
Child Safety Seat **Distribution Class**

The Wheeler County Extension office is providing Car Seat Safety classes for low-income families. Participants will be required to watch a video and receive detailed instructions on how to install their child's car seat. After completing the class and signing the Child Restraint Agreement and Release of Liability, the participant will receive a free car seat appropriate for their child's age and size. Classes will be held September 27th and October 18th at 4 p.m. Please contact the Extension office 826-5243 if you would like to attend. The classes are limited on size so you must call to reserve a seat in the class. Classes will be offered throughout the year each month. If you can not attend at this time, call the Extension office to see if other arrangements can be

The new law states that all children younger than 5 years of age (old law was younger than 4) and less than 36 inches tall are required to be in a child safety seat system. It also classifies safety seat infractions as moving viola-

tions for the first time. Booster seats are considered to be child safety seat systems, as long as the seat is appropriate for that child-he or she should fit within the weight range stated on the seat. The law becomes effec-

Parkview Hospital Board Meets; Tax Rate Is Set At 0.213529/\$100

The board meeting of the North Wheeler County Hospital District was called to order by Chairman Dean Tipps on September 12, 2005, at 6:00 p.m. in the board

Present were Dean Tipps, chairman; Thomas R. Helton, vice chairman; Sue Chandler, secretary; James Batton and Dave Britt Jr. Also present were Ann Fagan Cook, RN, BSN, and Deborah Whitley, CPA.

Dean Tipps requested that the agenda be changed to allow Deborah Whitley, CPA from Parrish, Moody & Fikes, p.c., Waco, Texas, to present the audit report. Ms. Whitley made her presentation and in so doing stated that the Critical Access Hospital designation that was obtained October 1, 2001 had in fact made a progressive improvement in the bottom line for Parkview Hospital. There was a question and answer period following the presentation. Ms. Whitley also discussed some points regarding the 2004-2005 cost report and said that we will have a payable back to Medicare this year. After discussion among the Board, Jim Batton made a motion to accept the audit report as presented. Dave Britt, Jr. seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

tacting Barbara Seal, Public Infor-Jim Batton made a motion to accept the minutes of the August 2005 meeting as presented. Dave Britt, Jr. seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

There were no bad debt writeoffs for this month. Charity writeoffs were presented. There was some discussion regarding these accounts. Dave Britt, Jr. made the motion to approve charity writeoffs as presented. Thomas Helton seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented QAPI minutes and scorecards for August 2005. After discussion Dave Britt, Jr. made the motion to accept. Sue Chandler seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Ms. Fagan Cook presented the proposed budget for 2005-2006 including the capital budget for 2005-2010. After some discussion Dave Britt, Jr. made a motion to accept the budgets as presented. Thomas Helton seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously. Chairman Tipps lead the dis-

cussion regarding the setting of the tax rate for 2005-2006 including comments regarding the new "Truth in Taxation" laws that the Board must abide by this year. After some questions and further discussion Dave Britt, Jr. made the motion to set the tax rate for this year at the effective tax rate of 0.213529/\$100 valuation. THIS TAX RATE WILL RAISE MORE TAXES FOR MAINTENANCE AND OPERATIONS THAN LAST YEAR'S TAX RATE

Ms. Fagan Cook presented policies and procedures for Parkview Home Health Agency for Board approval. After review of the policies Sue Chandler made a motion to accept the policies and proce-

Ms. Fagan Cook requested that the Board approve the purchase of a new Stryker ER stretcher that would allow transport of patients to CT and/or X-ray. After some questions and answers Dave Britt, Jr. made the motion to purchase the stretcher. Jim Batton seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously.

Bid for renewal of the Director's and Officers Insurance policy was presented. Sue Chandler made a motion to accept that was seconded by Thomas Helton. Motion

carried unanimously. There was discussion regarding rewiring of the internal internet connections. There have been some problems with this since the initial installation. Dave Britt, Jr. made a motion to have the rewiring done and Jim Batton seconded the motion. Motion carried unani-

Chairman Tipps asked if there were items for new business. Ms. Fagan Cook reported that the hospital had been involved in a quest for the Governor's Quality Improvement Achievement Award for the past year and a half. 203 hospitals are involved in this process and 23 awards were given for excellence and 6 awards for achievement. 


