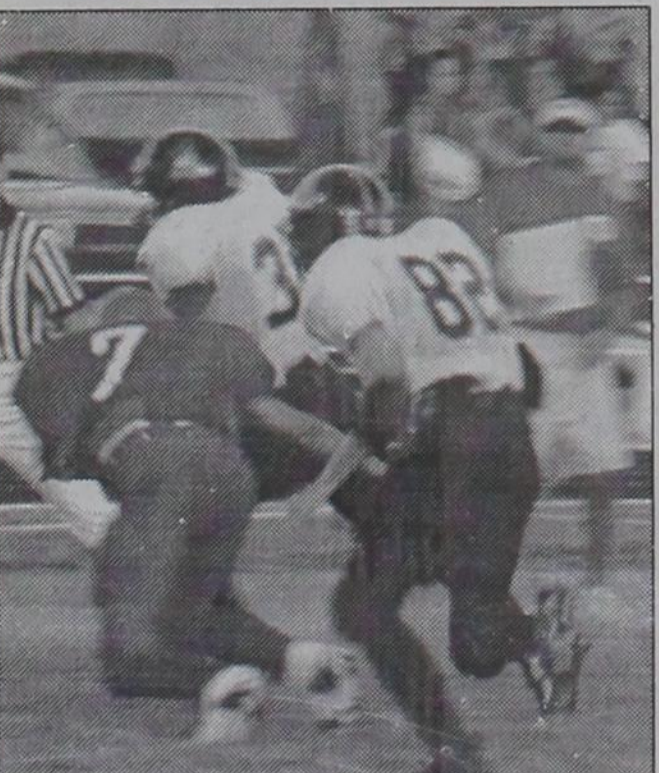

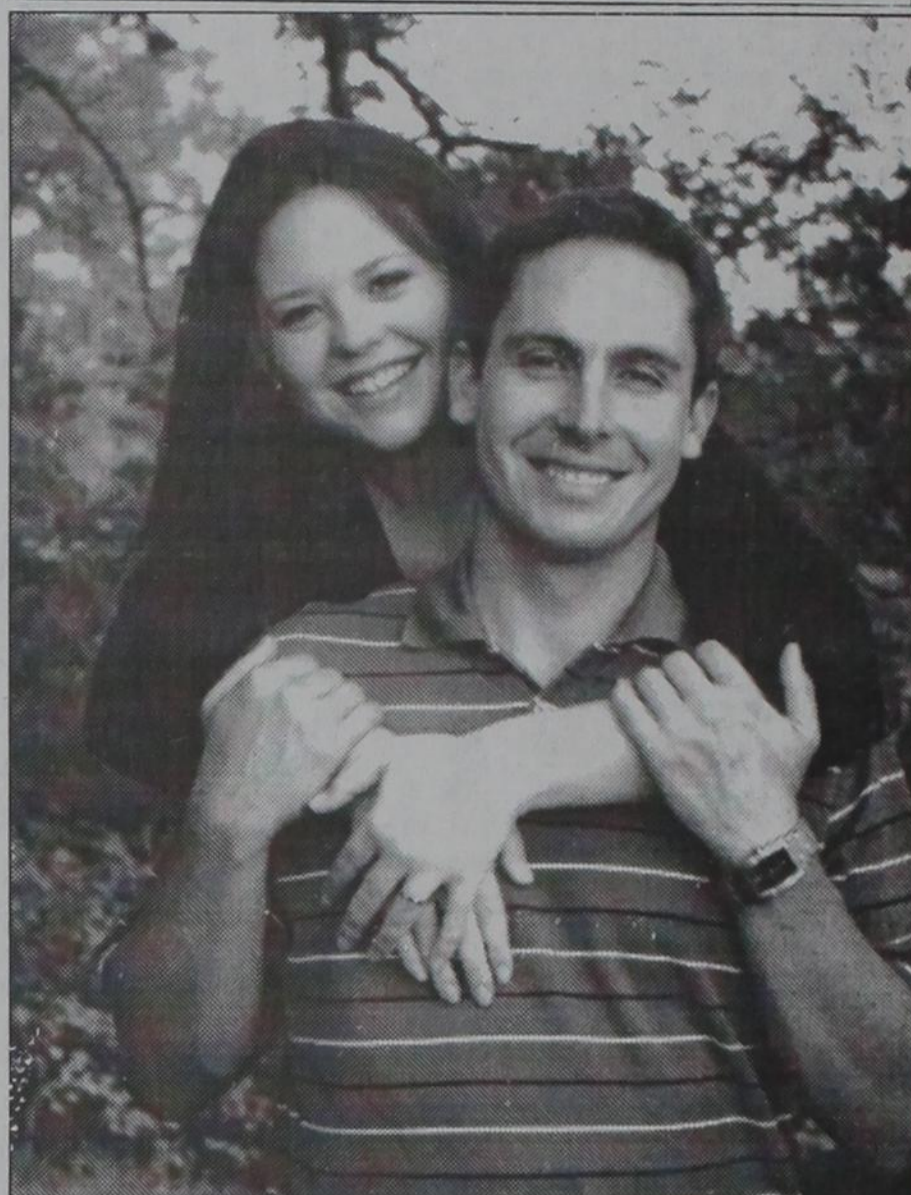
The surgery went well. Jackie is looking forward to being able to maneuver less painfully very soon.

**Wheeler Church of Christ**  
 Working with teenagers is fun, but it is also hard work. I have served as a Youth Minister before. Trust me, it is more difficult than most people realize. Long unpredictable hours that are often defined by the unpredictable schedules of the large variety of activities for which the congregation's teens are involved. There is visitation. There are Bible studies. There is time set aside for study and personal growth and then the delivery of Bible classes or devotionals. And often the Youth Minister is expected to fill in for the Pulpit Minister whenever it is needed. Plus other talents that exist may be called upon quite often (I almost always led singing when I was the Youth Minister).  
 There are heartbreaking situations to handle. I have had conversations with teens who were facing unwanted pregnancies, suicide concerns, parental break-  
 ups, arrests, involvement of Child Protective Services, and I've even conducted the funeral of a teen who was killed in a car accident. But I have had many joyful moments, too. I got to share in the joy of watching the church of tomorrow grow up, play meaningful games with them at summer camp, listen to their beautiful singing voices, see their families grow stronger, and learn great truths about God.  
 I am proud to say that at least six former teens within youth groups that I have worked with have grown up to be involved in full-time ministry. I am proud to say that many of my former teens are now strong Christian adults, married with godly Christian spouses.  
 Let's stay committed to the great possibilities that exist within our young people.

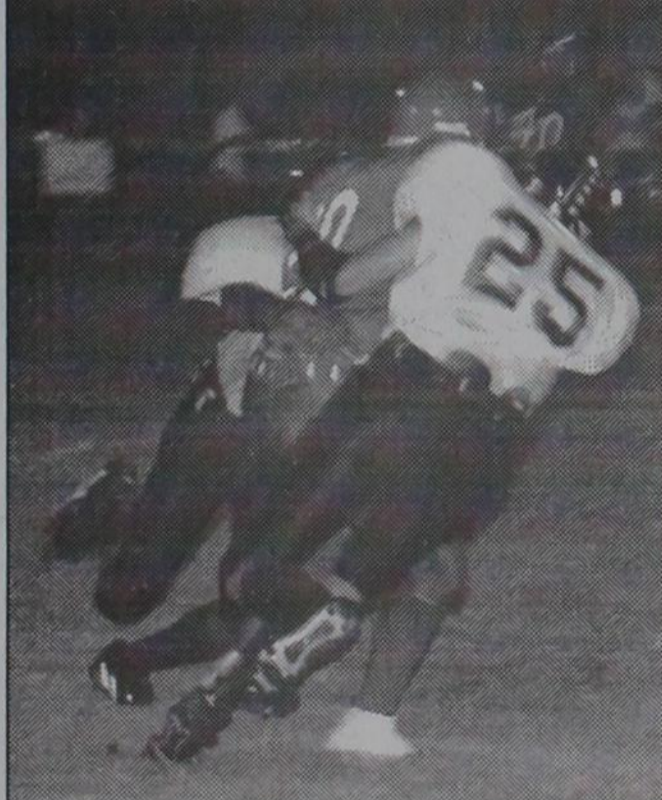

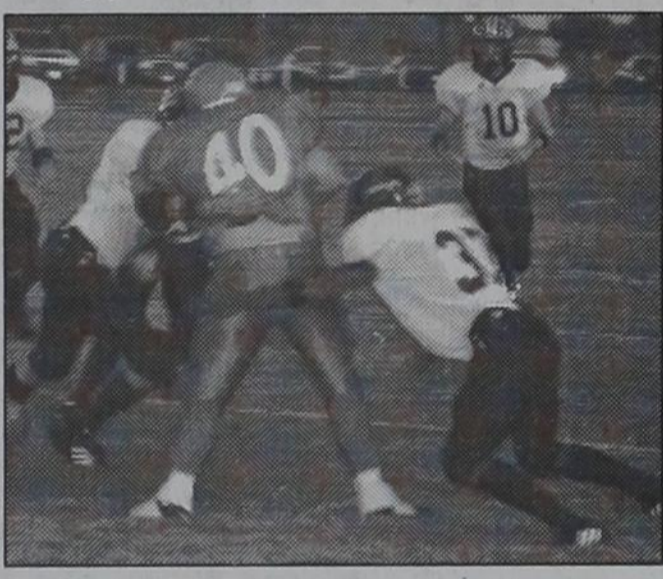

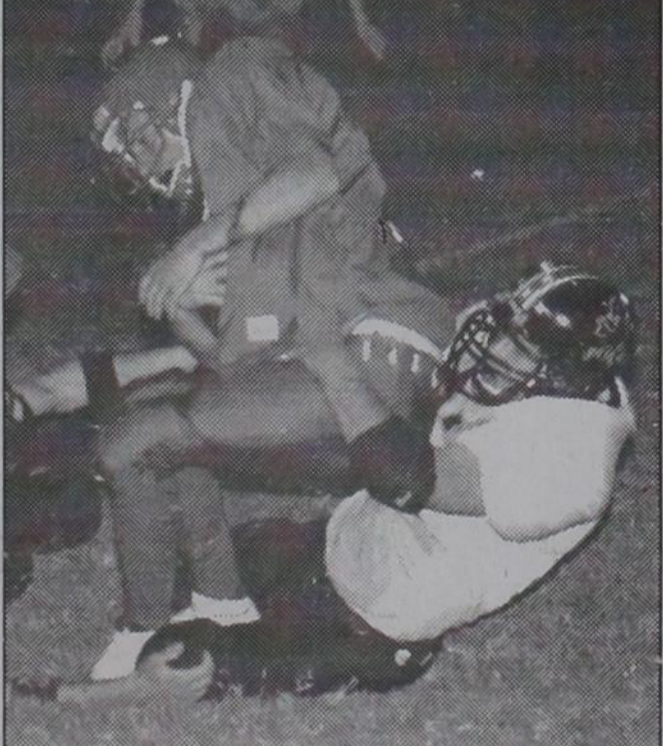
Josh Britt, #17, intercepts the pass and breaks for a big gain.



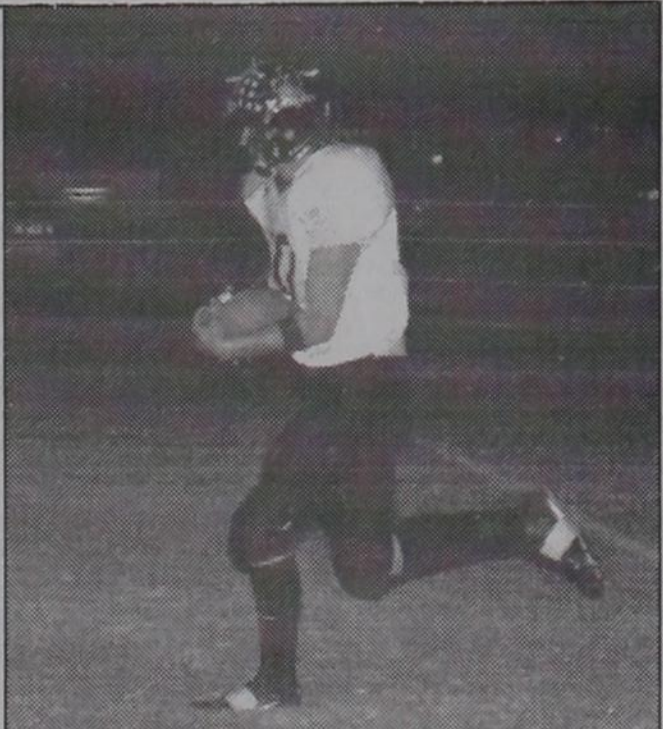
Mustang defense stops the ball carrier.

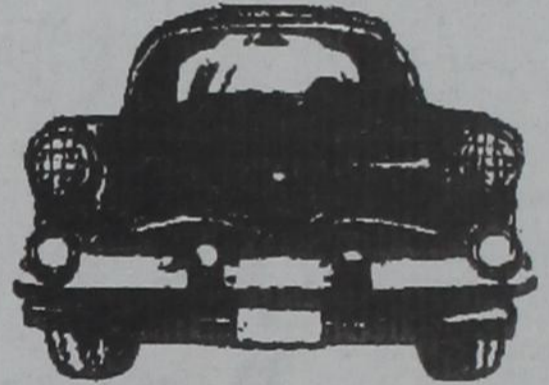

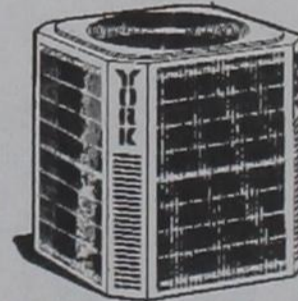
